

THE ANNUAL COLLEGE NEWS

Academic

The academic year in the College began on 1st Sep. 2023 with freshers' orientation. The induction programme began with invoking God's blessings for the good health and wellbeing of XITE fraternity. The three-day programme ended with a visit to XLRI on the 16th September.

The academic performance of the batch 2022-23 was very encouraging as 89% of the B.Com. students secured distinction and the remaining 1st Division while BBA students secured 100 percent 1st Division. This year also, a couple of our students secured admission in reputed Business Schools such as IIMs. The college explored to avail the ERP facility to make paperless administration for the smooth functioning of academic and office activities.

Faculty Development Programme

Dr. Monica Uppal conducted an FDP on the best practices in teaching and learning processes. The faculty members spent the next two days conducting SWOC analyses of their departments and preparing the academic calendar while paying attention to the events of various cells and clubs.

Seminars/ Conferences

On 15th October Dr. Puja Mohanty, counselor at XLRI, conducted sessions for the students on mental health. On 12th November the College organized a National Conference sponsored by ICSSR and had the Vice-Chancellor of Kolhan University as the chief guest and Prof. Sanjay Patro, Dean of Academics at XLRI as the Keynote Speaker. The Faculty of ISBM conducted a career counseling sessions on 19th Nov. Mr. Gaurav Anand, Director of Swachhata Pukare delivered a lecture on "Entrepreneurship and Innovation as a Career Opportunity" on 22nd Nov. In March, a professional group from the city organized a workshop on "Street Play and Theatre". Department of Economics hosted a seminar on "Economic Crises and the Role of IMF and World Bank" on 20th April. The Department of Commerce organized a seminar and all the students took part it. On May 15th a much-anticipated NCW-sponsored session on capacity building for female students was held.



Achievements / Recognition

Priyanka Bankira of B.A. English secured Gold Medal in district level athletic championship. Simran Kumari of BBA 2nd year secured the first prize in the university-level elocution competition and participated in the state level competition on 5th Aug. 2023. The college received approval for two projects: one from National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) to run the conference, while the other from the National Commission for Women (NCW) to conduct a workshop for female UG/PG students on capacity building. On 14th April Jamshedpur Management Association (JMA) conducted the Olympiad 2022-23 in which the students excelled and won the overall championship. On July 19, 2023 the College published a book edited by Fr. Mukti in which research articles were given by the faculty members. On July 28th the College published the 1st issue of the UG Students' journal Vimarsh with ISSN # 25839632 (online).

Collaboration & Net working

NIT Durgapur faculty members conducted a webinar for the students on "Career Opportunities in Management". A large number of students took part in the 30th Annual JRD Tata oration on business ethics at XLRI. Two members of an expert team from XIM University came to the campus for the academic audit and helped in preparing for the NAAC assessment.

The Joy of Giving

On 15th Aug. 2023 the Community Club organised sale of candles and Diya at College and money collected were donated to the Parents Association of the Mentally Handcapped of Jamshedpur (PAMHJ). The students collected money and bought grocery items and distributed to the Old Age Home of Mother Teresa and Cheshira's home. On May 8, third-year students visited the Mother Thresa home (Nirmal Hirdaya & Sishu Bhavan) and XLRI. On 22nd July, the Community service group visited one of the neighbourhood rural schools for the outreach event.

Celebrations

On 15th November the Jharkhand Foundation Day was celebrated with colorful cultural events showcasing the tradition and culture of the state. On 21st November, College basketball team participated in the university tournament. On 3rd December, the feast of St. Francis Xavier, the patron saint of the institution was celebrated followed by basketball match for boys and kho-kho match for girls. On 16th December, College organized one day picnic



for the entire XITE family at Sangam, Chaibasa, and the camera and photography club organized photography and video - making competition. On the 22nd December we celebrated Christmas followed by a football match^h for boys and a throw ball match for girls. The Women's Day was celebrated on 14 March in the college. The college remembered the late Fr. Stan Swami on his anniversary (5th July) with special talk and prayers.

Farewell:

On 28th July the College bid a touching farewell to the outgoing students (batch 2020-23).

Competitions

During the year, batch wise Basketball matches for boys, and Kho-Kho for the girls were conducted and the final was held on 1st April in which 3rd years won the prize. On 28th September, a few selected students participated in the inter-college Chess Competition. On 7th January, National Youth Day was observed with an elocution contest to commemorate the birth anniversary of Swami Vivekanand. On May 6th, a Master Chef competition was held in which students in like-minded groups prepared and sold food items.

NSS

Two students from the NSS group were selected to participate in the Republic Day Parade selection at Hazaribagh. Sandeep Singh (BBA Sem.5) was selected for the national level selection at Bilaspur on 12th Nov. 2022. Fr. C.L. George, S.J., blessed and inaugurated a new kiosk canteen for the college on 1st Nov. 2023. Under the aegis of NSS, an awareness session on blood donation was conducted on 25th February and on 4th March blood drive donation got executed. On 5th June, the NSS unit observed World Environment Day by planting fruit trees in the campus. On 21st June, the college celebrated International Yoga Day. On 22nd July, the NSS group visited one of the neighbourhood rural schools for the outreach event.

पाल और भिक्षा

पूर्वकाल में, कपिलवस्तु राज्य में सिद्धार्थ नाम का प्रसिद्ध राजकुमार था। राजकुमार सिद्धार्थ का जीवन अपनी खूबसूरत पत्नी यशोधरा और अपने प्यारे बेटे के साथ ऐश्वर्य, विलासिता और कुलीनता से सुसज्जित व्यतीत हो रहा था। एक बार महल की सीमा से परे, भ्रमण के दौरान सिद्धार्थ को आम जीवन की कठोर वास्तविकताओं का सामना करना पड़ा। बूढ़े कमजोर बुजुर्ग, बीमार, मृतक और तपस्वी साधक को देख उन्हें जीवन की कठोर वास्तविकताओं दुःख, दर्द, पीड़ा और परेशानियों का ज्ञात हुआ।

उन्हें यह एहसास हुआ कि वह भी अंततः बीमारी, बुढ़ापे और मृत्यु की अनिवार्यताओं का सामना करेगा। सांसारिक आसक्तियों की क्षणिक प्रकृति और विभिन्न विश्वासों की भ्रामक प्रकृति स्पष्ट हो गई, जिससे उन्हें अपनी राजसी स्थिति को त्यागने और सत्य, आध्यात्मिक तपस्या की खोज के मार्ग पर चलने के लिए प्रेरित किया और अंततः उन्होंने बुद्ध जागृत व्यक्ति के रूप में ज्ञान प्राप्त किया।

एक रात सिद्धार्थ अपनी सांसारिक संपत्ति, सामान और आभूषणों को त्यागकर महल से बाहर चले गए। उन्होंने विलासिता के बंधनों को त्याग दिया और कठोर यौगिक अनुशासनों के माध्यम से जीविका, कामुक संतुष्टि और आराम के लिए मौलिक आग्रहों को पार करने का प्रयास करते हुए छह साल की तपस्या व यात्रा शुरू की। राजकुमार सिद्धार्थ बोधगया में पवित्र बोधि वृक्ष के नीचे, मूसलाधार बारिश सहित सभी तत्वों को सहन करते हुए लगातार उनचास दिनों तक ध्यान में लगे रहे। अपने ध्यान के चौथे और पांचवें सप्ताह में, उन्हें दयालु सर्प राजा मुचिलिंडा के फण द्वारा मूसलाधार बारिश से आश्रय दिया। बुद्ध पूर्णिमा के शुभ अवसर पर, वैशाख महीने की पूर्णिमा (आमतौर पर अप्रैल-मई में पड़ती है) पर सिद्धार्थ को ज्ञान प्राप्त हुआ।

ज्ञान प्राप्त करने के बाद, सिद्धार्थ, जिन्हें तब से बुद्ध के नाम से जाना जाता है, ने ज्ञान और मुक्ति का आनंद लिया। चार लोकपाल क्या महाराजा, धृतराष्ट्र, विरुधक, विरुपाक्ष, और कुबेर, जिन्हें वैश्रवण भी कहा जाता है, प्रत्येक ने लोगों से प्रसाद प्राप्त करने के लिए बुद्ध को एक-एक पाल भेंट किया।

बुद्ध के उपदेश और बौद्ध धर्म दुनिया भर में फैले हुए हैं और कई शीर्ष नेता, वैश्विक निगमों में भी बुद्ध के शिक्षाओं और दर्शन का पालन और अभ्यास करते हैं।

बुद्ध की शिक्षाओं और बौद्ध धर्म के सिद्धांतों में भौगोलिक सीमाओं को पार कर लिया है, अनगिनत व्यक्तियों को प्रभावित किया है, और वैश्विक समाज के विविध पहलुओं में प्रवेश किया है।

मैं दो पहलुओं- "पाल" और "भिक्षा" के महत्व पर गहराई से विचार करना चाहता हूँ, विशेष रूप से हिंदू और बौद्ध इतिहास के लेंस के माध्यम से सीखने (LEARNING) के संदर्भ में।

पाल परंपरागत रूप से एक बर्तन या कंटेनर को दर्शाता है, फिर भी यह और भी बहुत कुछ का प्रतीक है। एक व्यक्ति के सार, उनके चरित्र और उनकी भूमिका का भी प्रतीक है। असंख्य संस्कृतियों और परंपराओं में, भिक्षुकों, भिक्षुओं और आध्यात्मिक साधकों ने सदियों से भिक्षा पाल का उपयोग किया है। ये पाल विनम्रता, त्याग, सादगी और दूसरों/लोगों के प्रसाद की परोपकारिता एवम् निर्भरता का प्रतीक है।

जबकि "भिक्षा" भिक्षा मांगने के कार्य को दर्शाता है, यह भीख मांगने से बिल्कुल विपरीत है, जो अक्सर सार्वजनिक स्थानों पर देखी जाता है - जो अक्सर व्यक्तिगत हताशा और अस्तित्व से उत्पन्न होता है। दूसरी ओर, भिक्षा देना, विशिष्ट सांस्कृतिक या धार्मिक संदर्भों में दान और करुणा का एक स्वैच्छिक संकेत है। अंतर न केवल कार्यों में बल्कि इन प्रथाओं को रेखांकित करने वाली धारणाओं, इरादों और सामाजिक गतिशीलता में भी निहित है।

हमारे दैनिक जीवन और व्यवहार में भिक्षा और पाल का संदर्भ अंतर्निहित है। हमें यह भी सचेत रहना चाहिए कि पाल के रूप में हमें भिक्षा लेते समय और भिक्षा देते समय कैसा व्यवहार करना चाहिए? क्या हमारे पास भिक्षा प्राप्त करने के लिए उचित पाल है, भिक्षा प्रदान करते समय हमारे पास कौन सा पाल है?

हमें अपने जीवन की दैनिक यात्रा करते समय भिक्षा और पाल के बारे में सदैव जागरूक रहने की आवश्यकता है।

System can be defined as an orderly grouping of interdependent components linked together according to a plan to achieve a specific goal. The objects and entities around us must be seen as a part of the whole rather than in isolation. We study the concept of systems in every discipline of study like economic system, social system, biological system, Political system, technological system, legal system etc. Every system is a sub system of a larger system. If we extrapolate this argument, then the largest whole or the universe becomes the system of which everything visible or invisible becomes a subsystem. This interconnection and interlink of different subsystems must be felt, understood and practiced in order to minimize the differences that exist at different levels in the world. Albert Einstein quotes “A human being is a part of the whole called by us universe, a part limited in time and space. 17 countries limit when and how women can travel outside the home.

18 countries allow men to prohibit their wives from working.

Women complete more work on average, but they are assigned 55% of all work compared with 45% assigned to men.

Women are less likely to seek promotion than men- Women only get promotion when they seek 100% of the qualifications but men get it when they just seek 50%.

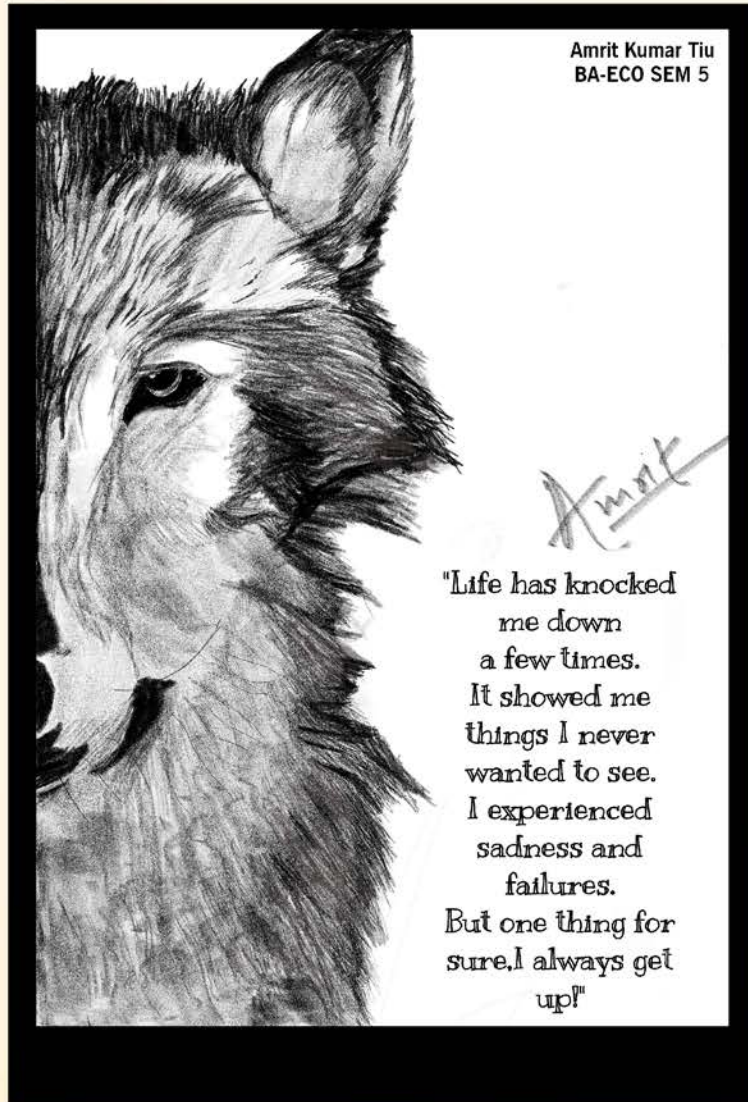




DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMICS

The Department of Economics, XITE College, was initiated in the year 2020 and the first batch of students graduated in the year 2023. The Department runs an Honours course in Economics and aims to provide an adequate basic understanding of the subject matter of Economics among the students and equip them with theoretical concepts, policy analyzing skills, and adequate knowledge about the workings of an economy. This will enable the students to exploit newly created opportunities in the professional field of Economics as well as prepare for higher education in eminent institutions. The Department is led by Dr. Sanchita Ghosh Chowdhury, Associate Professor, at XITE College. Dr. Radha Mahali, Assistant Professor, XITE College, and Dr. Rajesh Kumar Rana, Assistant Professor, XITE College serve as Departmental Faculty. Currently, the department is small in size with 24 students in all. 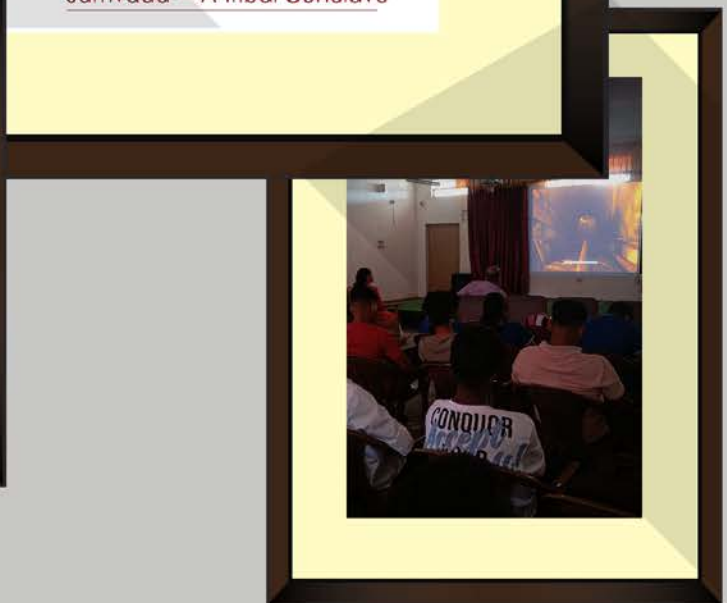
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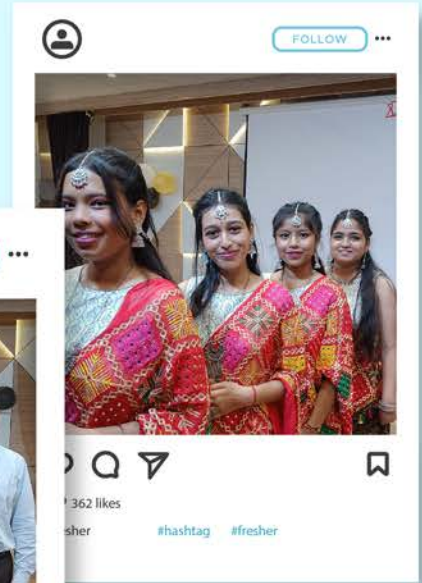
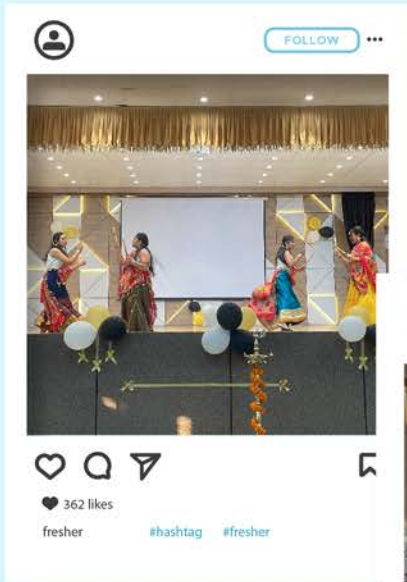
