Tonuco Petroglyphs and Fluorite Mine



Departure: 8:15AM, meet at Dairy Queen on Transmountian and I-10.

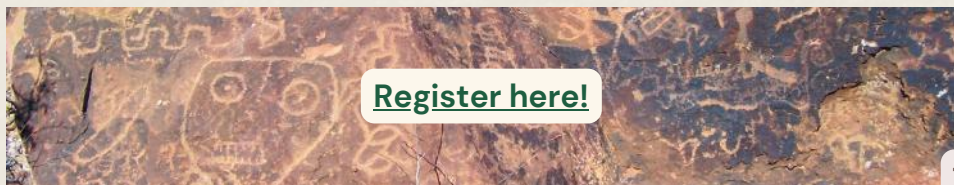
The aim is to present an understanding of early regional natives and learn about their techniques and classifications of their petroglyph drawings while exploring sandstone boulders to find the carvings. Discover some interesting facts about mining barite and fluorite in the area while entering an abandoned exploratory barite mine from early 1900's.

Difficulty: This moderate to difficult 2-mile hike involves a 1000-foot elevation gain. A 4-wheel drive vehicle is recommended for the last mile through a sandy riverbed. Participants should arrange rides with someone who has a 4-wheel drive or meet at the morning location. The drive to the trailhead takes about an hour, with the hike expected to last 5 to 5.5 hours, including breaks.

Meeting Details: Meet at 8 AM for caravaning in the Dairy Queen parking lot on Transmountain road and I-10. The group will leave promptly at 8:15 AM. Bring 3-4 liters of water, snacks, a sack lunch to eat on top of the mountain. Wear sturdy hiking shoes and wear a hat and/or use sunscreen, bring a walking stick for balance on some of the rocky terrain.

Anthony Gap Cave Trail Hike



Departure: 8AM, meet at the Walmart off 10840 Martin Luther King Jr Blvd.

This small-group experience includes guided entry into the cave, a unique feature of the trail. Cave Entry Included: Participants will be allowed to enter the cave as part of this hike.

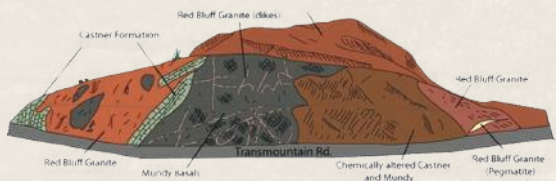

Oro Grande Rock Hounding



Departure: 9AM, meet at Circle K 4501 Woodrow Bean, near Lowes.

The trip will provide an overview of the geology and mining activity in the Oro Grande mining district, located in the Jarilla Mountains, north of El Paso. Participants will visit abandoned mines to collect minerals like chrysocolla, hematite, garnet, quartz, and possibly turquoise. Historically active from the 1880s to the 1910s, the area produced gold, silver, copper, lead, iron, tungsten, and turquoise. The deposits primarily consist of late-stage veins and limestone replacements linked to a Tertiary monzonite intrusion. The trip will also feature insights from Cactus Club members on the area's unique flora.

Difficulty: The trip involves several short walks on rugged terrain with the main walk being about 1 mile on an abandoned road. For those with limited mobility there is an option to only visit sites accessible via car with minimal walking. The drive is about 1 hr each way, most of which is on paved roads, though travel for 2 to 3 miles on rough roads is required. High clearance vehicles are recommended, though carpool options will be available.

Meeting Details: Meet at Circle K on Hwy 54 and Transmountain Rd (4501 Woodrow Bean, near Lowes) at 8:30 AM for a 9:00 AM departure. We will arrange carpooling at the time to minimize the vehicles. The duration is flexible, though with 2hr drive, please plan on a return around 5 pm. You will need to pack a lunch, bring plenty of water, hiking shoes, and rock collecting gear, etc.

Fluorite Ridge Rock Hounding, plus Mimbres Culture Petroglyphs



Departure: 9AM, meet at Dairy Queen on Transmountain and I-10.

This trip will provide an overview of mining district activities, visiting abandoned mines for fluorite specimens and the Pony Hills Petroglyph site, reflecting Mimbres culture (1200–600 AD). Fluorite Ridge, north of Deming, has historical significance with indigenous groups, the Butterfield stagecoach trail, and flourspar mining, which was promoted during WWII. The itinerary includes visits to the Greenleaf and Lucky mines and a short hike to the Pony Hills petroglyph site, offering panoramic views and discussions on geology, geography, flora, fauna, and human history.

Difficulty: The trip accommodates individuals with limited mobility and involves minimal hiking, primarily around park areas. Visiting the petroglyph site requires 10 to 15 minutes of walking on rocky terrain. A moderate two-mile hike is available for those interested. The drive lasts about 2 hours, mostly on paved roads, with 8 to 10 miles on rough roads; four-wheel drive is not necessary.

Meeting Details: Meet at Dairy Queen Parking lot on corner of Transmountain and IH-10 at 8:30 AM for a 9:00 AM departure. Carpooling will be arranged to minimize vehicles. Duration is flexible; expect a 2-hour drive each way, returning after 5 PM. Bring lunch, water, hiking shoes, and rock collecting gear. Optional dinner stop at Adobe Deli, a rustic eatery in an old school gym.

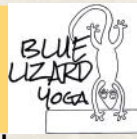

Enjoy a day of rock and mineral collecting along the foothills and arroyos of Red House Mountain near Hatch, New Mexico. Geologist, Manny Sosa will help co-lead and share valuable insights into modern mining techniques and the future of the industry in the Southwest. Jasper, fluorite, barite and quartz can be found in the area as well as beautiful hues of red and gray in silicified limestones. 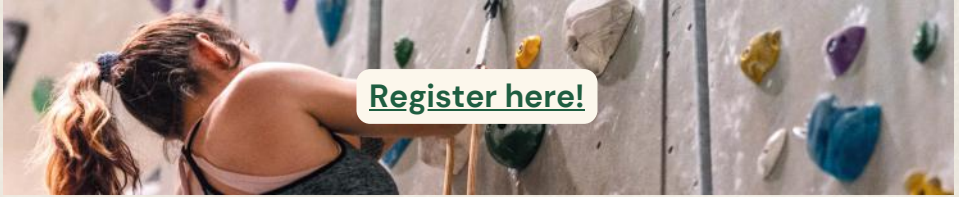

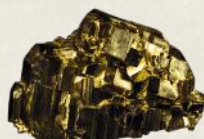
Departure: 9AM, meet at Rudy's BBQ, 6401 South Desert Blvd.

We will do a small amount of walking off trail, but the skill level is still beginner. Carpooling is highly encouraged.
