RESEARCH AND PLANNING CONTINUE

Even as we look ahead to the final weeks of the school year, there is much happening as we plan for years to come. Updates regarding the District Facilities Master Plan and the next steps of the District Strategic Plan are below.

FACILITIES MASTER PLAN: UPDATE

The District continues to work with The Collaborative, to <u>create a facilities master plan</u> that will guide the decision-making for the physical spaces of the District for the next several years.

The Collaborative is using feedback from the recent facilities survey and their evaluation of our buildings to propose potential facility upgrade options. Later this month, the District and The Collaborative will present these options.

All stakeholders will then have the opportunity to provide additional feedback for feedback on the proposed options. This will help to identify where the school community would like the District to focus its improvement efforts.

STRATEGIC PLAN: NEXT STEPS

Since early 2022, the District has been <u>engaged</u> in the strategic planning process to reflect upon its progress, gather feedback, review its core values, mission and vision, and plan for the future.

Thanks to input gathered during number of meetings, focus groups and stakeholder discussions, the District has identified its vi-



sion, mission and core beliefs, and developed strategies for meeting its goals.

The next step of the process is to identify the action steps each department, building and team will take to support these strategies to help ensure that Anthony Wayne Local Schools accomplishes its overall mission of empowering students to be future ready. Further discussions will take place at the April 10 Professional Development Day.

The Facilities Master Plan and Strategic Plan will guide our work for the next several years, and we thank you for your active participation in this process. Please continue to watch for future communications regarding how you can share your thoughts.

STRAW HAT MONTH


