

Mark Twain is an enduring symbol of America. He rose from poverty and suffered hardship and great loss, but he never lost his desire to understand and help his fellow human beings, call out wrongs, speak truth to power, give voice to those who had none, and present an unvarnished picture of America to the rest of the world.

The Mark Twain House & Museum preserves and presents to visitors from around the world the house from which sprang most of Twain's greatest works. It interprets the material legacy of Mark Twain and the Clemens family in exhibitions and through its curatorial collections. Through its public programs, the museum offers a forum for exploring and discussing issues related to politics and current events that constitute the contemporary mirror of Twain's own passions.

From this house, Mark Twain changed the way the world sees America and the way Americans see themselves. The Mark Twain House & Museum continues the conversation he began.




