A New Beginning at Sandy Lake Academy

A few weeks after my arrival in February 2025, we hosted our first youth event at Sandy Lake Academy. Our church school graciously opened its doors to receive us, setting the tone for what would become a year of connection, worship, and renewed vision. It was a blessing to see youth and young adults gathered in one place to praise the Lord. That first rally marked the beginning of our initial tour of the Maritime Conference as we intentionally sought to encounter our constituent churches and their young people where they live and serve.

A Year of Connection and Youth Gatherings

Throughout 2025, our ministry focused on presence, relationship-building, and shared worship experiences. We organized two youth rallies in Halifax and partnered with local churches to host Youth Days in Moncton, Fredericton, Halifax, North Sydney, and Bathurst. In addition, we conducted one-on-one visits with local youth leaders to offer support, listen to their realities, and strengthen our collaborative network. Our yearly Camp Meeting continued to serve as a cornerstone event, uniting families and youth in a spirit of celebration and spiritual growth. Alongside these Conference initiatives, I collaborated with our school by preaching monthly at school assemblies, helping nurture the spiritual life of our students and strengthening the bridge between education and ministry.

Catherine's Kitchen

Plant-Based Tzatziki

Ingredients:

- 1 cup of raw cashews that have been soaked overnight
- ½ cup water
- ¼ cup organic lemon juice
- ½ medium sized cucumber, peeled and shredded (about 2 small cucumbers)
- 1 garlic clove
- 2 tablespoons of fresh chopped dill (can also use fresh dill that has been frozen)
- ½ teaspoon sea salt

Instructions:

Drain the cashews and rinse thoroughly. Place into blender with the water, lemon juice, and garlic clove and blend until very smooth.

1. Take the shredded cucumber and remove excess water by Using a sieve to press out the water, or
2. Using a nut milk bag to remove the excess water. The key is to remove as much of the water as possible.

Empty the shredded cucumber into a bowl and add the cashew mix along with the chopped dill and salt. Stir so that all the ingredients are well mixed. Chill for at least 30 minutes.

Delicious with falafels and just about anything else that you want to use a dip for!

WOMEN'S MINISTRIES RETREAT

In September, more than 80 women gathered at Camp Pugwash for a spiritually uplifting retreat hosted by the Maritime Conference Women's Ministries department. The weekend featured guest speaker Nicole Sydeham, the Women's Ministry Leader from the Alberta Conference, who presented under the inspiring theme “*Strong and Free Together.*”

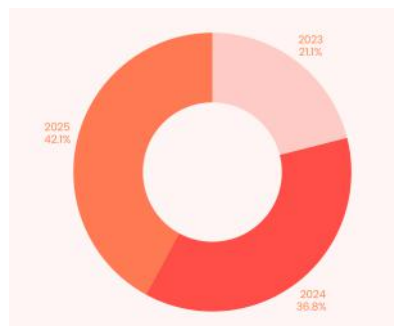
Nicole opened her heart as she shared her family's journey in pastoral ministry, offering honest reflections on the challenges and blessings they have experienced. Throughout her messages, she emphasized several key themes that resonated deeply with attendees:

- **Mindset and Well-being:**
She highlighted how negative thinking can weaken the vital connection between mind and body, encouraging women to cultivate healthier thought patterns.
- **Personal Empowerment:**
She reminded each woman of her God-given ability to reshape her story, choose positivity, and refuse to be defined by circumstances.
- **Contentment and Gratitude:**
Nicole urged participants to embrace each day as a gift from God and to avoid wasting precious time on negativity.
- **Navigating a Fast-paced World:**
Acknowledging the pressures of feeling overworked, overcommitted, and overwhelmed, she affirmed that God still calls His people to praise and glorify Him in every season.



- **Perseverance:**

She reinforced the conviction that giving up is never an option for Christian women who walk in faith. The retreat provided a meaningful space for encouragement, spiritual renewal, and deepened unity. Women left feeling strengthened, refreshed, and reminded that they truly are strong and free together.



Our Annual Women’s Retreat has experienced consistent growth over the past three years. In 2023, approximately 40 women attended. Participation increased to around 70 women in 2024 and continued to grow in 2025, reaching approximately 80 women. Women’s Ministries

across the Maritime Conference continues to grow as women come together in faith, unity, and service. Guided by God’s leading, we remain committed to strengthening local ministries, equipping godly leaders, and creating spaces where women are encouraged, connected, and empowered. Through our active Women’s Ministries Facebook page, we continue to engage, encourage, and reach women beyond our gatherings. As we look ahead, our prayer is to build a vibrant ministry where women stand strong, serving their churches and communities with purpose and love.

Many of us were probably devastated when we heard the tragic news regarding the bus accident involving the Grande Prairie SDA Church's Pathfinder Club in Alberta. On the evening of February 7, 2026, when returning home from the Pathfinder Bible Experience event in Edmonton, their charter bus left the roadway between Valleyview and Grande Prairie. Their beloved Pathfinder Club Director Lillian Banda lost her life, and multiple Club members and leaders sustained injuries*remaining hospitalized to receive medical care.

In the wake of this tragedy, the Alberta Conference provided comprehensive support for the Grande Prairie Church for individuals affected by the incident. We continually encourage the families within our Conference to keep our brothers and sisters affected by this tragedy in our prayers.
