Chaplains Corner #34

#### What is the Health of Your Ministry?

Recently, my pastor spoke about Mary and Martha in Luke 10:38-42. In this passage, Martha became upset because she was doing what she was supposed to do – serving the guests and our Lord, Jesus Christ – while Mary wasn't doing what was normally expected of her at that time. Instead of helping serve, Mary was seated at the feet of Jesus. When Martha complained, Jesus reprimanded her – not for serving, but for getting upset when Mary had chosen the better option: spending time with Jesus.

When we serve, whether at church, the dealership, a Black Sheep breakfast, or any other capacity that God calls us to, we need to do it for the right reasons. We should regularly check ourselves to ensure we aren't making the same mistake as Martha. Is it important to tend to guests? Yes. Should we serve in the Children's Ministry, Youth Ministry, Praise Team, tech team, parking lot, security, or however we've been called to serve in our church? Yes. Serving Him in some capacity is a sign of a growing, healthy believer. Is it important to feed the homeless and care for widows and orphans? Obviously, the answer is yes. We should do those things. However, if our service has become drudgery – an appointment we must keep with no joy or thoughts to how, why, or what we are doing we've lost the point of service.

We must remember that service does not take the place of a relationship with Jesus. We must spend time with Him, sit at His feet, and get to know Him through worship, prayer, Bible study, and meditation. We must ensure God is first — that we are not seeking a position more than simply being willing to serve Him.

This also applies to our Black Sheep ministry. If we have a role – chaplain, president, secretary, etc. – then we have a responsibility to do that with the proper attitude. We must check ourselves to ensure we don't become judgmental or serve with the wrong motives, which takes time for reflection and self-evaluation. When was the last time you took a break from serving or stepped back to examine why you do what you do? I am not asking anyone to step down or stop serving; I am asking you to spend some time making sure your relationship with God comes first. We cannot give what we don't have. If we aren't spending time with Jesus, how will we pass Him along to a world in desperate need of His grace?

As we celebrate Easter this month, please take a look at your service and your actions. Are you more interested in how you look to others or if you are serving Him properly? Are you abiding in Christ? Do your actions, attitudes, interactions with others, and social media posts reflect a life lived in Him? Remember the words of Psalms 91:1-2:

"The one who lives under the protection of the Most High dwells in the shadow of the Almighty. I will say concerning the LORD, who is my refuge and my fortress, my God in whom I trust..."

I encourage you to spend some time reflecting on this Psalm. And may God direct your paths! Love and blessings,

"Have you ever felt like God isn't listening? I'm sure we've all experienced that at some point in life. I want to encourage you with this testimony. For about four years, my wife and I have been navigating tough times while caring for and supporting family. The level of care and support required eventually forced us to sell our home in Arizona and move back to California. We spent years praying for wisdom to handle the difficult decisions that come with caring for elderly parents. At the same time, our oldest son fell ill, adding countless hours with doctors, healthcare professionals, and daily updates to our already heavy load. Life became so overwhelming that our physical and mental health began to suffer. The breaking point came for me last summer. I was sitting in my garage, working on my motorcycle, while my wife was away for the weekend tending to family needs. It was a scorching hot day, around midday, and I found myself talking to God about everything-my wife's parents, our son, the relentless challenges. In frustration, I asked, 'Lord, are You listening?' I didn't want to test God, but I remembered the story of Gideon asking for a sign (Judges 6:36). So, I prayed, 'If You hear me, Lord, please let a coyote cross my vision on the hill across the street. Now, coyotes are mostly nocturnal, active at dawn or dusk—not in the heat of midday. Less than a minute later, an adult coyote stepped out of the bushes and walked calmly across the hill in full view before disappearing. It wasn't in my peripheral vision, wasn't running, chasing a rabbit, or playing with another coyote. In my spirit, I knew this was no coincidence. It was God, in His grace and mercy, showing me He hears my prayers and is with me. Tears welled up as I thanked Him. I hope this testimony reminds you that God will never leave you or forsake you (Deuteronomy 31:6)."


#### **CALLED TO RIDE AND REDEEM**

It all started back in 2008, during a break from tearing apart a friend's kitchen. While kicking back in his backyard, I spotted a motorcycle tucked under a tarp. Curiosity got the better of me, so I asked, "What's the deal with that?" He grinned and said, "That's my '92 Sportster. Get it running, and it's yours to ride." That moment sparked my love for Harleys—and unbeknownst to me, it was the first mile of a journey God had mapped out, weaving my passion for riding into His greater purpose.

I dove into the mentorship process and officially joined in March 2022. By October 2023, God had stirred others to the cause, and the Yuma 14:23 Chapter roared to life. I was humbled to step up as its first president. But the Lord wasn't done. Today, in March 2025, I'm honored to serve as the Regional Director for the Rocky Mountains Region—a role I never dreamed I'd fill.

Through Black Sheep, I've seen Jesus transform lives in ways that still leave me in awe. Strangers at gas stations have come to faith mid-conversation. Broken families have found restoration. Healings—physical and spiritual—have unfolded before my eyes. And somehow, God always provides what our chapter needs as we hit the road. 

#### How I Became A Black Sheep Missionary

Since then, my love for riding has only grown. In fact, last year, I added a second Harley-Davidson to the fleet—a 2024 Hydra-Glide Icon. I call this one "Elvis" It's a modern remake of the legendary 1956 Hydra-Glide that Elvis rode—and so did my dad. That bike carries some serious history and heart. It's a beautiful little Softail, and I absolutely love to ride it.

In 2017, I was riding a 2010
Yamaha FJR sport bike. I never
thought I'd sell it—let alone buy a
Harley-Davidson. But that
changed when my wife and I
walked into Temecula
Harley-Davidson and laid eyes
on a black and blue 2018
Ultra-Limited Classic 115th
Anniversary model.

On one of my parts runs back in the early days, I met a man who was clearly struggling. I asked if I could pray for him, and as we prayed, Casey from the parts department quietly slipped a business card into my pocket. It was for Chris Bergman, Chapter President of the Temecula chapter of Black Sheep.

She hopped on the back and said, "This feels like a recliner! I feel like you've been cheating me!" That sealed it—we traded in the Yamaha and rode off on the Harley. Of course, I had to make some modifications. It was just too slow.

I reached out. Chris invited me to breakfast and a few rides. "We'll be checking you out," he said. I replied, "Good—because I'll be checking you out too."



On my very first ride with Temecula Black Sheep, the first two people I met were Tom and Marianne Segobia—Tom's road name is Scooby. They were amazing and made me feel right at home. I started connecting with riders from the Temecula, Riverside, and Lake Elsinore chapters—guys like PITA, Larry Hancock, and Rico Martinez (then president of the Lake Elsinore chapter). Rico was a game-changer in my journey.

I met Zach Rosser through No Man Left Behind—he also rides with Black Sheep. He and his wife Wendy are a blessing. And my mentorship? That came from Micah Orloff, who poured into me with wisdom, love, and accountability. His wife Alicia is just as incredible. I'm honored to have been Micah's mentee.

I'll never forget meeting Marty Edwards, the founder of Black Sheep, and Tony Schumaker at a car show at Lamb's Fellowship. When Marty asked what chapter I rode with, I said, "I'm kind of a tri-chapter guy."

He looked at Tony and said, "I don't think we have a tri-chapter."
Tony said, "We don't."
"Well, now you do," I smiled.

Eventually, I chose to patch in with Temecula since it was closest to home. Not long after, Temecula and Lake Elsinore chapters merged, and Rico became our chapter president.

That's when I received my road name: Barnabas, which means Son of Encouragement. It was given to me during mentorship because that's just who I am—I'm always encouraging others.

Today, I'm honored to serve on the board of the Temecula Chapter as Vice President. Black Sheep Motorcycle Ministry for Christ truly is my forever family. I love the rides, the fun, the food, the fellowship—but most of all, I love that it's all about Jesus. We get to share Christ with people who might never step foot in a church. We get to be missionaries on two wheels.

Every other year, we have The Gathering—where Black Sheep from all over the world come together: from Europe, across the U.S., and every active chapter. The next one is in Boise, Idaho—and I can't wait!

It's such a blessing to be part of this powerful motorcycle mission field. This is my story. And I love it.


The weather may not have been on their side—cloudy, damp, and cool in the low 40s—but our Connecticut BSMMFC didn't stop from showing up and serving!

At one point, the Pinal County sheriff called me by my road name. To be honest, I didn't recognize her at first, and she must have noticed the confusion on my face because she reminded me of where we had met. We crossed paths at the "Shop with the Sheriff" event, which the American Legion Riders Post 97 and Exodus chapter host every year. She went on to say that she knew about my past, so I asked her if that was a good thing or a bad thing. She smiled and said, "Oh, it's good," and then dropped a bombshell: she asked me to be a motivational speaker for a new troubled youth program they're trying to start.

Several years ago, when I was still in prison, I used to pray that God would put me in a position to save just one kid from making the same mistakes I did. When I heard her request, I immediately thanked God out loud and handed her my card.

As we walk in this world with Jesus, we make plans and have ideas, but none are greater than His. His plans are the ones we need to listen to. He answers our prayers—maybe not always right away, and sometimes not in the way we expect—but we must trust in His plan. He knows what's better for us than we do ourselves. The key is to be listening when you are called. When you are devoted and obedient, He will use you for His glory, whether you're on your bike or wearing your cut. Always be ready for God!

She felt the call, too, and was all in.

As a couple with grown children, this journey has strengthened our marriage and brought us new adventures.
