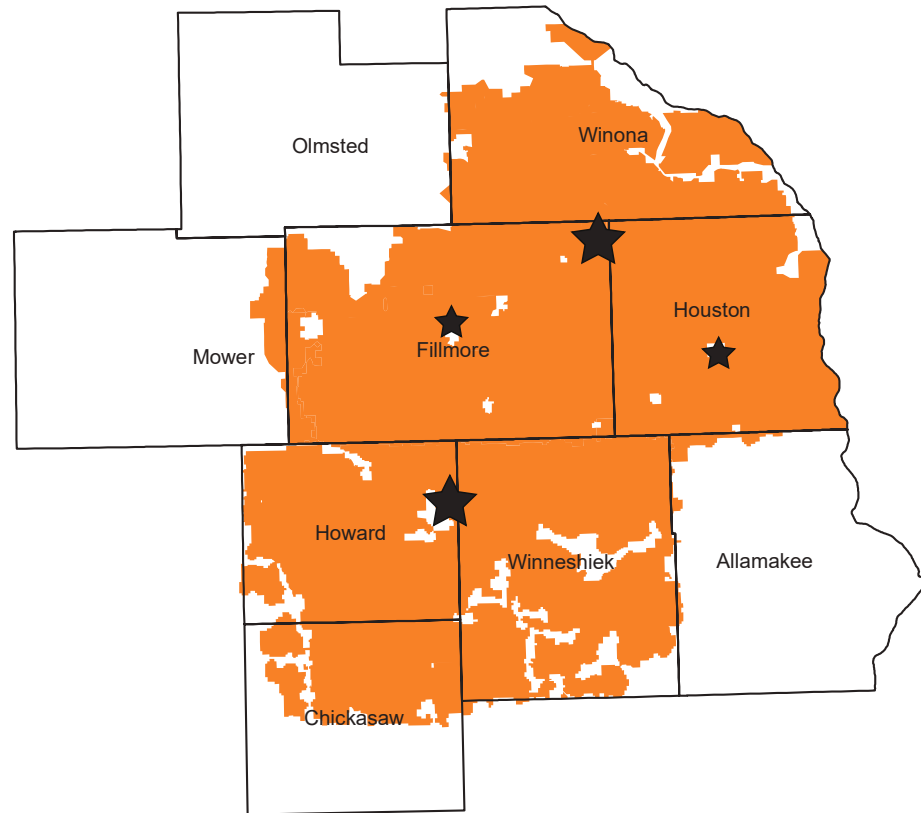

Since the merger in 2017, MiEnergy's board of directors has approved returning **\$15.1 MILLION** to members in the form of capital credits and special refunds.

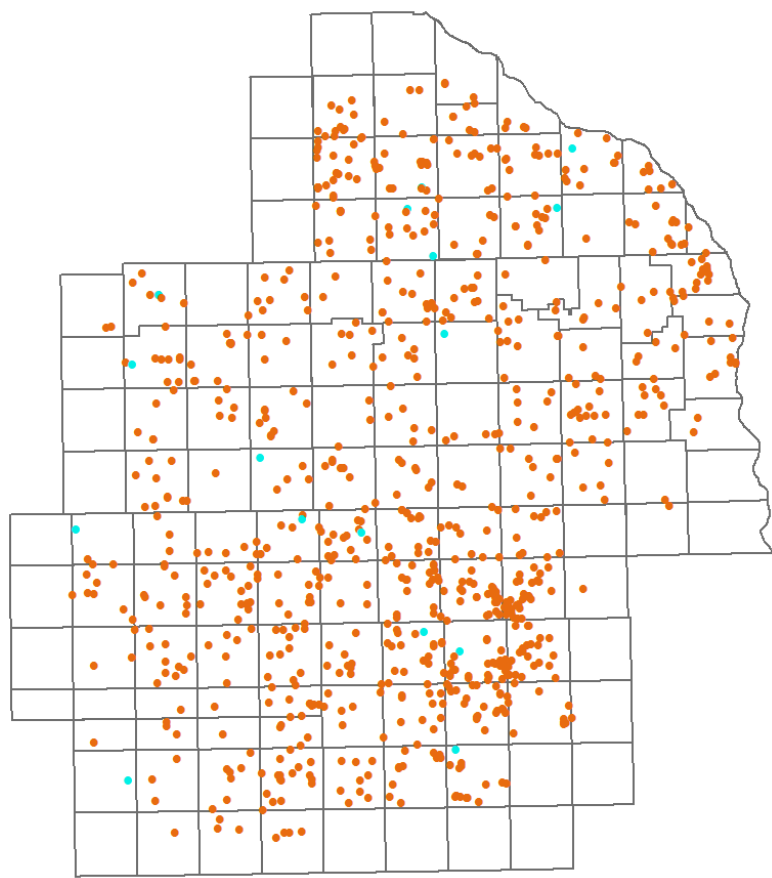

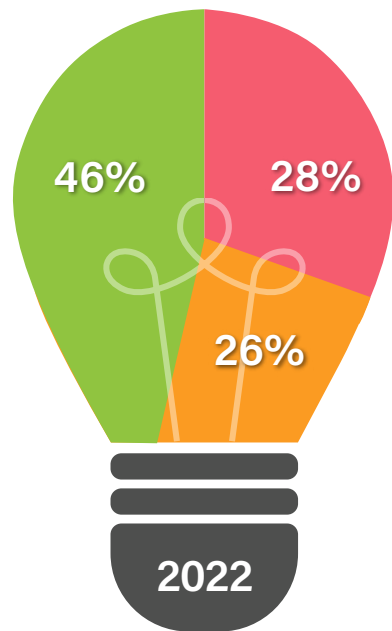
