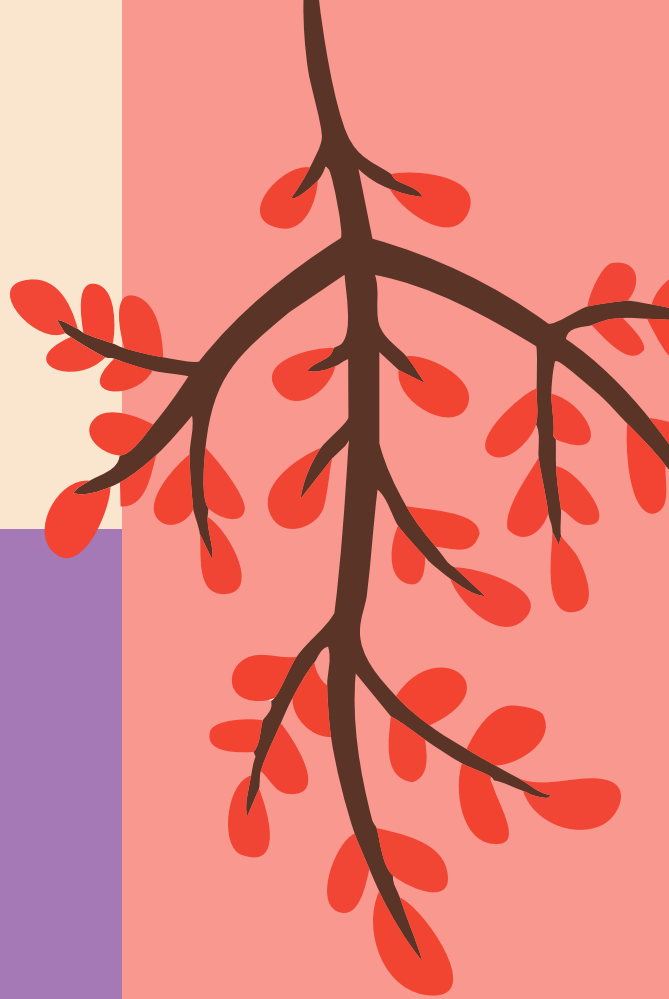

- One Journey – Complete one Journey (still valid after retirement!)

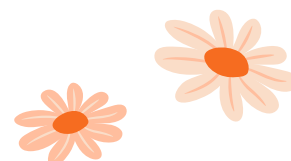
The challenge remains the same, 50 hours for Silver and 80 for Gold — but now girls have more freedom to shape their leadership adventure in ways that match their passions and dreams.

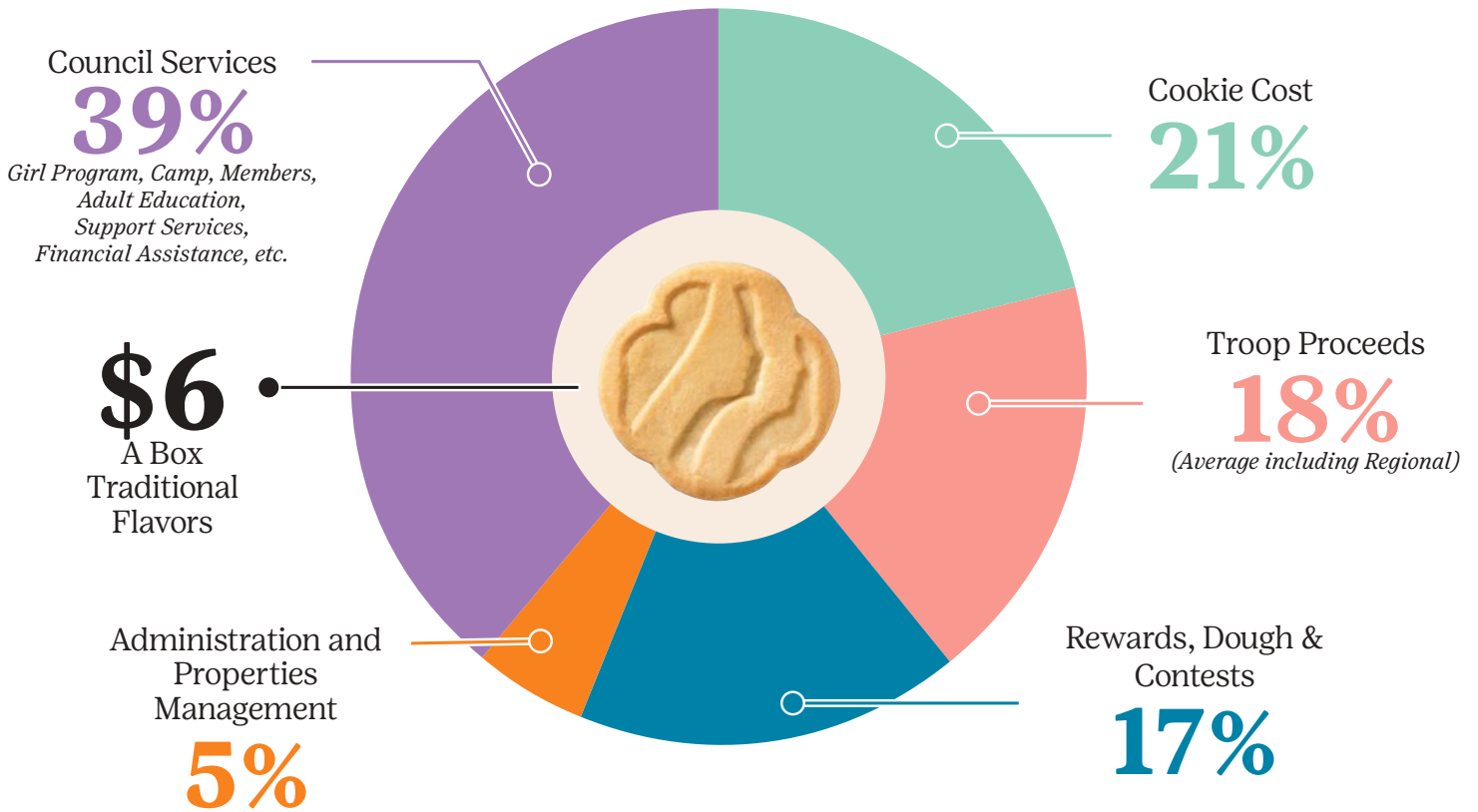

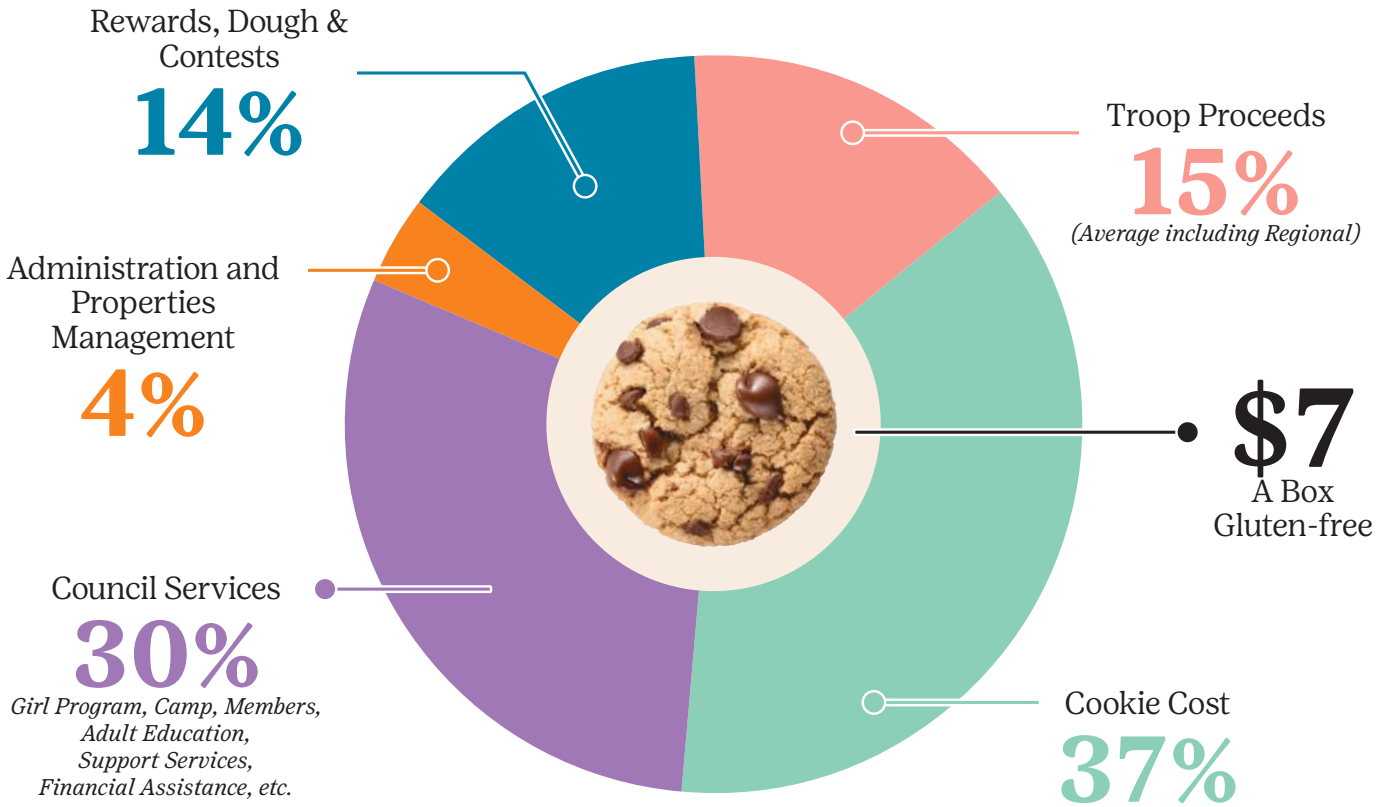

TROOP COORDINATOR TRAINING

We would like to extend our heartfelt thanks to each of you for stepping up to be a Troop Product Coordinator (TPC) for the upcoming Cookie Program. Your commitment to guiding and supporting our girls during this important time means so much. As Troop Product Coordinators, you play a vital role in helping our Girl Scouts develop important skills like teamwork, leadership, and entrepreneurship. Your dedication and enthusiasm will inspire them to reach their goals and create wonderful memories along the way. Thank you for your willingness to volunteer your time and energy. Together, we can make this cookie season a success and empower our girls to shine.

In order to participate in the 2026 Cookie Program, it is mandatory that one registered adult from each troop becomes the Product Coordinator and completes the online training learning pathway (Opens by 11/25/2025). The Product Coordinator does not need to be a co-leader, but must meet these requirements:

- Active 2026 Membership
- Current Cleared Background check
- Mandated Reporter Training Certificate on file
- Live Scan



All Troop Product Coordinators must register using the link below to be approved to access the Mandatory Online Training and coordinator agreement and participate in the 2026 Cookie Program. The Mandatory Online Training opens in GS Learn on or before November 25, 2025.

Any coordinator that completes the requirements after those deadlines will need to wait to place a planned cookie cupboard order available for pick-up beginning **January 26, 2026**.

IEPO INDEPENDENT ENTREPRENEURIAL PROGRAM OPPORTUNITY

For girls not affiliated with a participating troop who want to participate in the 2026 Cookie Program.

What is required? Girl Scouts and their caregiver must be registered and active with the Girl Scouts of San Geronio Council to participate.

What does she earn? Girl Scouts participating in the IEPO will earn: the Standard Girl Reward Plan, Cookie Dough, and IEPO Cookie Dough. Since they are not part of a troop they cannot earn proceeds or qualify for any troop PGA/Group rewards. Instead they earn additional IEPO Cookie Dough beyond the standard schedule to use toward GSSGC programming, events, and camp. The IEPO Cookie Dough for the 2026 Cookie Program is calculated at \$5 for every 25 packages sold. (Max IEPO Cookie Dough Value is \$250)

How to Participate:

Senior & Ambassador

Option 1: Fully Independent

- Girl Scouts can participate in a fully independent program managed by the Council Entrepreneurial Team
- Girls/Caregivers schedule their own cupboard pick-ups and booths within council assigned limits.

Option 2: Placement With a Local Host Troop

- Host troops will coordinate the program for their assigned Independently Registered Girl(s) by facilitating parent training, product pick-ups, collecting and logging cash payments, answering questions and including them in their booth sale staffing.
- There is no continued affiliation between the host troop and Independently Registered Girl(s) after the Cookie Program ends.

Option 3: Join the Entrepreneurial Club (Virtual Meeting) Facilitated by Staff

- In this Entrepreneurship Series, girls will explore what it means to be an entrepreneur by setting goals, building confidence, and practicing problem-solving-all while learning sales skills through the Girl Scout Product Program. For more information, visit gssgc.org/cookieclubs.
- This option is recommended for girls new to Girl Scouts to engage in a more robust programming experience and a guided introduction to the Cookie Program.

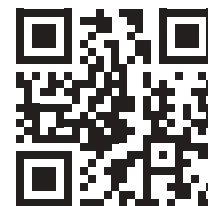

International travel requires a passport valid six months beyond the travel return date, in-hand by March 15, 2026.

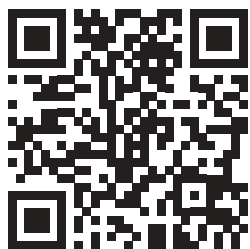

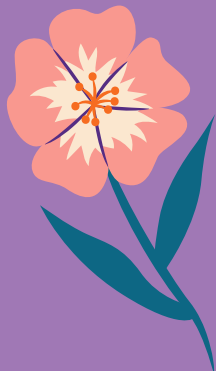


How to Register

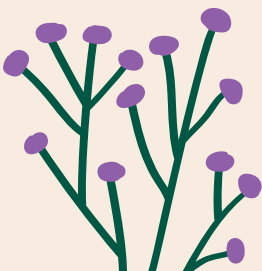

Volunteer Safety Steps

GSSGC policy is to conduct a criminal background check on all volunteers. We require a Live Scan to be completed for volunteers that expect to be in direct contact with Girl Scouts for more than 16 hours per month or more than 32 hours per year.

You must complete both screening and training to participate in GSSGC activities.

Mandated Reporter Training

- Sign on to your GSlearn account.
- Go to the Content Library, and search to complete “GSUSA Girl Scouts Child Abuse Neglect and Prevention”.
- Complete the training.
- Screenshot the achievement once training is completed and email it to mandatedreportercert@gssgc.org.

This training requirement can be waived if you hold a current, professional mandated reporter certification.

Note: This training does not come with a certificate of achievement. Completion of this training is recorded as an achievement in GSlearn. For assistance, please contact Customer Care at customercare@gssgc.org.

Highest Awards

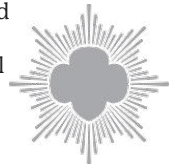
Girl Scout Bronze Award

The Bronze Award is the highest award a Girl Scout **Junior** (grades 4-5) can earn. A girl can work with her troop, in a small group, or as an individual to earn her Bronze Award once she has completed a Junior Journey.



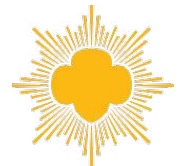
Girl Scout Silver Award

Silver Award Girl Scouts have earned the highest award a Girl Scout **Cadette** (grades 6-8) can earn. A girl can work with her troop/group (a maximum of 4 girls per project) or as an individual to earn her Silver Award once she has completed a Cadette Journey.



Girl Scout Gold Award

Gold Award Girl Scouts have earned the highest award a Girl Scout **Senior** (grades 9-10) or **Ambassador** (grade 11-12) can earn. A girl earns this award as an individual once she has completed two Senior/Ambassador Journeys OR has earned the Silver Award and completed one Senior/Ambassador Journey. Girls complete steps, track their progress using GSUSA’s GoGold Platform and work with our local Gold Award Support Team.

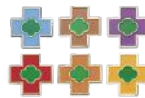
True North Award

This award is earned by turning your personal convictions into a confident and courageous act.



Girl Scout Safety Award

Each level has its own set of requirements to teach girls how to stay safe.



Bridging Award

Bridging Girl Scouts earn this award by completing two steps:



- 1) Pass It On: to share what they’ve learned with younger girls and
- 2) Look Ahead: to learn from older girls about their next Girl Scout level.

My Promise, My Faith

Girl Scouts of all levels can earn one award each year as they explore the connection between Girl Scouts and their faith.



Meritorious Service*

Bronze Cross

This Lifesaving Award is given to a Girl Scout who has shown extraordinary heroism or risked her life to save another’s.



Medal of Honor

This Lifesaving Award is given to a Girl Scout who has saved someone’s life in an emergency.



Meritorious Service awards are rare. To recommend a girl for acts of heroism, contact customercare@gssgc.org.

Mentoring Awards

Junior Aide

Girl Scout **Juniors** can earn this mentoring award by helping Daisies or Brownies earn one of their Journeys.



Program Aide Training (PA)

For **Cadettes**. There are three steps to earn this mentoring award – earn one LiA Award, complete the Program Aide Training Course, and work directly with younger girls over six activity sessions (one-hour sessions are suggested).



Counselor-in-Training 1 (CIT I)

Seniors build skills toward becoming a camp counselor and earn this award by mentoring younger girls in a camp setting. GSSGC girls may complete this award during a CIT I session at Camp Skyland Ranch.



Counselor-in-Training II (CIT II)

Ambassadors who have earned the CIT I Award focus on increasing their skills in one specific area and earn this award by working with younger girls in a camp setting. GSSGC girls may complete this award during a CIT II session at Camp Skyland Ranch.



Volunteer-in-Training (VIT)

Seniors and Ambassadors who mentor a Daisy, Brownie, Junior, or Cadette group outside of camp can earn this award. There are three steps to this award – work with an adult mentor, complete training, and create and implement a program for girls based on a Journey or badge.



Opportunity Awards for All Levels

Cookie Family Pin

Girls can earn this award every year with their family as they participate in the cookie program.



Global Action Award

Girls complete activities related to United Nations Sustainable Development Goals to earn this award.

World Thinking Day Award



Girls take part in activities to honor and celebrate our global sisterhood around the world to earn this award.

National Leadership Awards

Torch Awards



This award recognizes **Cadettes** (Silver), **Seniors** (Gold), and **Ambassadors** (Gold & Silver) who act as leaders in their community. There are two steps to this award – complete a Journey and serve for one term in a leadership position.

Community Service Bar



To earn this award, **Cadettes, Seniors, and Ambassadors** choose a community organization to work with, and complete at least 20 hours of service.*

Service to Girl Scouting Bar



Cadettes, Seniors, and Ambassadors often volunteer to help with younger girls or on other special projects. Once a girl completes at least 20 hours of service to Girl Scouting, she can earn this award.*

The Journey Take Action Project girls complete is separate from the Highest Awards: Bronze, Silver, and Gold Award Take Action Project. Guidelines for the Highest Awards, Bronze, Silver, and Gold, are in The Girl's Guide to Girl Scouting and on the GSSGC and GSUSA websites at www.gssgc.org and www.girlscouts.org.

**Hours of service girls use to earn these awards must be separate from those counted toward other awards.*

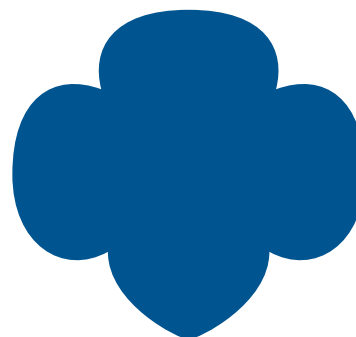
