



Number of cooperating countries according to the years






The numbers represent the total number of signed contracts and continuity (e.g. 1 contract signed for 3 years = 3)

The number of collaborating universities












Outgoing staff data according to the universities










Outgoing students' data according to faculties






Outgoing students' data according to educational degree














Comparison of appropriate credits/learning outcomes




Number of attended subjects




Average % of altered credits according to sending faculties




Average % of altered credits according to hosting universities




The % of final credits according to sending faculties




Passed subjects/modules




50 % and more failed subjects/modules according to gender
