Delving into the recent disaster salvage

The recent International Conference on disaster management organized by Sewa International, from 28th to 30th March 2022 in Delhi, ascertained various views about disaster management and the approach adopted towards relief and rehabilitation. The inaugural session dignitary, Lt Gen Syed Ata Hasnain (Retd.) (Member, NDA) on 28th March 2022, shed light on the arising concern of non-professional approaches being utilized to deal with disasters, inclined more towards relief and rehabilitation. He presented his arguments quoting, "the paradigm shift has questioned the non- professional methods of disaster management, which was earlier focusing on relief and rehabilitation only." His views highlighted the need for paradigm shift, while acknowledging the crucial role of civil society organizations in disaster risk reduction and prior preparedness. He quotes, "previously, the government and responsible agencies had minimal focus on risk reduction and preparedness, however, the aftermath of 2004 tsunami has led to a revival and retrospection of disaster politics. Thus, shaping governments nationwide more aware of disaster preparedness through prior planning."

Additionally, he voiced his views about the ongoing human-made disaster of the Russia-Ukraine war, while further identifying the challenges in disaster relief and recovery in waraffected areas due to the lack of administrative and logistical support. In conjunction with his
ideas, he referred to 'Gender Inclusion' and its negligence for a long period of time, thus,
arising the need for gender sensitivity when managing disasters. While addressing the ten
dimensions of PM's 10 point agenda, Lt. Gen. Hasnain proposed the additional 11th point,
emphasizing the integration of civil society organization with various stakeholders including
government agencies, urban planners, industries, educators and communities for better
participation at the community level. Simultaneously, this year marks the completion of 10
years of the nightmare of Uttarakhand tragedy.

The recent incident of successful evacuation of 41 stranded laborers in Uttarakhand after 18 days of continuous struggle, showcases the effectiveness of disaster management efforts in our country. Lt Gen Hasnain, who initiated the rescue operation provided immense information about the incident and helped save innocent lives after strategizing for the disaster management process. While the government formulates policies for disaster management, social organizations are actively involved in spreading awareness. On the same hand, Sewa International has also been working on disaster management for the past 20 years. The organization has recently started a unique initiative, aimed towards preparing students at the school level to handle and manage disasters. This initiative has been named as School Crisis Orientation & Disaster Education (SCODE), which plans to provide disaster management related training to 75 schools in Uttarakhand and 25 schools in the Delhi NCR region. Sewa International has developed an international level module for this purpose, hoping for the project to be identified as instrumental in spreading public awareness at social level related to disaster management.

through this business, apart from engaging in sewing and embroidery work at the 'Sewa Mahila Jyoti' centre. The transformative support from Sewa International has been instrumental in shaping my current circumstances, and for this, my heartfelt gratitude goes to Sewa International."

Sewa for Sikkim Amidst Disaster!

The recent flash floods that wreaked havoc in Sikkim has left an everlasting scar on its natives. Sewa International's disaster response team was on the ground since day one, assessing the needs of affected people. While simultaneously distributing relief materials in the worstaffected areas. The team worked round the clock along with volunteers, providing timely support to the affected families. Distribution of dry ration, hygiene and sanitation kits, medicines, and other essential items was carried out amidst the challenging weather conditions. Additionally, more than 50 families were provided with household items in the form of dry ration kits, along with building materials to rebuild their homes that were washed away during the flood.

Our approach achieves dual objectives, Firstly, we uplift local women by enhancing their skills through intensive training. Secondly, we empower them financially by offering avenues for showcasing and selling their products. This. integrated strategy ensures a sustainable and meaningful impact on the lives of women in the Uttarakhand region.

From the Roots of Kutch to the Heart of Delhi

Gujarat never disappoints us when it comes to handicrafts. What makes it even more special is that the people of Gujarat continue to carry this cultural heritage from generation to generation and never forget their roots.
