Artists paint....not bake


Our numbers were down a little this year

Backing Winchelsea's fast growing community

The Labor Government is continuing to support Surf Coast Shire's fastgrowing community with the infrastructure it needs.

Labor Member for Western Victoria, Gayle Tierney today announced the latest round of projects from the Labor Government's \$50 million Growing Suburbs Fund.

Flood Recovery

As Mick O'Mara commented in the Star of 11th October, our floods at Winchelsea so far have been quite benign. Interesting, and picturesque, perhaps, but certainly not a disaster like our friends to the north have experienced. Nevertheless, there will be a bit of cleaning up to do in due course. Thanks for the reminder, Mick, to watch out for snakes in the debris!

There are some good things about it of course. The ground is getting a good soaking, a change from the 'green drought' a local farmer mentioned in my hearing not so long ago. When he had cause to dig through the grass at his place, the earth beneath was still dry and dusty. Water storages are full for the first time for years, and up and down the country another good thing must be occurring. Our depleted underground aquafers will be replenishing at last.

My brother, who is at Menindee near Broken Hill, tells me that the desert is flowering magnificently. Fish are jumping in the Darling, now a swift-flowing torrent. Across Australia, the deserts are in bloom, which means that billions of tiny creatures will also be benefiting.

My garden is thriving, as yours probably



is too, along with all the weeds that threaten to overwhelm it! Obviously, our country needs flooding rains. How do we organise ourselves to keep out of the way of them, and not cause them to have worse consequences?

It is an amazing world we live in, full of complexity and challenge.

I was reading the last chapters of Job, in the Bible, recently. We don't know when he lived, but probably in very ancient times. We don't know where he lived, but probably not in Israel. He faced so much disaster, trauma and anguish, and called out to God: Why? Why? It is a constant cry of us humans, whenever disasters come.

Job doesn't want so much of God's attention! 'Leave me alone,' he says, 'for my days are but a breath.' But he keeps on wanting to know that God is for him, and with him.

When God does speak to him, he takes him on a tour of creation, showing him God's kingly rule through the many wonders and threatening realities of the world. God reveals his loving care and concern for every part of creation to this human being who, along with the rest of us, has been given by God shared responsibility to care for it too.

God did not fully explain why disasters had come, but Job's vision of God is greatly expanded. He has a new appreciation of the scope and harmony of God's world. The world is beautiful and terrifying, and in it all God is powerful and wise and mysterious. It is marvellous beyond all wonder that this one has spoken to Job! And speaks to us, too.

Job has grown in wisdom. He is both delighted and ashamed.

Like Job, we are all creatures of dignity and worth, called to live well in a challenging and wondrous world.

week, an increase of 20.1 per cent on the previous week. The average daily number of new cases this week was 1,461, up from 1,220 last week.

The number of active cases in Victoria is 9,607 up from 7,851 at the same time last week.

The seven-day rolling average of patients with COVID-19 in Victorian hospitals is 231, a 34.3 per cent increase when compared to the same time last week.

There are currently 256 COVID-19 patients in hospital in Victoria. 8 patients and 1 cleared care are in intensive care. There are 3 COVID-19 patients on a ventilator. The seven-day rolling average of patients in intensive care in Victorian hospitals is 7.

In the past three months, 4,039 COVID-19 patients were hospitalised in Victoria.



Hello Marejka Knigge,

I acknowledge receipt of your undated and unsigned information sheet relating to Hesse Street, Winchelsea.

This was not requested and I find your response disingenuous and unsatisfactory.

My concerns expressed to you were on behalf of the residents of Heath Court and the Winchelsea community generally who had been exposed to a very large young male participant rampaging in and around Winchelsea.

Multiple police interventions occurred and correspondence from your agency advising residents to secure themselves in their cars/ houses and seemingly trying to avoid contact with your client demonstrated that your management plans were totally inadequate.

This does not inspire confidence in your ability to manage 1 let alone 3 seriously challenged individuals.

We are not concerned with the construction nor the paint colours that might be chosen but that someone has failed their due diligence.

These units are being built opposite a kindergarten and adjacent to a day care centre.

No communication or consultation occurred with the community about the site's location and suitability.

In your correspondence to me no mention is made how you propose to manage such clients nor how you seek to redress the concerns and lived experiences of our community.

Your total focus is on your participants and not the community at large.

How do you expect these residents to be welcomed into our community unless you can guarantee that the community will be supported and secure.

Your letters to the residents was indeed fatuous and facile requiring the community to be held to ransom and

housebound because of your management failures.

I expect an intelligent and relevant response to our concerns and addressing how you will keep the Winchelsea community safe and able to go about their daily affairs without fear of these behaviours being repeated.

Winchelsea Open Gardens Day

An open garden is a glimpse into another world. One full of colour and life with a story to tell. Each one has its own character and will trigger something different in their observers. The best gardens are planned worlds of art, they are made to be enjoyed.

On Sunday 13th November five gardens across Winchelsea will open there gates, giving you a glimpse into these beautiful worlds of tranquillity, charm and history.

'Murdeduke' is a family home going back generations. Most of the garden as it stands today was developed in the late 1940s by Jessica and Jim Wilson, the present owners grandparents. The beauty of this garden is the overwhelming sense of history you feel when you first walk in. The circular carriage-way and two-storey bluestone homestead built back in 1875 are unmistakable marks of a time long since passed. The formal garden incorporates open spaces, sculptures and water features with lush trees, roses and perennials of varying strong colours. This garden has a tale to tell and has something for everyone.



'Narwee' is a country garden full of colour and buzzing with life. Combining the perfect balance of edibles and flowering plants, the garden includes an orchard, vegetable garden, roses, iris, salvias, and teucrium. What stands out the most of this vibrant garden is the pops of colour of drought tolerant plants. This garden is alive with those colour and will sing to you as you walk its journey.

'Chittering' has a tranquillity to it that relaxes you instantly. The trees and surrounding cottage garden have slowly grown over time into a layered escape of serenity. The story includes a formal rose garden, a wisteria clad pergola, orchard, and vegetable garden. Low maintenance garden beds featuring dry climate Mediterranean plants, succulents, and shrubs surround the house. Bring a book, immerse yourself in this world and escape for a while. 'Coombe cottage' has an energy about it that is both new and old. From the moment you step through the gates you feel a sense of a traditional native garden with an 1860 bluestone cottage, but the journey continues as you turn a corner into a modern wide expanse of lush green grass lazing down to a billabong. The sculptures around the garden will both surprise and delight. Sitting on approximately 3 acres this eclectic garden of natives, exotics, succulents, orchards make the perfect home for a variety of birds.

Walking into the garden of 'Calluna', you feel a tranquil park like feeling, with a variety of deciduous trees, native trees and shrubs. The northern garden features a sprawling lawn, rose arbour and native garden. A wonderful borrowed vista of the golf course is the Western boundary of the property. A productive vegetable garden and orchard are on the south boundary. All providing a peaceful atmosphere and a haven for those lucky enough to experience it.
