Personal, Social, Health and Economic (PSHE) and Citizenship




Year 7, 8 and 9







Pre A-Level

Our Pre A Level Course can be entered for two or three terms starting in September or January.

The Pre A Level Course is aimed at international students whose levels of English are not yet developed enough to access the A Level programme. The focus is to help students improve their English and build language skills suitable for studying at A Level. The intention is that students will complete the Pre A Level Course, with the aim of potentially moving onto the two year A Level at BCS. Students will sit the Cambridge First Certificate at the end of the year to confirm the transition and other examinations will be used to inform subject choice for A Level.

The course structure includes:

- Opportunity to sit a GCSE in a language as a native speaker (if available)
- IGCSE Mathematics
- Intensive EAL and preparation for FCE examinations, 10 hours per fortnight
- Courses in:
 - Business
 - Visual Arts
 - Science
 - Physical Education

Pupils have two hours of timetabled study time each week, and in addition are be expected to study independently to meet assignment and examination deadlines.



A Level

BCS Sixth Form students are able to choose from a diverse range of both A Levels and BTEC subjects for their next stage of learning.

Students usually take three subjects and these can be all A Levels, all BTECs or a combination of the two courses. The BTECs we offer are the equivalent of one or two A Levels and tend to suit our students well, as they are focused on the holistic development of the practical, interpersonal and thinking skills required to be able to succeed in employment and higher education.

Extended Project Qualification

The EPQ is a qualification equivalent to 50% of an A Level.

At BCS A Level students can pursue an EPQ, in addition to studying for their three main A Levels. It is perfect for creative and passionate students who wish to showcase their initiative and research skills for developing study patterns and higher level writing skills in preparation for university.





WHAT IS AN EPQ?

An independent research based qualification whereby:

- Students choose an area of personal interest
- Students plan, research and carry out the project
- Deliver a presentation to a specified audience
- Provide evidence of all stages of project development and production for assessment.
- The project can take various formats from classic report style to an artefact which can be anything from a painting to a performance with a shorter write up.

HOW IS IT TAUGHT?

Students have 30 guided learning hours in a classroom with a specialist teacher. This involves specific skills to successfully complete the EPQ project and is taught in groups, fostering teamwork but also has an independent element as this is the focus of the EPQ.

Following the taught element students are allotted a specific supervisor who works with them on an individual basis for the remainder of the project.

WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS OF AN EPQ?

- Students can include it on UCAS application, it demonstrates the skills and qualities that universities are looking for and explained via their personal statement.
- It could help them meet the conditions of a university place offer, as it's worth extra points and may lower the grade offer a university might make a student.
- The opportunity to produce a piece of work that's truly individual, whether it's a written research report, event or creative artefact.
- It clearly demonstrates a passion for the subject particularly useful if the student chooses to study the subject at degree level.
- It shows self-motivation and relevant skills to future employers.
- It prepares students for university by its truly independent nature but also in that the
 production of analytical and referenced work demonstrates critical thinking which weighs up
 research and also provides opportunities for students to be self critical, all of which are skills
 that will help students achieve academic success and personal development.

Boarding at BCS

Boarding at BCS is a home away from home for our students; where the focus is to create a positive, caring, stimulating and safe environment where children from all nationalities and cultures can thrive and connect.

Our boarding team believe in a child-centred education which allows our students to grow in confidence and independence, while fully supporting them in their academic and personal successes. Emphasis is placed on concern for the welfare of others within the school community and when they arrive at BCS, students are immediately given a 'boarding buddy' to show them how things work.

Our students come from a diverse range of cultures; something in which we celebrate and champion within the boarding community, frequently offering opportunities for students to discover, learn and embrace the world around us. As in all areas of the school, our boarding provision is underpinned by a strong pastoral support system, ensuring students always feel valued, listened to and fully supported.



Girls' Boarding

The Girls' Boarding House is located on the upper floor of the main school's historic building. The rooms are modern and comfortable, well equipped and homely, at the centre of it all is the Lodge House atrium - the true heartbeat of the house.





Boys' Boarding

The Boys' Boarding house is located right next to the BCS Sports Hall on the school campus, with the bedrooms wrapping around over two floors. The rooms are modern, comfortable, well-equipped and homely.

Education with Character

'Education with character' - an ethos which underpins not just what and how subjects are taught inside the classroom; but what opportunities and experiences are available outside of the classroom to ensure our pupils experience fulfilling, all-round learning to enhance their personal growth and development.





Co-Curricular

Our extensive holistic education and co-curricular programme allows for the four Cs of Curiosity, Creativity, Commitment and Community to develop in every pupil.
