HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE NORTH GEORGIA ANNUAL CONFERENCE 2025

The North Georgia Annual Conference of The United Methodist Church is a yearly gathering where clergy and lay representatives from across the conference come together to worship, make decisions, and celebrate ministry. It serves as both a time of spiritual renewal and a space for shaping the future of the church's work in the region.

The conference convened in Athens, Georgia, June 12-14, 2025 under the theme "Come, FollowMe," inspired by Matthew 4:19–20. Notable highlights included the celebration of Camp Glisson's 100th anniversary, increased youth participation with 70 youth delegates, and the adoption of two impactful resolutions—one on immigration and another on justice for people with disabilities. Financially, the 2026 budget was approved with a 5% reduction, reflecting strong fiscal stewardship as churches paid nearly 93% of apportionments in 2024.

The conference also introduced a new LGBTQ Advocacy Representative role and launched a task force to examine clergy salary equity. Through worship, legislation, and recognition of leadership transitions, the 2025 Annual Conference emphasized inclusion, innovation, and faithful discipleship. Pastor's Corner



Praise Yahweh! We've made it through more than half of 2025. In a world that constantly shifts, we must remember: God is in control of time, of history, of us. Though we measure time with clocks and calendars, God transcends them all. As Christians, and especially as United Methodists, we follow the liturgical calendar to anchor our lives in the story of Jesus Christ. Seasons like Advent remind us of His first coming and prepare us for His return.

The Monday after Pentecost marks the beginning of the second stretch of Ordinary Time—the longest season of the church year, running until Advent. Though the word "ordinary" may suggest something dull or insignificant, in the Christian calendar, it's anything but. This season invites us to grow in faith, reflect on Jesus' teachings, and live out our discipleship in the rhythms of daily life. Ordinary Time spans two periods: from the Baptism of the Lord in January to the start of Lent, and from Pentecost to the start of Advent. The name comes from the Latin *ordinalis*, meaning "numbered"—as in the Second, Third, or Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time. These numbered days are sacred opportunities for steady spiritual growth.

When we think of Jesus, we often picture the miraculous—walking on water, raising the dead, feeding thousands. But just as powerful is the truth that Jesus embraced the ordinary. Born in a small town, raised in a humble home, He worked with His hands, grew tired, wept, celebrated, and walked dusty roads. Isaiah 53:2 reminds us, "He had no beauty or majesty to attract us to him." He came not with crowns and armies, but with calloused hands and a heart big enough for the world. Yet in His ordinariness, He was extraordinary. He spoke with divine authority, loved with unmatched purity, forgave freely, and served selflessly. The One born in a stable now reigns at the right hand of the Father.

This is the mystery of our Savior: fully human, fully divine. He entered our everyday to invite us into eternity. So as we commute, cook, work, care, and pray, let's remember—Jesus is there too. In the mundane, He moves. In the simple, He speaks. Our ordinary days become holy ground when we walk them with Him. We are not regular. The King of the universe calls us. Let praise be ever on our lips and gratitude in our hearts—for we serve no ordinary God, but an extraordinary Jehovah.






Ministry Partnership Update


