





#### **Youth Achievement Honoree**

#### Kaden Balfour

Graduate, Suncoast High School, attending University of Chicago, ULPBC Student Representative for the National Urban League Youth Council, NAS Participant

As a senior this year at Suncoast High School, Kaden deeply resonates with the hope to address unequal and limited access to opportunities that youth face internationally. He began his involvement in community service in middle school by spending his Saturdays volunteering with his brother's UNICEF chapter. After seeing the issues like homelessness, poverty, and a lack of representation that plagued his local community, he committed himself to working to resolve these issues. This commitment, combined with his love for positively impacting and

improving the lives of those in need, has been reflected through activities he has subsequently pursued. He founded and lead the Suncoast UNICEF Chapter as President, with over 150 members dedicated to aiding children through service, fundraising, and advocacy locally and internationally. 


