It will feature a talk by Robert Wight, whose new book 'Inverleigh and Murgheboluc District Soldiers in the Great War,1914-1918, Individual Stories of Service and Sacrifice', will be launched on the day.

Rob is a WW1 buff with a passion for researching military history. He is a member of the Western Front Association and of the Inverleigh Historical Society. The 143 stories in this book are of WW1 soldiers from the Inverleigh and Murgheboluc districts. Their experiences are representative of the overall AIF experience. A summary of the war, the use of many contextual and personal images, and a clear engaging style make this book military and local history at its best.

There will be a display of WW1 memorabilia and uniforms organised by the Inverleigh RSL, time for questions, a delicious afternoon tea, and book signing and sales with cards and cash accepted. This free event is co-hosted by the Inverleigh Historical Society and the Inverleigh RSL Sub-branch.

An election is being held for Surf Coast Shire Council.

#### Check the mail for your ballot pack

Ballot packs containing voting material were mailed to enrolled voters from Monday 7 October.

This is a postal election only.

If you do not receive your ballot pack by Tuesday 15 October please visit vec.vic.gov.au to complete the online replacement form, or call 131 832 to arrange a replacement.

#### Candidates

Candidates who have nominated for election are listed in the ballot packs and at **vec.vic.gov.au** 

A photo and candidate statement will also be included if provided by candidates. Responses to a candidate questionnaire, if provided, are available at **vec.vic.gov.au** 

#### How to vote correctly

You must complete your ballot paper correctly for your vote to count. Put the number **1** in the box next to the candidate you want to see elected, then number all the other boxes in order of your choice. You must number **every box** and only use each number once.

#### How to return your ballot pack

Put your completed ballot paper in the ballot paper envelope, complete the declaration, then post it ASAP using the reply-paid envelope provided, or hand deliver it during election office hours to:

#### Voting is compulsory

Voting is compulsory for all voters who were enrolled at 4 pm on Wednesday 7 August. This includes state-enrolled and council-enrolled voters.

If you don't vote and don't have a valid excuse, you may be fined.

#### Your completed ballot pack must be in the mail or hand delivered by **6 pm Friday 25 October.**

# Shirley Leak is a local treasure

Shirley Leak is a local treasure.

I caught up with Shirley at the Historical Records Rooms in Hesse Street where she oversees the amazing collection of Winchelsea Football Club history which she instigated.

There are over 300 books/folders of year books, team sheets, committee meeting minutes and photo albums with records dating from 1895. And at her home she has boxes of local weekly Footy Records from game days!

Shirley was just 15 when she met her future husband Murray (1937-2014), then 17, at a dance in her home town of Deans Marsh where she supported the Deans Marsh Football team.

They married two years later in 1955 and she had to switch her allegiance to the Winchelsea team where Murray played from 1951 to 1969.

Their two sons Neil and Daryl played for The Blues too. Neil played 438 games and Daryl 306 with Winchelsea and Daryl also for Geelong Under 19s and Reserves in 1977-78.

In 1961 Shirley instigated the forming of a Ladies Committee to support the football club. They ran morning coffees, stalls, debutante balls and took on catering assignments.

The club had their 100<sup>th</sup> year anniversary in 1976. Shirley already had a collection of newspaper clippings by then and started collecting, copying and collating any data she could.

This became an obsession and pride that still continues today. She has taken many photos over the years and compiled club year books.

Some of the football club paperwork had been missing for 40 years. Winchelsea's Keith (Bruiser) Leorke (1928 – 2003) was the Secretary of Polwarth & District League. The new owners of his home found the records in the ceiling of the house where they had been put for safe keeping.

Shirley was also involved with the tennis and cricket clubs. She has been an avid and passionate support of the Winchelsea Football and Netball Club for over 50 years and as a true Blue is a worthy contender for a Life Membership.

So if you want to visit the Winchelsea Historic Centre and explore Shirley's amazing work the centre is open on Wednesdays from 1-4pm and Fridays from 10-3pm.

#### Helping families cover the cost of kids sport

The State Government is making sure more kids get the opportunity to play the sport they love, with another round of \$200 sport vouchers.

The next round of the Get Active Kids Voucher Program opens this week – helping eligible families cover the costs of sports memberships, registration fees, uniforms and equipment. Families can apply for vouchers of up to \$200 per child.

Almost 150,000 vouchers have been provided since 2020. More than half of the families say their kids would not have been able to participate in sports without the voucher.

From soccer to dance, there are more than 70 sports and 2,000 activity providers in the program, meaning kids across Victoria have the chance to take part in the sport and activities they love.

Families can apply for the vouchers online before redeeming them at an activity provider like a local sporting club.

The program is open to kids aged up to 18 named on a Commonwealth Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card, and named on a Medicare Card.

Special consideration is also available forchildren in care, temporary or provisional visa holders, migrants and international students.

#### New powerful laws address violence against women

Women will be further protected from family violence with stand-alone offences criminalising non-fatal strangulation coming into effect this weekend.

The Crimes Amendment (Non-fatal Strangulation) Act 2024, includes two new offences to crack down on perpetrators and help the justice system better identify and deal with an incredibly dangerous act of violence - often taken against women.

These laws, referred to as Joy's Law, would not be coming to effect without

the advocacy of the family of Joy Rowley whose life was cut short in her own home - where she should have been safe.

Research shows that victims of non-fatal strangulation are seven times more likely to be seriously injured or killed by their partner than other family violence victims.

Perpetrators who intentionally injure their victim will face up to ten years in jail ensuring there are serious consequences for this violent and intimidating behaviour.

The second offence, which carries a maximum five-year sentence, applies even when no injury has occurred. This ensures better protection for victims who

may not have visible injuries.

These laws will not apply when the nonfatal strangulation occurs in the context of sexual activity and consent is freely and wilfully given.

In May, the State Government announced further reforms with the Women's Safety Package which will include new initiatives to stop violence before it starts.

These changes will include changes to the service of Family Violence Intervention Orders so that protection can start sooner, putting a stop to perpetrators who deliberately avoid being served.



One of the big drawcards will be a kids' pasta recipe competition with a prize of \$400 for the winner's school and \$100 for the young cook. Primary school students across the region are busy submitting their favourite quick and easy stove-top recipes using Otway Pasta Company Pasta.

"Bonus points will be given to recipes with fresh Otways produce," says Steve Robinson, owner and chief pasta maker at Otway Pasta Company. "I'll be cooking the winning recipe on the festival stage. I can't wait to see what our young cooks come up with."

The \$2 entry fee includes an animal nursery and farm-themed face painting for the kids, plus maker demonstrations and an informative line-up of speakers on the festival stage.

Mr Dennis says the volunteers behind the Otway Harvest Trail want the festival to build community connections and remind locals of the world-class food, drink and fibre in their own back yard. He says the stallholders would include winemakers, distillers, brewers and makers of ice cream, cheese, pasta, preserves and other tasty treats.

"We'll have Timboon Fine Ice Cream churning fresh ice cream to taste, and Schulz Organic Dairy will be hand-churning butter," Mr Dennis explains. "In the activity tent, you can learn how to grow veggies and take home your own seedling.

"We're lucky to live in such a productive region with good soil, rain and some seriously hard-working people on the land. Our region is home much-loved big brands like Bulla, Western Star





and Australian Lamb, and this festival is a way to remind locals that smaller scale operators add so much depth and flavour to the place we call home."

Local makers and growers will be interviewed on the festival stage by Colac-born food journalist and broadcaster Wendy Hargreaves (nee Busfield), who will find out the stories behind the produce and dive into topics ranging from how we farm through to future job prospects.

"There are so many delicious places to explore in the Otways," says Mrs Hargreaves. "Every time I come home to Colac, there's something new to discover."

# **Winchelsea Op Shop Rebuild Appeal** Update

### Multi-agency exercise focuses on emergency relief for communities isolated by bush fire

#### Surf Coast Shire

A major regional exercise hosted by Surf Coast Shire Council has focused on providing emergency relief for Great Ocean Road communities potentially isolated by bushfire.

The planning exercise at Aireys Inlet Community Centre drew together input from multiple organisations, looking at ways to best identify and deliver relief needs in an emergency.

It was staged as property owners and occupants are being encouraged to undertake spring clean-up and fuel reduction work across Surf Coast Shire in preparation for the bushfire season.

Fire authorities are warning of potential for an early start to the fire season following dry winter and autumn.

The multi-agency emergency relief exercise focused on a Great Ocean Road community being isolated at noon on an extreme fire danger day in late January, with fire outbreaks forcing road closures.

The exercise involved organisations including Surf Coast, Colac Otway and Corangamite shire councils, Country Fire Authority, Department of Energy, Environment and Climate Action, Ambulance Victoria, Victoria Police, State Emergency Service, Department of Families Fairness and Housing, Emergency Recovery Victoria, Red Cross, Salvation Army and utility providers.

"This important exercise looked at critical actions which need to take place during the first 12, 24 and 48 hours, from outside and within the isolated community," Surf Coast Shire Council Chief Executive Officer Robyn Seymour said. "Principal objectives included working on how to identify and deliver relief needs, understanding a governance structure and ensuring all agencies are using the same terminology.

"Providing emergency relief in these situations is challenging and complex. Having agencies come together to work through scenarios in advance can be vital in helping many cogs work together when crisis arrives."

Emergency Recovery Victoria Regional Recovery Director Angela Carey said: "Recovery needs to be swift and effective after an emergency. Planning exercises are essential to make sure all partners in emergencies are in the best possible position to anticipate and respond to the needs of community after a major emergency.

"Victoria's emergency management sector is well prepared for the season ahead, but being fire-ready is a shared responsibility. We all have a responsibility to understand the risk, have a fire plan in place and keep up-to-date with warnings on the VicEmergency App and website."

The exercise provided a reminder that residents living in areas of fire risk should continue to undertake fuel reduction work, and that having well-prepared and practised fire plans are crucial to protecting properties and lives.

### Free public transport for Victoria's carers

Victorian Carer Card holders will be able to enjoy free public transport for seven days during National Carers Week from the State Government.

Minister for Carers and Volunteers Ros Spence encouraged Victoria's dedicated carers to take advantage of free travel on trams, buses and trains throughout Victoria from Sunday, 13 October through to Saturday, 19 October.

Victorian Carer Card holders will be able to explore metro Melbourne and regional Victoria free of charge. This will help carers get to celebratory events for carers throughout National Carers Week and connect with family and friends.

Carer Card holders can use their carer myki card to touch on and off as usual, with no charges during this period. Carers will need to carry their Victorian Carer Card or a Centrelink Pensioner Concession Card on public transport.

More than 750,000 Victorian unpaid carers provide care and assistance to a family member or friend with support needs due to disability, chronic illness, or older age.

National Carers Week runs from 13 to19 October 2024 and is an important opportunity to recognise and celebrate carers of all ages and backgrounds, acknowledging the vital role they play in our community.

#### **Grants to support Victoria's carers**

The State Government is helping Victoria's unpaid carers create social connections and improve their work and study opportunities with funding for activities across Victoria.

Minister for Carers and Volunteers Ros Spence announced the recipients of the 2024 Connecting Carers in their Community program grants at an event celebrating National Carers Week.

The program provides grants of between \$15,000 and \$25,000 to grassroots and community groups for activities that help carers with social connection, wellbeing and achieving their personal goals – especially in relation to work readiness and employment.

Many carers provide care around the clock, making it difficult for them to access the support they need to look after themselves, engage in work and study or connect with others in their community.

Grants have been provided for more than 40 projects across Victoria, supported by an investment of \$900,000 from the State Government, with just over half the grant recipients based in regional and rural areas. Latin Stories Australia will receive a grant to expand its delivery of online and in-person workshops that connect Latin American and Spaniard carers with their peers, provide tools to maintain their wellbeing and help them advance their personal goals including career advancement. Kirrae Health Service will be supported to create a local support group for First Nations carers in regional Victoria, helping them form lasting social and supportive connections, to combat social isolation and foster cultural connection.

Nourish to Flourish in Colac will provide educational sessions and self-care activities for people caring for a loved one with an eating disorder, aiming to reduce social isolation and upskilling carers to become advocates for themselves and loved ones.

### Free Camping!

The \$9 million investment will ensure all campers have free access to every campground across the state – including the popular Tidal River in Wilson's Promontory, where fees are currently \$40.70 a night.

As part of this investment, \$1.7 million will go towards additional maintenance, repairs and operating costs to ensure campgrounds are kept clean and safe for all to enjoy.

It builds on the State Government's half-price camping initiative that's been in place since 2019 and saved campers a staggering \$25.7 million.

Families who have already booked and paid to go camping won't miss out. Existing bookings for the summer will be honoured and refunded.

More than 50 million people visit Victoria's iconic state forests and national parks a year, for camping, hiking, fishing and hunting, four-wheel driving, trail bike riding, horse riding, birdwatching and much more.

The State Government has delivered 31 new and 60 upgraded campgrounds, as well as 155 upgraded four-wheel drive tracks and 16 walking tracks totalling 31 kilometres.

Camping and recreation contributes more than \$2.1 billion a year to the Victorian economy and supports 20,000 jobs – most in regional communities.

The first known licence holder was John Highett in 1837. His partner was William Harding and the licence covered about 22,000 acres.

The next holder was Henry Hopkins, a merchant from Hobart Town in 1851 and then John R Hopkins in 1854. He took over the Hesse Plains run, by now known as Murdeduke Station. Murdeduke was derived from Murdi-duc, being Arboriginal for 'muddy water'. Tenders were called for the erection of a residence for Mr Arthur Hopkins.

After the demise of Arthur in 1882 it was managed by his son-in-law William Austin. William was the son of

Thomas Austin. In 1886 the homestead and 13,000 acres were purchased by Mr. Peter McIntyre. After his death the property Mountside passed to his son Charles and Murdeduke to his other son Andrew. In 1938 the homestead and 4,500 acres were purchased by James Wilson.

The earliest building of which any records exist is the structure that William Harding and sister Elizabeth resided in before her marriage to Thomas Austin in 1845.

In 1875 the house was dismantled and the present homestead of over 20 rooms was erected for Arthur Hopkins in picturesque Gothic style. The bluestone was drawn from the estate.

The Climate Report Judy Cameron

#### Fear

When It Helps, When It Hurts Bill McKibben from The Crucial Years (*Reproduced with permission*)

We've spent some time in recent years worrying that there was too much fear-mongering and doom-saying in the way we talked about climate change—that it was wearing people out. And indeed there's truth there—if we're going to do what we must, the story in the years ahead needs to be as much about the adventure of turning our planet solar as the dread that we'll turn our planet Venus.

But there are important moments when fear is a crucial resource. A week ago, in the wake of Helene, the veteran climate activist and North Carolina native Anna Jane Joyner wrote this dispatch from New York's "Climate Week"

There were fancy parties, cheerful sun imagery and giant signs reading "HOPE." The dominant theme was: We can solve this! We need to tell hopeful climate stories! But there's no "solving" a hurricane wiping out western North Carolina, hundreds of miles from the sea. Only focusing on optimism is like telling a cancer patient that everything will be OK if they just stay positive. At best, it comes across as out of touch; at worst, it feels callous. Yes, we can still prevent the worst impacts and must demand our governments scale solutions and act urgently, but we cannot minimize the horrors unfolding now, or that it will get worse in the coming years.

And yesterday, on air, the veteran Florida weatherman John Morales let his fear show through. As Cara Buckley recounted in t he Times, "It's just an incredible, incredible, incredible hurricane," Mr. Morales said of Milton, closing his eyes and slightly shaking his head. "It has dropped. ...."

His voice faltered. He looked down, drew a shaky breath and continued, "... it has dropped 50 millibars in 10 hours." For viewers who didn't understand the staggering implications of this barometric plunge, Mr. Morales's choked delivery said enough. "I apologize," he said in a quavering voice. "This is just horrific."

This kind of fear is entirely useful-there are, I have no doubt, people who left their homes and drove north towards Georgia after hearing the break in Morales' voice. He saved lives. And he did it entirely honestly. "You know what's driving that," he said to viewers. "I don't need to tell you. Global warming. Climate change." It's honest fear, driven by deep understanding. As Morales wrote in an essay in the Bulletin of Atomic Scientists last year

"As the temperature of the planet increases, my confidence in forecasting storm intensity is decreasing... Today I am no longer as comfortable in putting everyone at ease in regard to the strength of a storm. I am afraid of rapid intensification cycles happening at the drop of a hat."

The fear of a planet where the old rules no longer hold is the ultimate fear—because then how do you even think about the future? And that's as true as politics as it is in meteorology. The deep fear that wakes me up at night has only partly to do with the weather; it's the political fronts.....

### Australia's largest wind farm golden for Victorians

#### Victorian State Government

The largest wind farm in the Southern Hemisphere has begun feeding into Victoria's electricity grid, powering Victorian homes and businesses with cheap and reliable renewable energy.

Minister for Energy and Resources Lily D'Ambrosio announced the powering up of the Golden Plains Wind Farm at Rokewood, which will be able to power 765,000 homes – or every home in regional Victoria – when fully operational.

Once complete, the 1.3 gigawatt (GW) wind farm will produce more than 4,000 gigawatt hours (GWh) of energy each year and meet 9 per cent of Victoria's current energy demand. This will be supported by

a 300 megawatt (MW) battery on site, that will soak up any excess energy and export it back to the grid when it is needed most.

The Golden Plains Wind Farm created 700 jobs during construction and will generate up to 70 full time ongoing jobs.

Because of our record investments in renewable energy, Victoria has consistently had the lowest wholesale energy prices in the national market. Meeting Victoria's renewable energy generation and energy storage targets will deliver \$9.5 billion in economic activity and 59,000 jobs.

# Protecting Deen Maar Island 'Rabbits Gone!'

#### DEECA

A project to eradicate rabbits from Deen Maar Island, a cultural and environmentally significant site in southwest Victoria, is looking positive.

Penguins and sea birds are reclaiming sites previously overrun with rabbit warrens and using the empty holes as nest sites.

The small island, known on some maps as Lady Julia Percy Island, is located approximately 20 kilometres south-west of Port Fairy and is known to the Eastern Maar and Gunditjmara traditional owners as Deen Maar.

The island is home to one of Victoria's largest breeding colonies of Australian Fur Seals, and western Victoria's most important seabird breeding sites, hosting hort-tailed Shearwaters, Little Penguins, Fairy Prions and Common Diving Petrels.

European rabbits were first introduced in the mid-1800's to provide a food source for potential shipwreck survivors.

Rabbit digging can seriously impact the cultural values of the

island. They have also had a negative impact on the nesting habitat for ground-nesting seabirds by altering vegetation cover and causing widespread erosion as they forage and burrow.

Eliminating the rabbits will improve habitat for seabird species nesting on the island, improve their long-term breeding success, and enhance seabird species' resilience.

The project occurred in phases, including release of calicivirus, aerial baiting, and monitoring and eradication trips.

To officially declare the island rabbit free, two years of monitoring commenced in December 2023. If no rabbits are found during these two years, the island will be declared rabbit-free.

The most recent monitoring trip in mid-September found no signs of rabbits.

The Deen Maar Island Rabbit Eradication Project is led by DEECA in partnership with Eastern Maar Aboriginal Corporation, Gunditj Mirring Traditional Owner Aboriginal Corporation and Parks Victoria.




