

ABOUT ME

Ms. Gabrielle Benot was born in Latvia, at the time Soviet Union used to be called USSR. Freedom of expression was not particularly encouraged during this era, but that did not prevent the talents and rebellious spirit of young artists like Gabrielle from finding creative outlets. Gabrielle began sketching from the age of 5, drawing and sculpting under the encouragement of her grandfather, who was himself a self-taught painter.

After the fall of the iron curtain, Gabrielle moved to Denmark with her family and became exposed to European culture of the West. She continued to expand her talents, going on to study at the Margrethe Skolen, Royal Fashion Academy in Copenhagen. Gabrielle embodied her style while studying portraiture with Jeffrey Watts, while being inspired by such artists such as Lee Krasner, Joan Mitchell, Joan Brown and Jean Paul Riopelle.

Gabrielle's style reflects the intensity of her inner fire, through a broad use of particularity vivid colors, embellishments, textured details and semi-precious stones. While painting, Gabrielle layers her pieces passionately with sweeping implements and small details, conducting colorful and intense masterpieces on both traditional canvas and exotic mediums such as metal, glass, resin and whatever else she can find to beautify.

Gabrielle is inspired by a multitude of experiences and encounters. Travel, literature, film, fashion and animals are some of her greatest resources to draw on. When combined in a multi-layered, multi-media approach, these impressions are captured in her unique technique she calls Guscio. This technique involves using both wet and dry brushes, palette knives, oil pastels, charcoal, acrylic, resin and a host of shiny accessories mixed into textured pastes and layers of depth.

Gabrielle uses her technique to experiment abstract forms and figurative art styles, creating fresh, diverse, sensual and emotionally expressive art.

Gabrielle once said in an interview "My works are heavily textured that also add a tactile dimension, like a 3D element to an overall experience. When I paint, it is as if I am gazing at the night sky, seeing layers of the heavenly stars shiping through the depths of my work."

Sketching horses became one of my favorite things to do, because they became alive to me as I was sketching them. Each one developed a relationship with me, as if it were a part of my own family.

This led me to develop my artistic talents in which drawing, and painting became a central component of my life, first in design school and later as I became a professional artist. Although I have created my style around dynamic subjects such as fashion, animals and people, one of my favorite subjects remains this beautiful animal. I have been fortunate to capture the spirit of some of the most successful Thoroughbreds, and have created a strong following amongst the equestrian community.

I especially relate to those wild horses that roam the deserts of Northern Nevada. On one road trip I was fortunate to have seen a herd galloping through the dessert. Watching them I saw myself living a life of freedom and happiness, roaming the wild in search of the next adventure. This feeling lives with me and is transformed to art with each and every equine painting I create. A feeling I owe to this magnificent animal, and my grandfather who taught me to go beyond the boundaries.

Loneliness


