




Joy Scouts






New Faces in Preschool

Volunteer Opportunity: Anderson House Craft Night



OUR COMMUNITY IMPACT

Mission Disbursements 2023

During our September meeting, the Mission team went through their disbursements for the year, with an increase of funds (compared to last year) serving national /international organizations. The mission team discussed how there are more national and international disasters happening and wanted to support the organizations who are serving those areas (i.e. Maui). Of all the disbursements distributed, 63% went towards local organizations (Anderson House, Bible Club Ministries - Philly, Camp Johnsonborg, CASA, City Relief, Clinton Fire Department, Clinton Rescue Squad, Family Promise, Flemington Food Pantry, Friendship Center for New Beginnings, Good News Home for Women, Grow-A-Row, Market Street Mission, Meals on Wheels, Open Cupboard Food Pantry, and Safein Hunterdon) and 37% went towards national / international organizations (All Hands, Presbyterian Disaster Assistance, Red Cross, Salvation Army, and Samaritan'sPurse).
