Located in the rolling hills of New Gloucester, Maine, Pineland Farms is a working farm, diverse business campus and educational and recreational venue that welcomes visitors to enjoy its beautiful rural landscape.

Pineland Farms' mission is to enrich Maine's communities by offering immersive educational opportunities related to agriculture and the natural environment, providing time and space for artists and students to develop their creativity, and encouraging a healthy lifestyle through recreation and the outdoors.

HISTORY

Originally opened by the state in 1908, it was first known as the Maine School for the Feeble Minded. Maine opened the school for developmentally disabled, although its population also included mentally ill, poor, destitute, troubled persons and other wards of the state. Many residents worked at Valley and Hill Farms providing food for the campus as well as learning various trades.



By mid-century the population at the school swelled to nearly 1,500, but at this time, states were beginning to view developmental disabilities as more of a medical issue. Under this new philosophy, the farms were closed down and larger hospitals and dormitories were built. In the late 1970's initiatives were established to protect the affected residents. By 1996, the state closed the school and its last residents moved out.

In 2000, the state sold the school's campus buildings and adjacent farmlands to the Libra Foundation. Pineland Farms reopened to the public as a working farm, business campus, and much more. We invite you to learn more about our history and present day use by visiting our farms & facilities.

4 FAMILY FARMYARD

Come visit with our animals, learn about the different types of livestock and explore the vital role of farming. The large barn is the Education Barn which includes an interactive classroom and is home to our year-round farm animals. The small barn is the chicken coop where our egg-laying hens live. The farmyard also includes our Sugar House, educational gardens, and ample outdoor play space.

5 CORN MAZE & PUMPKIN PATCH

Experience the magic of fall at Pineland Farms! Our corn maze and pumpkin patch offer a fun, family-friendly way to celebrate the season, explore the farm, and enjoy the crisp autumn air. Whether you're navigating our corn maze, picking the perfect pumpkin, or simply soaking in the beauty of autumn in Maine, this seasonal experience is one you won't want to miss.

While our corn maze and pumpkin patch are typically **open seasonally from August through October** each year, be sure to check back each season for new details and upcoming events!

6 HISTORICAL MALAGA ISLAND WALK

We encourage you to learn about Pineland's past, as it is inextricably linked to the history of Maine and the United States. Take a walk to the Malaga Island Memorial and learn the history along the way.

Parking is available near the greenhouse. Follow the signs to the Malaga Memorial.

7 NATIVE TREE WALK

Test your tree ID skills! How many trees can you identify? Study the bark texture and leaf patterns. What clues give it away? Flip each plaque to find the answer. Scan the QR code for a link to information about each tree.

8 GARDENS & GROUNDS

The one-acre perennial, herb and vegetable garden at Pineland Farms is a wonderful place to stroll along a quarter-mile of paved walkways, picnic on the lawn in the shade of the apple tree allee and enjoy the fragrant air. During the month of May, immerse yourself in the scent of 34 lilac varieties. Located just past the Garden on Freeport Rd. For the rest of the growing season enjoy the landscaped beds on the great lawn, filled with thousands of tulips in spring and annual displays throughout the summer. Many trees and shrubs are labeled making your visit an enriching horticultural experience.

9 EQUESTRIAN CENTER

The Equestrian Center is a state-of-the-art facility home to Cabot Morgans, a nationally-known Morgan breeding operation, and to the National Museum of the Morgan Horse. Horse and livestock shows and other special events are hosted here throughout the year. Open by appointment only. Call 207-831-4989 for more information.
