# The Comfort of Distant Stars

#### A moving sensibility suffuses this highly original debut that draws from quantum physics and Igbo cosmology

Meet Ezeani Kobidi, an adored but sickly child living in a Nigerian village with his mother and siblings while his father is away at graduate school in the US. Young Ezeani is a precocious boy who grows into a brilliant but troubled theoretical physicist. His constant companion is Anyanwu, the Igbo Sun God, a sometimes malevolent, always insistent presence whose desperation to continue existing will have a devastating impact on Ezeani's life.

The Comfort of Distant Stars is a sometimes funny, often poignant, cerebral book, full of beautiful observations on the nature of time and existence and an intricate examination of how we understand our place in the universe. Drawing from modern theoretical physics and ancient Igbo cosmology, the narrative's tender storytelling never loses focus on the primacy of relationships in defining and nurturing a human life. In the end, it's a story of what it means to be human, the interdependence of belief and being and the fragility of mental states in times of dynamic change.

I.O. Echeruo's debut story collection, Expert in All Styles, was published by Nigerian publisher Farafina and his short fiction has appeared in *Transition* and *Eclectica* magazines. He spends his time between Lagos, Nigeria and Accra, Ghana.


#### This is Anna's story.





## Your Life Without Me

Mr Burman is feeling unmoored. Still reckoning with the death of his wife Ada and struggling to cope with his hostile daughter Leila, he finds himself on a train to London at the invitation of the Metropolitan Police.

In 2020, To Calais, In Ordinary Time was shortlisted for the Walter Scott Prize for Historical Fiction and longlisted for the Orwell Prize for Political Fiction.
