### THE LANDSCAPE



Depression affects an estimated 26% of adults with autism. <u>6</u>



Adults with disabilities experience higher levels of mental health conditions and substance use than do adults without disabilities. 2

In a recent survey from 2021, adults with disabilities were three times more likely to report suicidal ideation in the past month compared to persons without disabilities (30.6% versus 8.3% in the general U.S. population) 5





20 to 30% of male adults on the spectrum have anxiety disorder. Females with autism average 40%. 3

Compared to the general public, people with autism are seven times more likely to be chronically lonely and six times more likely to have low life satisfaction. 4



Over 35% of DDS autism cases are individuals transitioning out of the school system leaving adults with little social, emotional or vocational support. 1



## EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OVERVIEW

DCA revenue has progressively grown, and will exponentially increase in 2023. Contributions have sustained expenses to this point. 2023 will see less reliance on contributions and more sustainable programmatic revenue.



## PARTNERSHIPS CREATE SHARED VALUE

Placing the necessity of partnerships directly within DCA's strategic business model sparks limitless possibilities for innovation and mutual growth that can only be fully measured once these relationships begin. Implementing a shared value approach shifts the mindset of operational strategies. A co-creation occurs when we each view our success as a network of social actors, with unique resources that support each other.

New partnership collaborations begin as interest and need arises. The success of our model begins with a track of 12 participants, 12 hours a week. This streamlined approach allows versatility that meets participant and partnership variables, and allows ease to implement our model. DCA recognizes the unique needs of each community and is able to respond mindfully to scale the model as appropriate.

#### REACHING SUSTAINABILITY

DCA tracks are offerings delivered in partnership with an arts, education or social organization. Layering of tracks will grow our revenues and increase our profit margins. At the same time, we will develop efficient infrastructure to deliver the same level of service in a replicable model.
