

THE IRISH ARE COMING!

Question:

What do Milwaukee, Wisconsin and Ocean Shores, Washington have in common?

Answer:

Not much except these two cities host the two largest Irish Music Festivals in America!



An Irish invasion is headed to our shores in October!

The **Galway Bay Celtic Music Feis** will kick off Monday, Oct. 14, at a special dinner at the 8th Street Ale House in Hoquiam. The feis (which means "festival" in Irish), will rage on until Sunday, Oct. 20, with performances and events at the 8th Street Ale House, as well as the Ocean Shores Convention Center and the Galway Bay Irish Pub in Ocean Shores.

Performers come to the Washington Coast from all over the world to sing, play and dance to Celtic-inspired music, drawing crowds large enough to rank this as one of the top two Irish music festivals in the United States. This year, there is even a headliner group, **O'Jizo**, hailing from Japan.

Other headliners at this, the 16th annual feis, include the **Celtic Tenors**, **Seven Nations**, **Doolin**, and **Daimh**. The multiple stages will feature Irish balladeers, folk

singers and dancers. In addition, attendees are invited to take part in workshops in all things Irish, including bagpiping, fiddling and Irish dance.

Of course no festival would be complete without great food, and this one is known for its cultural offerings – from Irish stew to soda bread, washed down with a pint or two. A shuttle service is available to safely transport festival goers between venues.

The Celtic Music Feis was created in 2004 by William "Liam" Gibbons on a much smaller scale. He believed that many people loved Irish music and culture as much as he did and that the area could attract and support such an event. He

also thought it would bring in revenue and jobs to the community during the lag time after summer's busy tourist season.

The festival's growing popularity, however, surprised even Gibbons. So in 2011, he brought in a partner. Now Christopher Doyle manages the Feis and their three restaurants, while Gibbons says he's simply "just the maintenance man."

Tickets for the Galway Bay Celtic Music Feis can be purchased in advance at www.celticmusicfeis.com. In addition, the website includes the performance schedule and directions to the three venues.

MUSIC

Long gone are the days of being awoken by the generic and unpleasant ring or buzz of

an alarm clock. We've transitioned from simply plugging in a clock, setting the time and switching the alarm to the "on" position, to choosing from dozens of alarm tones on our phones. A tremendous amount of thought is put into this task these days. The tone can't be too quiet, too startling, too soothing or too much like any other sound we've already programmed our phone to play for any given function or notification. At the end of the day, no matter the sound we so carefully choose, it all becomes an aggravating cacophony in the morning after a night of tossing and turning or lying in bed waiting to fall asleep.

Sleep difficulty is one of the most common medical complaints in our country. Over 50 million adults suffer from insomnia. Sleep is our body's chance to recover from our busy, eventful days. Without this opportunity to process and "reset," quality of life suffers. It begins to have a negative impact on our

physical as well as mental health. There is an important relationship between insomnia and negative health effects such as depression, anxiety, substance abuse, decreased immune function, cardiovascular disease, chronic pain, gastrointestinal complaints and urinary problems.

In the medical world, there are two general paths to treating insomnia: behavioral intervention and medication. Behavioral interventions result in better long-term management of chronic insomnia, while medications may help in the short term, but may stop working due to a developed tolerance and have the potential for unwanted side effects. Too often in our fast-paced society we reach for medications in an attempt to effortlessly slip into a good night's sleep. However there are other methods that may be effortless and also beneficial for our health rather than posing risk.

Music therapy and the impact it has on various medical conditions is becoming

more understood. Studies have shown that music is a useful intervention for helping improve sleep quality. Not only is music therapy effective, but also comes without the risk of unwanted side effects that medications may have. Studies on music therapy and insomnia suggest that music distracts us from stressful thoughts and decreases stress hormone levels while increasing relaxation hormones, such as oxytocin, in our bodies. Music has also been shown to decrease the "fight or flight" arousal of the autonomic nervous system, which allows us to relax. (Jespersen KV, Koenig J, Jennum P, Vuust P. Music for insomnia in adults (Review). Cochrane Database of Systematic Reviews. 2015; Issue 8.)

For those of you struggling with chronic or even occasional insomnia, I challenge you to explore the impact music may have on your level of relaxation and ability to sleep by experimenting with different genres of music as part of your sleep hygiene routine. Remember that an important part of sleep hygiene is to avoid any type of screen use and anything stimulating, including exercise, one to two hours before bedtime.

With a calm mind you will find more regenerative sleep and wake up refreshed and ready to conquer your day!

etting a glimpse inside the working studios of Grays Harbor artists produced such a powerful pull for the public last fall that the inaugural Art Drives Open Studio Tour has staged an encore this year.

"For our first year it was successful beyond our wildest imagination," said Mery Swanson, the project's director and a watercolor painter. "We hope to make it an annual event."

This year's Art Drives is scheduled for the first two weekends in October: Saturday, Oct. 5; Sunday, Oct. 6; Saturday, Oct. 12; Sunday, Oct. 13 and Monday, Oct. 13 (Columbus Day).

From 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. on these days, more than 30 area artists invite the public to observe them creating in their own studios. In addition, the attendees to this free event can ask the artists questions, peruse individual collections and even purchase locally created art on the spot.

"In 2018 we had more than 500 individual visits during the five-day

event with people coming from all over the U.S., which was just amazing results for us," Swanson said. "We're expecting even more this year."

Like last year, each artist will also have a piece of their artwork displayed at a "pop-up" gallery during the five days. This year the pop-up gallery will emerge at the Shoppes at Riverside mall in South Aberdeen at 1017 South Boone St., Suite #050, near the Sears store. The public is also invited to the gallery for an opening reception from 4 to 7 p.m. Friday, Oct. 4, to meet the artists, organizers and sponsors, as well as view the vast variety of art.

In addition to displaying a sample of each artist's work – including sculptures, ceramics, photography, jewelry and acrylic, watercolor and oil paintings – the pop-up gallery is a place to obtain the catalog of artists, which includes

the map and addresses of each studio, allowing attendees to plan their individualized art drives by interest and location.

The catalog containing the maps is also available at artist galleries and area hotels and motels, as well as at each branch of Timberland Bank. The City of Aberdeen, the City of Westport, Grays

Debra Norton, a Montesano oil painter who specializes in landscape, still life and portraits, said she enjoyed opening her studio last year and is eager to participate again this October.

"My 800-square-foot studio has wood floors, two skylights and a northern exposure, which means that most of the time I paint in natural light. It's big enough that I can teach private students including small group workshops and classes," Norton said.

Last year not only did she display her own in-progress work, but also that of several of her students.

"Everyone loved my studio," Norton said. "People enjoyed watching me work on a still life of heirloom pumpkins. They liked talking about art they might do or art that someone else that they know is doing.

"It seemed like the visitors were in three main groups: artists, art collectors and just people who saw the signs and dropped in," Norton observed. She small group classes.

"It was really fun and good for me," Inman said. "People who came were specifically interested in what I do and I sold quite a few pieces. A lot of people collect baskets. One artist from Olympia walked in and immediately spied a

sculpture that I had created with dried kelp and pine needle coils and said, 'This is what I want!'"

Of the some 50 people who came to visit Inman's studio over the two weekends, many had technical questions about the materials and techniques she uses.

"I hope to have even more things available this year – at least three sculptures, some ceramic masks and some wooden bowls along with the baskets," she said.

"I think a lot of people don't realize that there is as large an artist colony as there is here," Inman said. Norton and Swanson agreed.

"Creativity is one of the basic skills of life," said Swanson. "I don't think we could live on this earth without creating something and some of us are just wild about it."

"Most of us who do art stuff, we just can't help ourselves," she added. "It's like gardening. These are all creative skills. It's a human instinct and people recognize it when they see it. I think everyone responds to it."



There are many places along
Washington's Pacific shores to sip and
savor the bean (especially during a
winter storm), but here are just a few of
the many I've tried and find to be really,
really good—a notch above the rest.
Since coffee is an experience for me,
I have only included those places on
the coast that meet these five criteria:

- 1. They must have their own roast of coffee.
- 2. They must have great, friendly service.
- 3. They must have an attractive, inviting setting (no drive-up coffee stands listed).
- 4. They must have reliable Wi-Fi.
- 5. And, of course, the coffee must taste heavenly.

Scoops Ice Cream and Espresso in Westport is one of two locales that serve Grays Harbor Coffee Company's roasts. There's also an Aberdeen Scoops inside a beautifully restored circa 1950s gas station on Highway 101 (Heron Street). They also have really yummy locally made donuts at both locations.

Tinderbox Coffee Roasters is in Aberdeen, the PNW's coastal music city. The place is a tad cavernous and can be noisy (they often host music on Wednesdays and Saturdays), but everything else is on the mark. The friendly, skilled baristas and a wide variety of tasty blends (both coffee and teas) as well as pastries baked next door at CakeCakes make this a social hub for downtown.









Ocean Beach Roasters in Oceans Shores is closer to the beach than any other in the area. Their cozy indoor (with a fireplace) and outdoor seating (with a fire pit) and a loft, all apportioned with quality furnishings, make this a relaxing place to work or meet-up. They serve dinner Thursday through Saturday evenings and delightful deli and in-house baked goods for breakfast and lunch.

Honorable Mentions (that meet all the criteria except for their own roast of coffee, though they still have an excellent supplier): **The Jitter House** in Hoquiam (serves **Batdorf & Bronson** out of Olympia), and **All Wrapped Up** in Montesano (serves **Tinderbox**).



Gregory Zschomler has sampled coffee from shops across the U.S.A. from NYC (his favorite is there) to California, Florida and New Orleans (Chicory anyone?), across the Pacific Northwest, Hawaii and dozens of places in between. Many of them, which meet the five criteria, have been very good and rated highly, but, really, when it comes to the best coffee, he believes there's no place like home.





BLACK SHEPHERD CAPTURES COAST WITH HEAVY ROCK, BLUES

From dreams of a solo country music career to becoming the lead singer, guitarist and lyricist of a rising Grays Harbor heavy rock and blues band, Justin Kautzman, 30, has embarked on quite a musical odyssey. And, if the growing fan base is any indication, it looks like the journey is just beginning.

When Kautzman, a 2006 Ocosta High School graduate, put down his acoustic guitar and hooked up with Steve Markham and drummer Steve Stoken at the Westport V.F.W., the new reverberation and rebranding for "Black Shepherd" emerged.

"We threw down some sound behind his original stuff, gave it a rock beat, fast and hard hitting, giving it some body, which changed the whole sound," explained Markham, 60, also of Westport. Markham, a former Army band trumpeter originally from Bakersfield, Calif., handles the vocals on most of the band's cover songs, as well as deftly playing bass and trumpet.

"When people think of this area, they often think of music like Kurt Cobain played – loud and off kilter," Kautzman said. "That is the stereotype. But there are a lot of musicians on the Harbor now with a different sound. The music community is growing musically. People are coming out of the woodwork with it. It's not that Kurt Cobain was a bad dude, but he played a very specific style."

"I'd say our sound is heavy, but with enough soul that you still want to listen to it."

When Kautzman started the Black Shepherd label as a country artist, he owned a shepherd dog. However, because black is the color of heavy metal, it was easy to rebrand the name to imply, "leading you back to the land of rock," he said.

Beginning in 2016, the emerging group played an exhausting 170 gigs in two and a half years all up and down the Washington coast.

"As a three-piece band we started rolling into bars," Kautzman said. "We'd play for tips on a Thursday night and tell them, 'If you like us, you can book us for this weekend. We would know Thursday night whether we would have a show that weekend."

After a while, Stoken left the band. For some time, Kautzman and Markham relied on the depth of area drummers including Larry Cowles from This Way Out and Jeff Ramberg from Fat Chance Band. Then Michael Johnson, who had recorded Black Shepherd's demo the previous year, offered to keep the beat going and has been performing with the band since May.

Johnson has just finished his degree in music from The Evergreen State College in Olympia and works as a studio control and sound mixing engineer as well as performing in four other bands – playing guitar in three and drums in one.

"He's pretty much a musical genius," said Kautzman.

Kautzman, who recently completed his associate's degree in music at Grays Harbor College, will start GHC's elementary teaching program this fall with the goal of becoming an elementary music teacher by day.

His interest in music started when he began playing guitar in high school with

the intention of becoming a singing comedian. His early musical influences were 90s country music. "But once I learned of Rob Zombie and Blink-182, I got into hard rock and blues."

"Now I draw my influence between Zakk Wylde (Black Label Society) and blues guitarist, B.B. King – fast and heavy, but with the feeling of B.B. King," he said.

And if the band's July performance at the Small Town Throwdown 3 in Westport, is any indication, he's nailed it – his fingers furiously flying over the frets.

"I've worked hard to learn how to triple pick so we can pick our instruments together," said Markham, whose bugling and other music skills are also on demand throughout the county.

Markham started playing trumpet at 8,

tutored by his Uncle Don, who played with country great Merle Haggard as well as members of the Buck Owen's band, and even arranged music for the "Hee Haw" TV show.

As for Johnson, he spent most of his early years enjoying everything on the radio. "By 11 years old, I was so into Metallica. During the 90s I started to like more underground bands such as Nomeansno, Fugazi, Pixies, and Dinosaur Jr.
As of now, I truly can find something I like in all music."





Johnson started playing the guitar as a 10 year old. "My mother had a Takamine 12 string. I loved the way it sounded. I didn't start playing the drums seriously until about six years ago, but fell in love with them."

While most of their sets are original songs, "the audience loves covers. They know the lyrics and melody," Johnson said.

"If I could have it my way, I wouldn't play any covers unless they were renditions and not note for note. I like to take covers, flip them upside down and find if there's another way to convey the artist's original intent. My favorite is 'Old Time Rock-n-Roll' because the band punches the song and it always gets the crowd going."

As far as original music, Kautzman said he's the proudest of the song, "F---in' A."

"It is catchy and people sing along. You can look out from the stage and see people singing loudly and others covering their mouths in case anyone were to see them. Plus, it's a heavy rock song with a reggae break and a heavy metal trumpet solo."

While the band has backed off some from its busy schedule a bit so the members can focus on their personal lives and other projects, Black Shepherd is still booking gigs.

"We aim to play music for people and have a good time," Markham said.

"We are a few dudes who enjoy writing and playing music, and we like to do it loud and with energy for people who like the same," Kautzman said.
