LAUNCHPAD: THE STEPS TO SUCCESS



We are so thrilled to have played a part in launching our current class of 138 seniors off to their respective colleges and universities across 24 states this fall.

The LaunchPad team has already begun one-on-one

advising sessions with the next graduating class (2025).

Our focus is always on college essay writing. Still, before students can start to write, they must have a planned list of colleges they are applying to so we can help them map out the number of essays (the main essay and supplemental essays) to get a realistic idea of how much work is needed to create the writing portions of their application. If needed, the team will assist in the list-making process by guiding the student in their research.

Once colleges are identified, we help students work through the prompt choices and brainstorm ideas for the main essay. This can take many weeks and rewrites, sometimes changing topics completely, as students try to narrow down the exact stories they will tell. Students typically meet with us one-on-one during the first few weeks of the process and then send drafts for comments and feedback. We continuously read and respond to student drafts for as long as it takes them to produce engaging, multiple long and shorter standard essays. As we near the completion of the main essay, we stress the importance of the supplemental essays. These shorter essays, oftentimes only 150-200 words, are specific to the university they are applying to and therefore equally as important and difficult as the long essay. Every student is unique. Therefore, we tailor our services to meet the needs of each student.

Thanks to our community of donors, LaunchPad continues to be a free program available to all.
