If you are reading this program, you are a part of the game. It might be because you are participating in it in some way, as part of a team, the officiating crew, or the event staff. It might be because someone you love is participating as an athlete, coach, or contest official this week. It might be because you want to support your community or your alma mater. This behavior, that is posted, reposted, and shared on social media has all too often become the norm and it is up to every one of us to turn the tide.

In his book, *A Lifetime of Observations and Reflections On and Off the Court*, legendary basketball coach John Wooden wrote: “Some say I believe in old-fashioned traits: courtesy, politeness, and consideration. I do believe in these qualities, but they are not old-fashioned. They never go out of style – even when they seem to be increasingly scarce. I believe they are still common. We just see their opposites so much that we think that’s all there is. People like to help, to be polite, to be considerate. I believe it’s human nature. And it’s a funny thing: when you start displaying courtesy, politeness, and consideration, people start displaying then right back.”

The world of education-based athletics and athletics is an amazing laboratory for lifelong learning. It is not just in the academic classroom where we learn lessons and those lessons are not just reserved for student-athletes. This educational content extends to the stands of a game or event, wherein we all become teachers and simultaneously students. As fans of our classmates, family members, neighbors, schools, or communities, we should strive to get back to the old-fashioned traits Coach Wooden held in such high esteem.

While we too frequently see the opposite of these ideals on social media, it does not give anyone the proverbial green light to act in the same way. We need to positively represent the students, schools, and communities we support, and we need to positively represent ourselves. While we can learn a lot from the behavior of the people around us, we can also be the one who is the model of positivity for everyone else around us.

We are all in this together. Let’s enjoy the competition, positively cheer for our teams, and give the game the respect it deserves.

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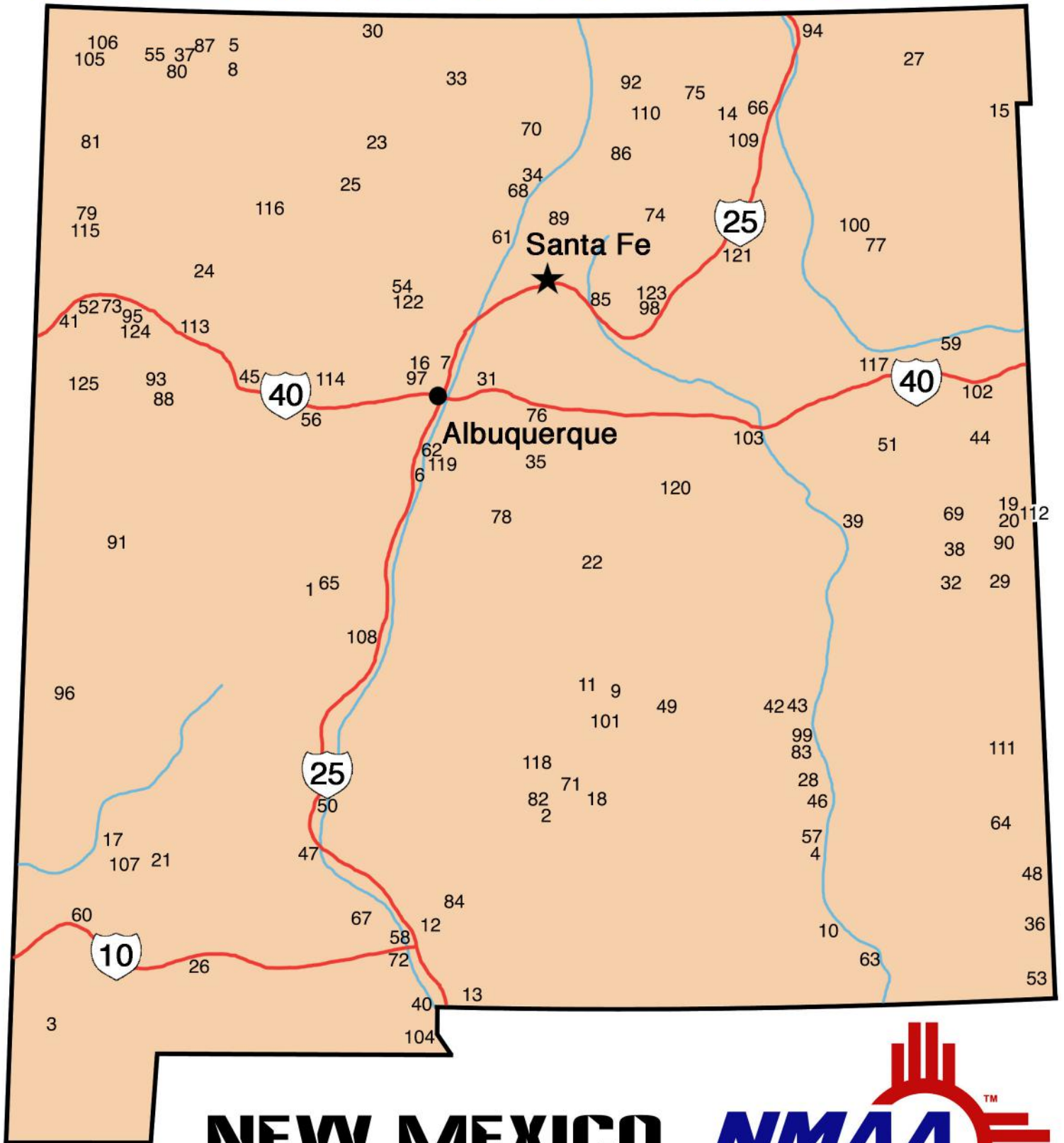

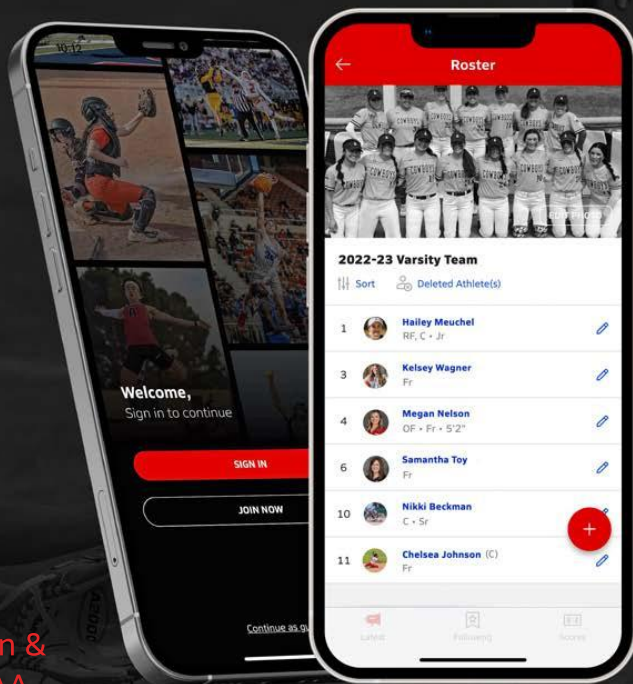

Cleveland extended their lead in the third quarter to 28-14 and added another score in the fourth to put the game out of reach, as the Storm hoisted the blue trophy for the fourth time in school history.

It's more blue for the blue in 2021. The Lovington Wildcats lifted the blue championship trophy in beating Ruidoso 41-21 to win the Class 4A State Football Title game. The 6th seeded Warriors (8-6) jumped out to an early 13-0 lead, but the Wildcats (10-3) were not rattled on their home blue turf. Lovington scored three touchdowns of their own to take a 21-13 lead into halftime.

"That first score, when we finally got into the endzone, lit a match and it just kept burning," said Lovington head coach Anthony Gonzales. "I would have liked to start a different way, but I was proud of how they finished."

The top-seeded Wildcats built up a 15-point lead with 7:20 to play in the third quarter as part of their run of 28-straight points. Ruidoso cut the deficit to 28-21 late in the third quarter, but Lovington took a two-touchdown lead in the final quarter.

Lovington junior quarterback Ashton Aranda rushed for two touchdowns and threw three more scores in the win. It's Lovington's first state title since 2011.

Robertson Wins the 2021 3A State Football Title



The 2021 Class 3A State Football Championship game matched district rivals against one another, Robertson and St. Michael's. The Cardinals had come up empty in their previous four trips to the state final, but this year was different. Robertson (11-2) never trailed in beating the Horsemen 28-7.

After a scoreless first quarter, Robertson finally found the endzone just before halftime when Matthew Gonzales scored his first of three touchdowns on the game on a 47-yard run. The Cardinals took a 6-0 lead into halftime and built it up to 12-0 on a second Gonzales touchdown, this one from 22 yards out. Robertson running back Jesse James scored on a 6-ayrd run in the fourth quarter and a two-point conversion gave the Cardinals a 20-0 lead.

St. Michael's (9-4) got on the board with a 60-yard touchdown pass from Zachary Martinez to Devin Flores, but Robertson would add one more score in the final quarter on a 73-yard touchdown run by Gonzales. The senior quarterback finished with 192 rushing yards and three interceptions to go along with his trifecta of scores. The Robertson defense finished with five interceptions on the day.

The state title is Robertson's first since 2013 and fourth championship overall.

Just 23 miles separates the towns of Eunice and Jal, and for the first time since 1977, these two schools met for the 2A Football Championship on the line. The Eunice Cardinals (9-3) got the better of the Jal Panthers (10-2) in the 2021 Class 2A State Football Championship, 28-15, marking it the 16th football title for the Cardinals in school history.

Over 2,000 fans turned out for this old rivalry and both teams did not disappoint. Jal started the game with the ball and marched down the field for the games first score, taking a 7-0 lead. Eunice answered with a touchdown of their own, tying the game at 7-7.

The Cardinals added another score, right before the

half, taking a 14-7 advantage into the locker room at the half. In the third quarter, the defense for both teams tightened down, as the score remained the same after three quarters of play.

Then, just five seconds into the fourth quarter, Eunice scored on a 12-yard run up the middle to take a 21-7 lead. The Cardinals added an insurance touchdown with just under five minutes to play in the game, making it 28-7.

The Panthers did find the endzone one last time on a deep pass to the corner of the endzone to pull with 13 points at 28-15 but there was not enough time to mount a comeback, as the Eunice Cardinals took the 2021 State 2A Football Championship, 28-15.

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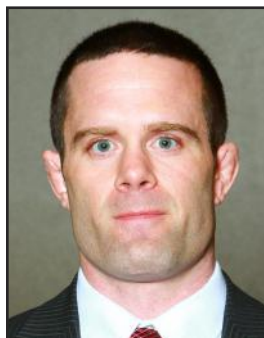
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
