Water On The Ground

The song "Honey In The Rock" also talks about "Water on the Ground." I would like to take a look at the meaning of Water in the Word.

What is the Spiritual Meaning of Water in the Bible? Rebirth

Water in the Old Testament represents various spiritual meanings – creation, purification, and judgment. Water is associated with the beginning of life in the Bible. In Genesis (1:2), the earth was formless and empty, and darkness was over the surface of the deep, and the Spirit of God was hovering over the waters.

Jesus unisvered and said to her, "Everyone

who drinks of this water will thirst again; but whoever drinks of the water that I will

give him shall never thirst; but the water

that I will give him will become in him a well of water springing up to eternal life."

John 4:13-14

Genesis 2:5-6 (TLB)5 There were no plants or grain sprouting up across the earth at first, for the Lord God hadn't sent any rain; nor was there anyone to farm the soil.

6 (However, water welled up from the ground at certain places and flowed across the land.)

This verse tells us how the garden got its water with no rain: mists or streams came up from the ground. The impression is of underground streams, the so-called "freshwater ocean," which would saturate the land, perhaps on a cyclical basis.

It is a powerful representation of God's grace, transforming power, and

provision in various aspects of human life.

Water in the Bible is also used metaphorically to represent the word of God, the Holy Spirit, and the spiritual nourishment that faith in God provides.

Representation of God's grace: Water signifies the abundant grace that

God extends to his people through forgiveness and redemption.

Purification and cleansing: In the Bible, water is often used for purification purposes, as seen through rituals like baptism and the cleansing of lepers.

Rebirth and renewal: Water signifies new life and regeneration, as illustrated in the story of Noah's Ark and the parting of the Red Sea.

Life-giving properties: Water is essential for life, both physically and spiritually. Jesus described himself as the "living water" that satisfies the spiritual thirst of those who believe in him (John 4:10).

It also symbolizes the Holy Spirit, flowing into the hearts of believers


and providing wisdom, strength, and comfort.

The parting of the Red Sea is one of the most dramatic instances where water is involved. In this event, water represented a barrier to freedom, which God miraculously overcame. (Exodus 14:21.)

John 7:37-39 (TLB) On the last day, the climax of the holidays, Jesus shouted to the crowds, "If anyone is thirsty, let him come to me and drink. 38 For the Scriptures declare that rivers of living water shall flow from the inmost being of anyone who believes in me." 39 (He was speaking of the Holy Spirit, who would be given to everyone believing in him; but the Spirit had not yet been given, because Jesus had not yet returned to his glory in heaven.)

At least one police department reported their 911 line was briefly flooded by callers just checking to see if they could access the emergency service. Can you imagine? The actual 911 service is jammed up and real emergencies could be turned into real tragedies simply because the masses are 'testing' to see if their cell phones work?

People have become deeply reliant on their cell phones for keeping in touch with work and family, getting directions, accessing the internet and doing two-factor authentication for website logins — not to mention more serious tasks like calling for help when in danger.

There is a dependency and reliance that has bled over into the realm of convenience when it comes to these types of things, and the newer generations that are being rooted in these technologies have a potential to miss out on a unique type of growth and development that is independent of technology.

Reading maps, using a compass, actually playing outside, and having a more mature emotional intelligence that doesn't require hyper-stimulation. Listen to the following statement taken from an AP news article:

"When her cellphone's service went down this week because of an AT&T network outage, Bernice Hudson didn't panic. She just called the people she wanted to talk to the old-fashioned way – on her landline telephone, the kind she grew up with and refuses to get rid of even though she has a mobile phone.

"Don't get me wrong, I like cellphones," the 69-year-old Alexandria, Virginia, resident said Thursday, the day of the outage. "But I'm still old school."

In a world where everyone is out for themselves, we should be out for Jesus – wise as serpents, yet gentle as doves.

The Blood of Jesus

There is nothing more powerful in all of creation than the blood of Jesus. This blood comes also with a powerful testimony. Our knowledge of the blood and its testimony is extremely important to the New Covenant believer.

Hebrews 12: 22-24, BSB Instead, you have come to Mount Zion, to the city of the living God, the heavenly Jerusalem. 23b You have come to God the Judge of all, to the spirits of the righteous made perfect, 24to Jesus the mediator of a new covenant, and to the sprinkled blood that speaks a better word than the blood of Abel.

The blood is proof of the debt paid and the penalty of sin lifted. The blood of Jesus removes the enemy's hold and puts us back in our rightful place with God- the place that we are destined to be. Let's expand upon these points.

The blood of Jesus dissolves the contracts with darkness (legal rights/agreement) AFTER repentance takes place. It is proof that we are forgiven of sin and cleared of all guilt. It is the NEW EVIDENCE that thoroughly dismisses and disproves the old. The blood of Jesus allows us to be armed with the perfect testimony, freed from the accusations of the enemy.

1 John 1:7, BSB 7But if we walk in the light as He is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus His Son cleanses us from all sin.

Take a deep look at the following scripture, it points out how much the blood does for us:

Hebrews 9:12, 14-15, BSB He did not enter by the blood of goats and calves, but He entered the Most Holy Place once for all by His own blood, thus securing eternal redemption. 14 How much more will the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered Himself unblemished to God, purify our consciences from works of death, so that we may serve the living God! 15Therefore Christ is the mediator of a new covenant, so that those who are called may receive the promised eternal inheritance, now that He has died to redeem them from the transgressions committed under the first covenant.

Did you get that all? This scripture teaches us that blood of Jesus gives us access- it makes the way for us to enter into Heaven. It allows us to be spiritual and to receive promises, it allows us to inherit eternity- it gives us our place and allows us to serve God!

The Strength of Humility: Knowing Where You Are At... Part 4 Reverend Christopher Gore

We have been looking at Adam and Eve. Now let's look at Elijah.

"Now Ahab told Jezebel all that Elijah had done, and how he had killed all the prophets [of Baal] with the sword. Then Jezebel sent a messenger to Elijah, saying, "So may the gods do to me, and even more, if by this time tomorrow I do not make your life like the life of one of them." And Elijah was afraid and arose and ran for his life, and he came to Beersheba which belongs to Judah, and he left his servant there. But he himself traveled a day's journey into the wilderness, and he came and sat down under a juniper tree and asked [God] that he might die. He said, "It is enough; now, O Lord, take my life, for I am no better than my fathers." I Kings 19: 1 – 4 {AMP}.

Elijah looked at himself after Jezebel threatened to take his life. Elijah had knowledge that God would protect him as he was doing God's will. Elijah had knowledge that Jezebel had made this threat against him. Here comes the conflict. Is God really going to do what He said or is Jezebel going to win. We all have this internal struggle when it comes to standing for God. Nonetheless we see Elijah in this conflict with the knowledge of his situation. This knowledge was competing against what God was going to do with Elijah.

This knowledge made Elijah go into a cave. This is different from Adam and Eve. They didn't cry out to God and got into a mess. On the other hand Elijah cried out to God but from the wrong perspective. Elijahs perspective was about him and what he was doing or what he could do. Elijah knew he could not defeat Jezebel. Elijah let the knowledge of the threat from Jezebel keep him from getting into the Spirit. Elijah was fixated on what was going to happen to him if Jezebel succeeded. Remember we said last week that, "Knowledge is good but absent from the Spirit of God knowledge can be used by the enemy to pull us off course and away from God". Elijah began to further look at himself, he did not seek God for the next move but went further into himself. Elijah became focused on his flesh, i.e. "What is happening to me?" Not what did God just do at Mt. Carmel or what is God going to do next? But his focus was on what is happening to me. With this the enemy used Jezebel to pull Elijah off course.

Humility will always compel you to seek God. No matter what the situation or circumstances. It's the dependance upon God. We need to develop the mindset that we need to include God in everything. We need to develop the mindset that there is nothing inside of us that will cause us to finish the assignment God has for us. We will continue next week with more on Elijah.

- 1. Ananias was chosen by the Lord to carry out a specific assignment.
- Ananias had a special <u>visitation</u> from the Lord in a <u>vision</u> that would allow him to <u>hear</u>, <u>recognize</u>, and <u>answer</u> the voice of the Lord.
- Ananias <u>understood</u> that he didn't have to be afraid to respond to the Lord's request with a question, stating facts of what he knew about Saul's current status.
- With <u>understanding</u>, Ananias <u>trusted</u> the voice of the Lord and <u>went</u> forth to lay hands on Saul to restore his sight, and to be filled with the Holy Spirit, that would lead him into baptism.

Imagine Ananias being chosen but not following through on His assignment with Saul. Imagine Ananias putting the special visitation to the side, or not hearing the voice of the Lord with confidence. Do you think he would've answered the call? Do you think he could trust the voice that he heard, knowing Saul did damage to the children of God?

Imagine Saul's life being different if Ananias would've dropped this assignment. It is possible that Paul would not have the experiences as an Apostle, suffering in ways that only he could, allowing for the whole world to know through it all, salvation in the Lord is real and it's worth it. Thank God for Ananias!!!

Ananias was called a disciple of the Lord. This was considered a big thing back in those days because a true disciple understood the price they had to pay to be called a follower of Jesus Christ. What did Anaias first say when giving this assignment? "Lord, I have heard from many about this man,how much evil he has done toyoursaints at Jerusalem."

Luke 14:11; 18:14 "He that humbleth himself shall be exalted."

James 4:10 "Humble yourself in the sight of the Lord, and He shall lift you up." And 1st Peter 5:6 "Humble yourselves therefore under the mighty hand of God, that He may exalt you in due time."

These three verses show us that it is when we humble ourselves, that is when we are exalted. We cannot exalt ourselves, but we must humble ourselves if we want to be exalted. For if we go on willfully and deliberately sinning after receiving the knowledge of the truth, there no longer remains a sacrifice [to atone] for our sins [that is, no further offering to anticipate]!

God's Consuming Fire

God tells us that he is a consuming fire. When we talk about God being a consuming fire, we say Hebrews 10:26–27 refers to God using "an all-consuming burning fire," indicating the kind of wrath that will come to all those who choose to defy him. His fire consumes all the impurities we have, and we become a new person in Christ. The things that keep you from being what he wants you to be. At the same time, it's trying to mold you into the image of Christ, and sometimes that will require fire.

Hebrews 12:18-29 You have not come near a mountain that can be touched or that is burning with fire, nor have you come near darkness or darkness or a storm. 19 Not at the sound of a trumpet, nor at such a clamor of words that those who heard it begged that no more should be spoken to them, 20 because they could not endure this command: "Everyone who touches the mountain will be stoned, even if he be an animal." 21 So terrifying was this sight that Moses said, "I am trembling with fear." 22 But you have come to Mount Zion, to the heavenly Jerusalem, the city of the living God. They have come to thousands and thousands of angels, to a joyful assembly, 23 to the church of the firstborn inscribed in heaven. They have drawn near to God, the Judge of all; to the spirits of the righteous who have attained perfection:24 To Jesus, the mediator of a new covenant, and to the sprinkled blood, which speaks better than Abel's. 25 Be careful not to reject the speaker, for if those who rejected the one who warned them on earth did not escape, much less will we escape if we turn our backs on the one who warns us from heaven. 26 His voice shook the earth at that time, but now he has promised, "Once again I will make not only the earth but the sky tremble." 27 The phrase "once more" indicates the removal of movable. i.e., created things, so that the immovable may remain. 28 Since we are receiving an unshakable kingdom, let us be thankful. Inspired by this gratitude, let us worship God as he pleases, with reverent fear, 29 for our "God is a consuming fire."

Both Deuteronomy 4:24 and Hebrews 12:29 speak of God's holiness, righteousness, and zeal for His worship. We must worship Him with a deep spiritual sense of His holiness and greatness. We need grace to approach Him in worship in the right way. The particular grace mentioned is fear, spiritual wonder, and reverence.

As Deuteronomy 4 and Hebrews 12 make clear, this also includes loving care regarding the worship of God. We are to limit ourselves to the ways He has assigned us to worship Him (Deuteronomy 4:2; Leviticus 10:1-3; Exodus 20:5).

To take Hebrews 12:29 seriously means to recognize that God is still consuming fire and that this still requires of us the same reverence and fear. We must always fear God, it is consuming fire by itself, it is also consuming fire in its works, it is consuming fire in the covenant, and we must serve our God with fear.

DIFFERENT TYPES OF DOCTORS AND THEIR SPECIALTY

MD – stands for Doctor of Medicine. They treat and diagnose conditions using conventional medical tools like x-rays, prescription drugs and surgery. They can choose to be broad practitioners and work as family medicine, primary care, psychiatry, geriatric medicine and pediatrics.

DO – stands for Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine. They focus more on holistic health which includes all parts of a person, including their mind, body and emotions which are considered during the treatment. They also use a system of physical manipulations and adjustments to diagnose and treat people. Over half of DOs choose to work in primary care but they can also choose to specialize in another area, just like MDs. DOs have all the same responsibilities and rights as MDs, including ability to perform surgery and prescribe medicine.

DDS – Doctor of Dental Surgery

DMD - Doctor of Medicine in Dentistry

* Both represent the same education. Training programs range from 2-6 years depending upon the specialty such as endodontics, orthodontics, periodontics prosthodontics, oral surgery and pediatric dentistry.

ENDOCRINOLOGISTS – specialize in treating disorders of the endocrine system including diabetes, thyroid diseases, infertility, growth issues, metabolic disorders, osteoporosis, some cancers and hormone-producing adrenal glands and pituitary glands. When problems in other systems or body parts impact your endocrine system, endocrinologists work in tandem with your primary care doctor or other specialists to come up with a treatment plan.

ALLERGISTS/IMMUNOLOGISTS – focus on the immune system and treat disorders such as food allergies, asthma, eczema, autoimmune diseases and more.

DERMATOLOGISTS – treat and diagnose benign and malignant skin disorders in addition to issues with hair and nails, moles, tumors of the skin, melanomas, allergic skin disorders and acne.

CHIROPRACTOR – focus on the musculoskeletal system which includes bones, nerves, muscles, tendons and ligaments. They believe the benefits of spinal adjustments and realigning joints improve neck and back pain and the functioning of other systems throughout the body.

CARDIOLOGIST – focus on diseases of the heart, lungs and blood vessels. These diseases include things like ischemic heart disease, pericarditis, congenital heart disease, high blood pressure and abnormal heart rhythms. They perform and interpret results of heart tests like stress testing and echocardiograms.

GASTROENTEROLOGISTS – focus on digestive organs including the stomach, bowels, pancreas, liver, gallbladder, abdominal pain, ulcers, diarrhea, jaundice or cancers in your digestive organs.

HEMATOLOGISTS – focus on diseases of the blood, spleen, lymph glands like sickle cell disease, anemia, hemophilia and leukemia. pg 14

Take Your Blood To the Courtroom Part 4 – Blood Clots Testify Nancy Connell

I was laying there after several days of not being able to function or move, the Holy Spirit continues to show me what to do with the blood in the courtroom. He said, "it is time to have your blood testify of the clots and the blockages in the blood."

I had to look up what is a blood clot/blockage. Blood clots help stop bleeding when you're injured. It is your body's way of stopping you from bleeding too much. The Blood must flow continuously and smoothly throughout your body for an entire lifetime but quickly shut off to avoid spills when you get a cut or injury. So the blood clot can develop in response to an injury or the trauma your body experiences for example through surgeries or other medical procedures. They can also form because of damage to arteries or for no purpose which then they can be dangerous and cause life-threatening medical conditions.


Once the injury is healed the blood clot/blockage should be broken down by your body and dissolve. If this does not happen, the clot may break away and form a blockage and when this happens or they form when not needed they can cause heart attack, stroke, high blood pressure, stomach and intestinal issues, headaches, muscle aches, and many other issues. and can be inherited from the family line.

Blood clots can testify of the damage that has been done to your body through injury and trauma. They also can testify of why they are or have been there for no purpose. Once it has then you will want to allow God to walk you through the healing and forgiveness process. Ask God to allow your blood to be cleansed by the living water, restored by the blood of Jesus, and be made whole in the Spirit. (more on that later on in another article.)

When we become agonized by something no matter what it is—if you do NOT turn it over to God and allow God heal you of those wounds and "blood clots" – unforgiveness will set in and unforgiveness turns into bitterness and anger which causes negative health issues that can lead to a deadly result both physically and spiritually.

Jesus shows us of an example of this with His experience when he came to the place he had to make a decision to die to his own will and choosing to walk out the will of the Father. In Luke 22:44, when Jesus was praying alone in the Mount of Olives He experienced so much agony that He sweat drops of blood. (The literal translation of "great drops of blood" in Luke 22:44 translates into "thrombosis':) But even more than that, the works was NOT completed, until Jesus requested God to forgive all those who did this to Him. How important those words were in that hour and so much meaning.

It actually has been proven in the medical and physiological field that negative health effects of unforgiveness are widely documented which include but are not limited to: stress, depression and anxiety, social isolation, and physical health issues. Unforgiveness manifests as anger and bitterness which causes heart ailments, high blood pressure, stomach and intestinal issues, headaches, muscle aches and other health disorders and diseases. The good news: Studies have found that the act of forgiveness can reap huge rewards for your health, lowering the risk of health issues; and reducing pain, blood pressure, and bring healing.
