The Importance of Autonomy

At birth, a baby is entirely dependent on its parents. Then, autonomy slowly appears when he begins, for example, to crawl, walk on all fours and grab an object. Developing autonomy is essential to the development of toddlers. This is done through a trial and error phase until they reach the success phase.

Even if they have difficulty completing certain tasks at first, your child can believe in their abilities if you encourage their efforts. On the contrary, if he has difficulties and you criticize him, become impatient, or punish him, he may feel ashamed and not believe in him. The development of its autonomy could then be slowed down.

When you recognize your toddler's needs, he will feel understood and respected. He will learn that with his parent, he can be himself. He then has more confidence in himself, which encourages him later on, to become more autonomous. Your child will be more confident and motivated to do and accomplish more. He won't be afraid of doing mistakes because he'll be sure that you're there to guide and support him.

Autonomy is not just about the gestures that your toddler can do alone. It also concerns his language, his intellectual or cognitive development as well as his socio-emotional and moral development. For example, when your child learns new words, he develops his language autonomy. When he understands that an object still exists even if it disappears from his sight, asks questions, and classifies his small toys by color, he shapes his intellectual autonomy. Finally, when he begins to name his preferences, respect instructions, enjoy the company of another child, and play alone for small moments, he gradually builds his social, emotional, and moral autonomy.

Last, here are some important points to know, first, your child needs to feel that you believe in their abilities to gain autonomy. Second, it's very important to encourage your toddler to do things on their own by making sure it's age-appropriate. Third, reassuring your toddler and respecting his rhythm helps him gain confidence in himself and become more autonomous.

And remember, your presence and support are what matters the most while he's passing all his milestones. He's going to remember that you were by his side clapping and encouraging him.

CLASS ACTIVITIES - KG

In the KG department, our focused topic has been Goldilocks and the three bears. In our theme room, we have been exploring the topic linked to the curriculum. We have been retelling the story using puppets, sequencing the story, and discussing the beginning, middle, and end of stories and we have been sorting bears by color and size. When retelling the story, we have been practicing different voices to represent different characters in the book.





In KG1 we have been focusing on cardinality and quantities. We solidified these concepts by building numbers towers. The children enjoyed this activity thoroughly. We will be revising our key Math concepts until the end of term by focusing on one Math principle each week. During Math, in KG2, we have come to the end of our two and three- dimensional shapes Unit. As a consolidation activity, we created 3-D shapes with playdough while recording the shapes we have learned in our workbooks. Next week we will be focusing on attributes that include length, capacity, and weight. This will be our final Math unit whereby revision activities will be completed by the end of the term.





In science, our Kindergarteners had an excellent time learning about different types of weather by using their senses to observe and describe current weather conditions. They investigated and recorded the weather changes over a short period. Students have learned how to identify the characteristics of different types of weather by making their weather booklets. Additionally, students in KG1 have learned about how rainbows are formed when light shines through the water as the sun shines through the rain. They enjoyed creating their rainbows using paint and white cotton. The students utterly enjoyed learning about weather and climate that affect their lives every day.

CLASS ACTIVITIES

Grades 1 and 2 students stood up for the Spelling Bee competition bravely. The purpose of this competition was to help children improve their spelling, increase their vocabulary and develop correct English usage that will help them all their lives. Our children were extremely excited and confident. They did an amazing job!

Grade 1 students played with blocks to form contractions. They enjoyed their grammar lesson

Grade 2 students learned about natural disasters such as earthquakes. They drew about earthquakes and what to do when an earthquake happens. In social studies, they put their minds together to crack symbolic codes. This was based on our current topic about Symbols in UAE.

We measure things in the world around us all the time. For instance, you may want to measure the distance from your city to a friend's city, measure how much milk you want to put in a recipe, or measure how much you weigh. All of these examples involve measurement.

In a perfect world, we would always have measuring tools with standard units of measurement readily available to take a measurement. However, what do we do if we need to take a measurement and we don't have any standard measuring instruments available? Don't worry! We have a solution when this is the case! We can use nonstandard units of measurement.

Grade 1 students used various non-standard units (everyday objects) to estimate the length of other objects around them using different tools and their human bodies!



MEET THE TEACHER




Hi! I am Mr.Mohammed Matar

ART HIGHLIGHTS



Demonstrating Movement

Movement adds overall compositional interest to an artwork. An artist can direct how a viewer's eye moves around an image by arranging its elements in a certain way. Rhythm, line, color, and space play a major role in creating the feeling of movement.

Grade 1 demonstrated the movement by drawing a huge wave, coloring it with different values of blue, then adding brushstrokes of white color to make a rhythm and direct the viewer's eye. They made their own paper sailboat, colored it, and pasted it on the water.

Demonstrating Visual Rhythm

Grade 5 and 6 also worked on rhythm and movement. They demonstrated an understanding of visual rhythm by creating a piece of art that shows rhythm through repetition of the elements of art (shape and color) that produce the look and feel of movement.

Still Life Project

Grade 7 and 8 finished their still life art project, a still life is a drawing or painting that focuses on still objects. The subject of their still life typically focused on traditional household objects, dates, and fruits.





An Interview with the Principal- Mr. Samir Aoun Date: June 1st, 2022

Alya Al Zarouni: First of all, how are you? Mr. Samir: I'm good. Thank you for asking.



AZ: What inspired you to start teaching?

Mr. Samir: for those who know the story of how I started teaching, it's pure coincidence-because the last thing I wanted to be was a teacher. But to reflect on what you're asking me about, what inspired me was the joy that I found when I took on my first teaching position and the fact that you can make a difference in people's lives- it makes quite an impact. It's something which is beyond the feeling of satisfaction that you get from any other job- and from there on it's a personal decision and a message that you decide to get across in life. So, yes, basically it's the joy and fulfillment that I got from my first teaching decision... which from there on changed my life completely.

AZ: That's lovely to hear. Mr Samir: Thank you Alya.



AZ: Are you happy with how far the school has come?

Mr. Samir: Well this school has come quite a lot from where we were nine months ago... but definitely when you're ambitious enough and you put a lot of effort there's always a lot of challenges that you desire to cross. After every milestone, you cross you say there's one more. So basically, am I satisfied? Yes. Are we fulfilled? Not yet- because there's a lot yet to come in terms of requirements and commitments... and we're quite ambitious in terms of the achievements we've set for ourselves as a school. We have the challenge of opening a high school in the coming years... There's a big project that requires an extension of the facility. so there's a Stage 2 in terms of expanding the facility as a building. So, yes, there's a lot to come. Hopefully, you guys will be among those who contribute to those accomplishments in the coming years.



AZ: Five years from now, what do you think the school will be like?

Mr. Samir: No idea. See, it depends... because at the level of education- especially in the UAE and Abu Dhabi- there is a lot that is being planned for. And changes are underway across all aspects. Now, where will the school be in 5 years? Hopefully, I wish for the school to be at the top-performing schools at the level of Abu Dhabi Private Schools. That's a wish for me. Again, hopefully, you'll be part of the accomplishment itself.

AZ: Describe the school in three words.

Mr.Samir: It's a futuristic school. I aspire for it to be a family community. I would want everyone who is working on it, and working in it to be ambitious and never satisfied or fulfilled until the next challenge comes along because there is a lot to offer. So in three words, I would say futuristic, family, and definitely, definitely ambitious.



AZ: What traits did you gain from being a Principal?

Mr. Samir: Lots of traits basically. Now being a Principal is not different from being a normal human being with exceptional traits that require you to be at a certain level of responsibilityat a certain level of commitment- because eventually you're looked upon as a role model. And being a Principal means being a father, being a brother, being a support for those that don't have support, being a mentor for teachers, and being there for every single person in the school community. So to be able to do and practice those things, you need a lot of character in terms of patience, in terms of being well committed to your community, in terms of having the skill set of being an active listener. That requires a transformation on a personal level. I can tell you that it's not easy, but it's not difficult as long as you love what you are doing. But basically, if you're a caring human being, if you're a loving human being, if you love what you do at the level of education as I said- in terms of inspiration for teaching- then you'll do a fabulous job as a school Principal.



AZ: What is your perspective on life?

Mr. Samir: See, I'm one of those who's very fulfilled with a high sense of gratitude towards what I've accomplished and what I've achieved. And over the years, if anything, we get caught by our daily and human experience that life has a lot to offer. And I think God is very generous in his offerings although people don't perceive it the same way... See, some people perceive [life] as being fair, others say it's not. In my opinion, life is extremely fair and you're being blessed by being on this Earth.

Life has a lot of offerings and blessings, but it all goes back to the individual... on how you want to make the best of what life offers you and what comes across your way, throughout your presence in this life. So I think we're very lucky despite all the challenges and all the difficulties.

I'm one of those believers that life is governed by, what you call, universal laws, and if you know how to understand them, how to perceive them, and how to look from a smart perspective, you'll grow to appreciate what life has to offer. If not, you will have to learn to otherwise you will be among the misfortunate ones. And you will spend your life contemplating and thinking that life is unfair, while in reality, it is. It has nothing to do with life (itself)- it's a matter of perspective.

AZ: That's a nice answer. What is your favorite part about being a Principal?

Mr. Samir: As I said, it is part of making a difference in people's lives. Being a school Principal, I don't consider myself as being different from any other educator- or any other colleague in the education sector. But the upper hand that the position as a school principal offers you is that you get to deal with different people. You're not only dealing with studentsyou're dealing with students, with teachers, with parents... you're dealing with people from the outside community. So you're dealing with a wide spectrum of people whereby your skills are put to the test. One of the reasons why I decided to continue is human communication and transformation which is of the essence for me. It's a joy because everything you learn, and everything you practice as a school principal on a daily basis is actually impacting lives whether at a student level, or a teacher level, or a staff member level. Or even parents' level sometimes.



AZ: Do you believe that success comes with luck?

Mr. Samir: I used to. But not anymore. Because you know I've... as we've mentioned, I've been through a huge transformation on a personal level. So, at a young age, I used to contemplate and think that life is not fair and it's a matter of luck but then as I matured throughout the years and became more experienced and was exposed to a lot of opportunities... I don't believe in luck anymore. However, it's a matter of being ready for an opportunity. This is what luck is for me. Meaning, that there is an opportunity that will present itself in life, and those who are ready to make the best of the opportunity are considered to be the lucky ones. So it's a matter of being ready on a personal level. If you're ready, you will see the opportunity and you will make the best of it. But if you're not ready on a personal level, it will be a missed opportunity for you but not for somebody else. Because there's somebody else to pick it up.



AZ: What was an eye-opening experience for you?

Mr. Samir: On a personal level, or on a professional level? You go through different stages in your life. From a stage where you're dependent on your parents and dependent on others to a stage where you're totally independent to a stage where you start to support others, to a stage where you start developing the wisdom and the maturity whereby you start affecting others people's lives. Throughout the course of my personal and professional years, (and I still have a long way to go) I was always fascinated by human psychology. I learned to realize if people understand how human psychology works, and how the human brain functions, then it will open doors to a whole different range of opportunities (as we were discussing a few seconds ago). Because it is all interrelated. And I think that among all God's creatures- I think humans...possess what no other creature possesses- which is the will and the desire and the abilities to make decisions that are based on human, intellectual, conscious, and subconscious {dimensions}.

What differentiates one person from another is the self-awareness of this potential. If you have the awareness of the capabilities that you have... the psychological ability and the physiological ability and the mental capability, then you can do wonders. There is no limit to what you can do. And that's what differentiates one person from another.

The eye-opening experience is what I discovered over the years and not a lot of people discover it because a lot of people lack the awareness. This is what differentiates people who are successful from people who are not successful. People who have a growth mindset versus a goal mindset. Just to elaborate, the difference is that I could set a goal or a target and be satisfied by achieving that goal and target, versus being growth-oriented. There is no limit to how many goals you can achieve if you are growth-oriented and you have a growth

mind-set. To simplify and to put a wrap to the answer- human psychology and human ability and self-awareness are of the essence for every single human being and it is extremely important that we understand how those work together so that we can make the best of the life opportunities and the blessings that we are blessed with as human beings on the planet. However, it needs to be properly put together with clarity. And from thereafter, it becomes very easy because you'll be able to see the signs. If there's clarity, and you know for a fact how these things work together, then you'll very easily see the signs and not miss a single opportunity that comes across your way.



AZ: For the last question, what differentiates this school from the rest?

Mr. Samir: It's community. Clearly, this school is different from the rest because when we started off, the first challenge was to make sure the school community itself is a unique one, and when I say unique, it has to be different in every aspect at the level of the personnel, at the level of the kids, at the level of the care that we offer, at the level of the flexibility and the ease of the atmosphere that we have because eventually, this is what you aspire to be part of as a community. And this is a priority for me personally, and a priority for every single person working in the school...which is to make sure it is reflective of a true family community.

At the level of education, the priority is not only academics, wellbeing needs to be a priority before your academics. At the level of my personal priorities as a father before I am a Principal- I care more about my kids being comfortable and being safe and being well taken care of before I even discuss the grades and the lessons and the requirements. So one thing comes before the other.

The priority that was set for this school is to ensure that the community is a welcoming community, a warm community, a loving community, and a community that is built on mutual respect whereby once those values are set, then we move on to the other priorities that will automatically come as a result. Laying this foundation is not easy. However, this is what sets us apart from the other schools that are in this geographic area, because not everyone sets what I am saying as a priority when it is a definitely one for us.
