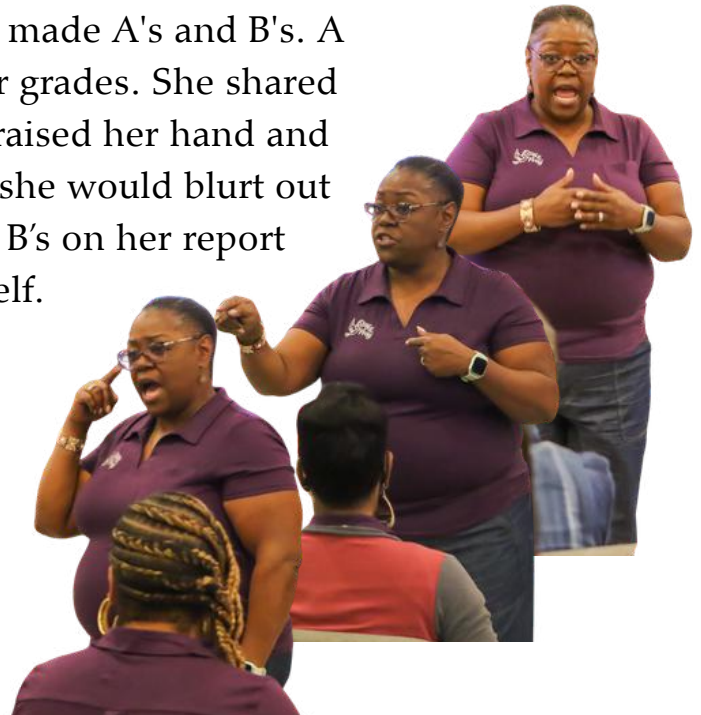

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She was always good at speaking and writing. She wrote excellent reports and poems and often spoke in church programs. Rooted in Friday night fellowship meals, praise and worship, foot washing, and personal ministry in their home, Stay & Pray has grown into a life-changing ministry dedicated to encounters with God and care for the soul.

Bishop Page earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Occupational Safety and Health from the School of Technology at North Carolina Agricultural and Technical State University in 1987, where she was among the first graduating class of the School of Technology. She earned a Master of Science in Administration from Central Michigan University in 2001. She also holds an honorary Doctor of Divinity degree, conferred in 2014 by United Cornerstone University through Citadel Ministries International. On June 16, 2017, she was consecrated to the office of Bishop, further affirming her lifelong commitment to apostolic leadership and faithful service within the Church of the Lord Jesus Christ.

In addition to her ministry service, Bishop Page enjoyed a distinguished career in education, leadership, workforce development, and training. She served as a teacher, department chair, curriculum consultant, Career and College Manager, Career Development Coordinator, Special Populations Coordinator, and instructional leader. Her expertise in teaching, leadership development, technology education, and skills-building has impacted students, educators, ministry leaders, and professionals across multiple generations. She retired from Guilford County Schools in 2024 to turn her attention fully to Gospel ministry, entrepreneurial, and creative ministry.

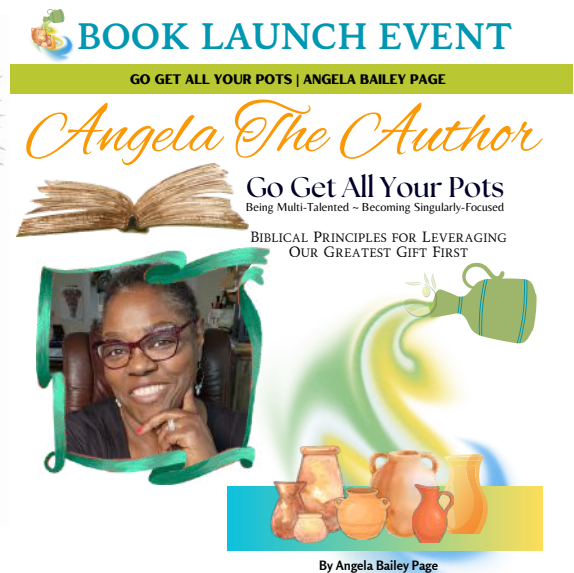
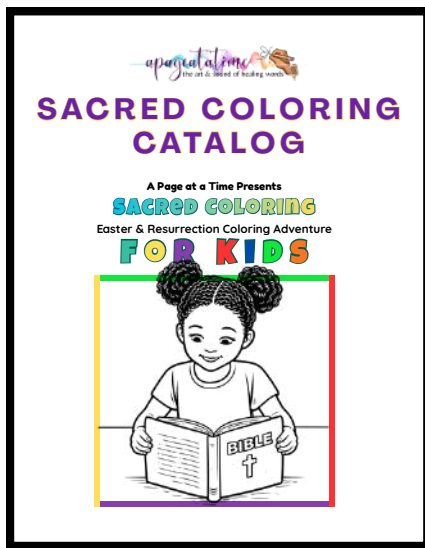


Author, Artist, and Entrepreneur

THE READING OF THE WORD OF GOD

THE OLD TESTAMENT LESSON | ISAIAH 61:1-8 Read by: Overseer Allan H. Gray

Lector: A Reading from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah.

The spirit of the Lord God is upon me because the Lord has anointed me; he has sent me to bring good news to the oppressed, to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives and release to the prisoners, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor and the day of vengeance of our God, to comfort all who mourn, to provide for those who mourn in Zion—to give them a garland instead of ashes, the oil of gladness instead of mourning, the mantle of praise instead of a faint spirit. They will be called oaks of righteousness, the planting of the Lord, to display his glory. They shall build up the ancient ruins; they shall raise up the former devastations; they shall repair the ruined cities, the devastations of many generations.

Strangers shall stand and feed your flocks; foreigners shall till your land and dress your vines, but you shall be called priests of the Lord; you shall be named ministers of our God; you shall enjoy the wealth of the nations, and in their riches you shall glory. Because their shame was double and dishonor was proclaimed as their lot, therefore in their land they shall possess a double portion; everlasting joy shall be theirs. For I, the Lord, love justice, I hate robbery and wrongdoing; I will faithfully give them their recompense, and I will make an everlasting covenant with them.

Lector: The Word of the Lord.

All: Thanks be to God.

THE NEW TESTAMENT LESSON | HEBREWS 5:1-10

Lector: A Reading from the Book of Hebrews. Read by: The Rev. Dyreek Carter

Every high priest chosen from among mortals is put in charge of things pertaining to God on their behalf, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins. He is able to deal gently with the ignorant and wayward, since he himself is subject to weakness, and because of this he must offer sacrifice for his own sins as well as for those of the people. And one does not presume to take this honor but takes it only when called by God, just as Aaron was. So also Christ did not glorify himself in becoming a high priest but was appointed by the one who said to him, "You are my Son; today I have begotten you"; as he says also in another place, "You are a priest forever, according to the order of Melchizedek." In the days of his flesh, Jesus offered up prayers and supplications, with loud cries and tears, to the one who was able to save him from death, and he was heard because of his reverent submission. All: Maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end. We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets. We believe in one holy universal and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

THE INVESTITURE

Senior Presiding Bishop O’Brien:

My sister, you have been recognized as a bishop of the Church and as Presiding Prelate. We have heard of your suitability and calling to assume this office. We now join with you in a few moments of prayer as you continue to ascend to this office in which we trust that the Spirit of the Living God has called you.

As the music begins to play, the Presiding Prelate-Elect lays prostrate on the floor in a sign of surrender to the will of the Father in prayer. After a period of time, she is lifted to her knees in front of the Senior Presiding Bishop. After which, the Senior Presiding Bishop prays as led or the below:

Senior Presiding Bishop O’Brien:

God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, Father of mercies and God of all comfort, dwelling on high but having regard for the lowly, knowing all things before they come to pass: We give you thanks that from the beginning you have gathered and prepared a people to be heirs of the covenant of Abraham, and have raised up prophets, kings, and priests, never leaving Your temple untended. We praise You also that from the creation You have graciously accepted the ministry of those whom You have chosen.

The Senior Presiding Bishop and other Bishops and Apostles consecrated in dual, valid Apostolic Succession only now lay their hands upon the head of the Presiding Prelate-Elect, and say together:

Therefore, Father, we raise, elevate, and install Angela Bailey Page as Presiding Prelate of Light Work Ministries Fellowship of Churches and Pastors. Pour out upon her the power of Your princely Spirit, whom You bestowed upon Your beloved Son Jesus Christ, with whom He endowed the apostles, and by whom Your Church is built up in every place, to the glory and unceasing praise of Your Name.

People: Amen!

The Presiding Prelate is then raised to her feet and vested according to the Office of Presiding Prelate after which, Senior Presiding Bishop Senior O’Brien responds:

Senior Presiding Bishop O'Brien:

Now I, by the authority committed to me, and with the consent of those who have chosen you, do invest you, Angela B. Page, as Presiding Prelate of the Light Work Ministries Fellowship of Churches and Pastors, with all the temporal and spiritual rights and responsibilities that pertain to that office; in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

People: Amen!

A member of the Cabinet of the Presiding Prelate presents the Crozier of the Bishop.

Senior Presiding Bishop O'Brien:

On behalf of the people and clergy of the Light Work Ministries Fellowship of Churches and Pastors, I give into your hands this pastoral staff. May Christ the good Shepherd uphold you and sustain you as you carry it in His name.

Presiding Prelate Page:

Amen. I receive this pastoral staff at your hands as a token of my jurisdiction.

A Bible is brought from the Altar and held before the Presiding Prelate, who, laying a hand upon it, takes the oath, as follows:

Presiding Prelate Page:

I, Angela B. Page, Bishop in the Church of God, now duly invested and acknowledged as Presiding Prelate of the Light Work Ministries Fellowship of Churches and Pastors do solemnly promise that I will observe, and to the utmost of my power fulfill, the responsibilities and obligations of this office, striving in all things to be a faithful shepherd to the flock of Christ. So, help me God.

People: Amen!

THE SEATING OF THE PRESIDING PRELATE

Senior Presiding Bishop O'Brien, Pastor Darrisaw and other representatives of the Fellowship now escort the Presiding Prelate to the chair designated for the Presiding Prelate of the Light Work Ministries Fellowship of Churches and Pastors. Meanwhile, instrumental music may be played.

Pastor Adrienne Darrisaw:

In the name of this Cathedral Church, and on behalf of the people of this reformation, I install you, Bishop Page, in the chair appointed to your office. May the Lord stir up in you the flame of holy charity, and the power of faith that overcomes the world.

Church of the Living God: Let it be both declared and proclaimed, We have a Bishop! We have a Presiding Prelate Bishop! I present to you, Presiding Prelate Bishop Angela B. Page!
