



ABOUT STORM HARBOR


The staff, volunteers and horses at Storm Harbor Equestrian Center provide therapeutic riding opportunities for children and adults with disabilities. Slippery Rock University **students assist with the lessons and participate in vital field experiences** that benefit their future careers and serving individuals with disabilities. As an example, a physical therapy student might incorporate horseback riding into their patient's program or a special education teacher might involve their students in a local riding program.

At Storm Harbor, we serve a community that encompasses more than six counties, including but not limited to, Butler, Mercer, Venango, Allegheny, Lawrence and Beaver. While our main focus is children and adults with disabilities, we also offer a few programs for people without disabilities.

Our Programming







Camp ROCK (Recreational Opportunities Connecting Kids) – An extended school year program for adolescents on the autism spectrum.



Equine Services for Heroes – A ridingandgroundworkprogramforveteransof all ages with disabilities.Theprogram is currently funded by agrantfromtheU.S.DepartmentofVeteransAffairs,AdaptedSportsbranch.

SHEC-RT – An individualized recreational therapy, goal-directed program for high school students with disabilities to develop preemployment, motor and social skills.

Summer day camps available to all children.

One-day programs available to community agencies, schools and programs for youth and adults.

VIP Sports Camp – An equine activities camp powered through ENVISION, this camp provides a variety of physical activities and sporting events for visionimpaired youth.

Participant of the **Total Transition program** through the University's adapted physical activity program.

Provides class work for the University's newly developed animal-assisted intervention minor.



Welcome to Storm Harbor Equestrian Center. Tonight, we celebrate the success of our therapeutic riding program and the hard work of the people involved with the center. Therapeutic riding, as described by Professional Association of Therapeutic Horsemanship International, "uses equine-assisted activities for the purpose of contributing positively to the cognitive, physical, emotional and social well-being of people with disabilities."

Therapeutic riding provides benefits in the areas of health, education, sport and recreation, and leisure. Throughout the world, there are thousands of individuals with special needs who experience the rewarding benefits of horseback riding. A disability does not have to limit a person from riding horses. In fact, experiencing the motion of a horse can be very therapeutic. Horseback riding rhythmically moves the rider's body in a manner similar to a human gait, riders with physical disabilities often show improvement in flexibility, balance and muscle strength.

In addition to the therapeutic benefits, horseback riding also provides recreational opportunities for individuals with disabilities to enjoy the outdoors.



















