2D - FOREST SCHOOL

Shared Education Aims

- **-Year 1:** We are learning about the push, pull and twist forces. We made little characters from plasticine using the forces we learned about.
- **-Year 2:** The shape of an object as well as its weight affects whether something floats or sinks. We tested a range of objects to see whether they float or sink in water.
- **-Year 3:** We tested different materials to see if they are good reflectors of light.
- **-Year 4:** We made circuits to test for electrical conductors and insulators.
- **-Year 5:** We used fidget spinners to investigate friction. We had a go at making our own fidget spinners.
- **-Year 6:** Investigated electromagnets and their uses. Pupils also got the opportunity to make their own electromagnet.
- Year 7: We investigated the impact of frequency and volume on sound waves. We also created series and parallel circuits.

JAM 'N' IRÉ



This group was initially set up by two mothers whose young son was having serious identity issues due to being mixed race / dual heritage. Living in a rural community, he rarely had the opportunity to socialise with other children who looked like him; who had the same skin colour; who had the same hair; who felt the same pressures of being 'different' from the vast majority of their peers.

Jam 'n' Iré was born! Initially, three families met in a park, purely through word of mouth. Within 18 months, the membership has grown to 120 families, we have a very active Facebook and WhatsApp group, we meet every month at different locations around Northern Ireland.








Y7 NATURAL DISASTER POSTER SHOWCASE






