

You will be invited to join us at Silverdale to meet your new form and form tutor/s. You will spend time with your form getting to know your classmates.

While you are doing this, your parents and carers will receive presentations from the Head of School and the Head of Year 7.

You will then have a chance to meet the Year 7 and wellbeing teams, and see how homework works at Silverdale.

Primary school visits

The Year 7 Team work hard to visit you at your primary school, so you can meet them and start to prepare for your move to Silverdale. The team will also discuss your needs with your primary teachers, so we can be ready for your arrival at Silverdale.

SEND coffee morning

Wednesday 23 April, 9.30am-11am

If you have a special educational need or disability (and have an EHC Plan or are on the SEND register at your primary school) your parents/carers will be invited (through your primary school) to our SEND coffee morning.

This gives your parents or carers the opportunity to meet the team who will be working with you, to learn about the support available and to ask any questions. This will help us to work with your parents/carers to support you throughout your time at Silverdale.





Transition days

Wednesday 25 June, 9.15am – 3.00pm and Thursday 26 June, 9.15am – 3.00pm

You will join us for two days at Silverdale School, along with all new Year 7 students. You will experience a variety of taster lessons, meet your new teachers and school staff, have the opportunity to make new friends and explore your new school. This is a vital part of the transition process and it is our intention that you leave the days excited to start at Silverdale.

You will arrive at school by 9.15am each day, where you will be met by the Head of Year 7. At the end of the day, you will make your own way home.

Our Year 10 Ambassadors will escort you around school. They will also be attached to your form group when you start school in September so you will already know an older student who will be able to help you settle in.

In order to be prepared for transition days you should:

- Bring a pen, pencil and ruler.
- · Wear your own clothes.
- Wear footwear that is suitable for PE activities.
- Bring a packed lunch. If you are entitled to free school meals, you will receive a packed lunch from school.

We offer a fantastic choice of main meals, street food grab pots, sandwiches, jacket potatoes, cakes, desserts and drinks. You will pay for your lunch using your dinner card or fingerprint. You can top up with cash at school, or your parents/carers can upload money via ParentPay.



Tops

- Black polo shirt with a school logo

 - **black tailored skirts**: not denim or tube style, professional dress.
- Plain black tights: no patterns or holes.
- Flat, plain, black shoes: no white or coloured logos, soles or markings.

You will always change into PE kit, when you have a PE lesson. The kit that you need to have is given opposite. See the website for optional items.


- Black or grey Silverdale PE t-shirt or

Mobile phones and technology (September 2025)

As a Year 7 student joining us in September 2025, you should not bring smartphones, smartwatches or headphones to school; they are 'banned items'. A smartphone is a phone that allows users to access the internet and download apps.

You may bring a 'non-smart' or 'feature-free' phone in

your bag so that you can contact your parents or friends on your journey to and from school.

If you have a medical or specific learning need that requires the use of a smartphone, then please ask your parents or carers to contact us.

If your parent or carer needs to contact you urgently they will be able to by calling the school reception, who will pass on the message.




We expect you will join at least one extracurricular club in Year 7. Clubs are an excellent way for your to try a new skill and get to know new people.
