# Learning at Eckington – the 'thinking school'


The *thinking school* is all about ensuring that everyone who enters the classroom is 100% focused on guaranteeing that students receive a high-quality education.

We make sure that the curriculum is well structured, that lessons are well taught, and that every student receives due care and attention. This means that every teacher has thought about where the individual lesson sits in the learning journey, and why the students are being asked to engage in the learning activities which have been selected.

We include *speak its* and *write its* in lessons so that we are able to check individual student understanding and their ability to articulate that understanding. We can therefore ensure that our next lesson is the result of our *thinking* and take into account student prior learning and individual needs. It is about making sure that noone gets left behind.

The thinking school is about ensuring that attitudes to learning, and student behaviours create a positive environment and generate positive experiences for all. It is the daily experience of students in school that results in learning, so it is important to emphasise that it also involves thinking about the individual child as a whole. This includes the responsibilities of the form tutors and our pastoral team. Our aim is to make sure that every child feels safe and happy – and is in the best possible position to learn.

We chose the concept of the *thinking school* because we expect everyone to *think* about what they are doing, why they are doing it and what impact they will have upon themselves and others by doing it.



### A broad and balanced curriculum

At Eckington, we are committed to providing a broad and balanced curriculum that allows every student to excel and be the very best version of themselves. This equips them with the knowledge, skills, and strength of character necessary for success in an ever-changing world and to live exceptional lives.

Our core value lies in the belief of 'Outstanding Achievement for All' and where a culture of excellent teaching and learning is fundamental to our students' growth and development. We pride ourselves on making a positive impact on the personal development of each student, valuing the uniqueness and potential of every individual who walks through our doors. Our dedicated staff work collaboratively as a professional community, ensuring that every student receives the support they need to achieve their full potential.

#### Key Stage 3 (Years 7, 8 and 9)

During key stage 3, all our students follow a comprehensive programme of subjects aimed at providing them with essential skills in literacy, numeracy, and oracy. Our curriculum includes a wide range of subjects such as art, character education, design technology, drama, English, food technology, geography, history, ICT, mathematics, modern languages, music, physical education, religious education, and science.

#### Key Stage 4 (Years 10 and 11)

In Year 9, students select their optional subjects for key stage 4, which they start to study in Year 10. Our students have the opportunity to pursue traditional GCSE courses alongside vocational qualifications. Core subjects include English (English language and literature), mathematics, science, character development, and physical education. All students also study at least one humanities subject (geography or history) or a modern foreign language (French or German). Optional subjects encompass a diverse range including business, product design, drama, fine art, health and fitness, health and social care, hospitality and catering, imedia, media studies, music, performing arts, photography, physical education and religious studies.

#### The Sixth Form (Years 12 and 13)

As an 11 to 18 school, we are proud of the students who choose to continue their education with us into Years 12 and 13. Based in our dedicated Sixth Form Centre, students study from a range of over 20 A-level and equivalent courses. We provide early and on-going guidance to identify post-18 destinations for all our students, and through a strong careers service and guaranteed work experience, we help Eckington Sixth Formers achieve their goals.

We are dedicated to ensuring that our curriculum evolves to meet the ever-changing needs of our students, enabling them to thrive and succeed in a complex and dynamic world. We are committed to fostering a love for learning and personal development, nurturing individuals who are not only academically proficient but also possess the resilience and character required to lead fulfilling and exceptional lives.



# Beyond the classroom

We believe that school is more than attending lessons and students should be given opportunities to develop skills and interests outside the classroom. We call these 'enrichment clubs'.

We run an extensive number of enrichment clubs throughout the school year with some during lunch time and others after school. The expectation is that every student will take part in at least one enrichment club per term. This is not a finite list and others will run based on staff availability but some of the activities on offer will include:

- Book/reading lunch

- Derbyshire Schools' Book Award
- Duke of Edinburgh's Award (Year 10)
- Football
- Games club
- Greenhouse club
- Netball
- Photography
- STEM club (science)

In addition to these activities, there are also many student leadership opportunities across the school. Previously students have applied to become student committee representatives, wellbeing ambassadors, anti-bullying ambassadors and house captains. These roles provide students with the opportunity to develop

skills such as resilience, teamwork, communication and organisation.

There will be opportunities for enrichment trips within subjects to enhance the taught curriculum, some of which may be residential. Some trips have included visits to the Yorkshire Sculpture Park, Etihad Stadium, York Minster and Shambles, Bletchley Park, Civil War History Museum, Chatsworth House, CERN (a residential trip to the the European Organisation for Nuclear Research), Alton Towers and many more.







# Care, wellbeing and safeguarding

At Eckington School, nothing is more important to us than the safety, happiness, and personal development of every child in our care. We are committed to providing a nurturing environment where every student can thrive.

Our strong pastoral team includes a dedicated year group pastoral support assistant and experienced key phase leaders. Additionally, we aim for every student's form tutor to stay with them throughout their time at Eckington, offering support, guidance, and encouragement.

Safeguarding is at the heart of 'The Eckington Way'. Our trained professionals are always available to support both students and families. We regularly share advice and information to help families support their child at home.

By working in partnership with families, we ensure that every child feels safe, supported, and ready to learn so that they can grow into kind, confident, and resilient individuals with a strong moral compass and 'good character'.

#### Personal development and life skills

We prepare our young people not just for exams, but for life. Through our carefully planned PSHCE (personal, social, health, citizenship and economic) curriculum, students learn how to stay safe, make wise choices, and confidently navigate the challenges that life can bring, both in school and beyond.

Eckington young people learn how to recognise healthy relationships in all aspects of life. They learn how to spot when something isn't right and how to seek help when they need it.

We support Eckington students to dream big. High-quality careers education is woven throughout their time at school, giving them a clear sense of what's possible and how to get there – turning their ambitions into reality.

#### **Learning Support**

Our Learning Support Department offers a caring and supportive environment that aims to help all our students achieve to the best of their ability.

Established to help remove barriers to learning, the team is led by the school's special educational needs and disabilities co-ordinator (SENDCo), the SEND manager, and other experts including our invaluable team of teaching assistants. The team works closely with subject teachers and external agencies to remove any barriers to learning, allowing our students to become independent and resilient learners.

Our provision varies from ensuring we deliver *quality first teaching* in the classroom, targeted support both in and outside lessons, to long term personalised provision to support students with specific disabilities.

Support, wherever it is needed, is individual to the student. It is provided for those students who have significant difficulties in making academic, emotional, and social progress when compared to their peers.

The team welcomes enquiries from parents and carers. They aim to work closely with all our families, consulting with them on a regular basis to review and improve the support offered using a personalised support plan for each student.
