No Community Is Immune

Climate change is already harming communities and systems essential to life in Australia, and millions of people across the continent will be threatened by heatwaves, megafires, rising seas and other harms in a rapidly warming world.

That's the sobering message delivered in Australia's first National Climate Risk Assessment. Andrew B. Watkins, Associate Research Scientist in Climate Science, Monash University, and his colleagues helped author the assessment and say climate change will touch every corner of the continent – from homes to health, and the economy to the environment. No community or individual is immune.

'Cascading, compounding': five key takeaways from Australia's national climate risk assessment

The report, released on Monday by the Albanese government, looked at 10 "priority hazards" such as bushfires, flooding and extreme heat and the risks they presented all across Australia's way of life – from its oceans to its communities and the country's economy.

Here are five important takeaways from the report.

1. Everybody and everything will be affected

What's clear from the report is that every aspect of life in Australia is being disrupted and changed. Nothing is

spared, with an overwhelming array of impacts that cut across each other.

The risk to eight "key systems" are assessed in the report, from the economy, food systems and communities to health, national security, First Nations peoples, transport, energy and the natural environment.

2. Heat-related deaths spiral

Heatwaves are identified as the climate hazard already causing the most deaths, with 1,202 estimated fatalities between 1967 and 2022. But at 2C of global heating, the risks escalate steeply.

For example, the report suggests annual heat-related deaths would go up by 190% in Sydney and 126% in Melbourne compared with today's levels.

3. Expect worsening coastal flooding

Global heating would push up sea levels around the planet as ice sheets and glaciers melt and the warmer ocean expands.

One headline figure from the report is that by 2050, more than 1.5 million people would be living in areas around the country that would be hit by rising sea levels and coastal flooding

4. The economic cost of climate change

The report makes clear that the economic costs of worsening climate hazards such as bushfires, storms and floods will be substantial.

According to the report, the costs of extreme weather have more than tripled over the past three decades "with the rate of growth of the financial impact of extreme weather outpacing the rate of economic growth.

5. Our natural environment is not coping

Australians share the country with a stunning array of habitats and unique species that have not evolved to live in a country where the climate conditions change so quickly.

"The pace and scale of projected climate change will move beyond the realms of recorded experience, making it difficult to predict outcomes with certainty," the report says.

Across marine, land and freshwater environments, there has already been recorded signs of ecosystem collapse in at least 17 ecosystems.

One million homes could become effectively uninsurable by 2050, while the costs of insurance for others could rise dramatically.

The warning for housing was part of the most comprehensive assessment of climate impacts to Australia undertaken by the federal government.

Lambs Ear's

Plant Lamb's Ears as a hardy garden border. When in flower they attract bees and other pollinating garden insects.

Lambs Ear, (Stachys byzantina) is a spreading evergreen herbaceous perennial. It is part of the Lamiaceae or mints family and is native to Iran and the Balkans. Lambs Ear is a very hardy fast spreading groundcover that has soft and furry silver green foliage. During Spring into Summer lavender purple flower spikes appear above the foliage. Lambs Ear prefers a full sun to part shade position in the garden with well-drained soil. They are drought tolerant once established.

edible – young leaves in salad, steamed as a green, battered ('lambari' in Brazil), stir fried

medicinal – Homegrown antibacterial bandage speeds up the healing of cuts. Squash leaves and put on bee stings and insect bites.

sensory gardens – great in children's gardens and healing gardens – people love to feel the thick felt-like leaves

Community input needed for Winchelsea Swimming Pool to be at its best

Part 4 of 4 weekly parts: An opinion piece on community involvement in the Winchelsea Swimming Pool project

Earlier this year I created a detailed survey for the community to have an opportunity to voice their interests in this respect. We had just over 200 respondents (I was hoping for 1000). Some of the results (which I have shared with the Surfcoast Shire) were:

- A request for a much longer season length: The new pool will be heated, and residents would like to see the pool open for longer. 14 weeks a year is not long enough. A popular option was opening from October or early November to the end of April. I note that the Surfcoast Shire has already made public that the season length of the Winchelsea Pool will not change for the 2025/6 season which is disappointing. Especially after spending 8.9 million dollars and having the pool closed for 2 years. One would hope that a budget review and increase of the allocated funds for operational costs would naturally follow such a revamp project of this scale. Why upgrade it for the townsfolk to look at it through closed doors and a wire fence and not be able to develop and use it to its maximum capacity?
- Interest in an early morning lap swimming option (for example 2- 3 days a week): A split shift in opening hours with an early morning lap swimming session from 6.30am 11.30am available midweek (examples could include either a Mon, Wed, Fri, or a Tues and Thur) would enable people to get some fitness and lap swimming in before work, and would also cater to others who would like to access the pool for fitness (after school drop off at 9am for example). Parents of toddlers and pre-school children could also go for a morning swim before the heat of the day set in, and before their little ones nap time.
- Remaining open later than 6pm on hot days: This would also be possible with a split shift option as discussed above. Open hours from 6.30am – 11.30, and then again from 3.30pm - 7.30pm would enable patrons time to access the pool after work and school for example. The Secondary school buses don't return to town until between 4.30 and 5pm, and 9-5 workers who travel also don't return until after 5.30 so it is just common sense to have the pool remain open later so people can get their exercise in after 5.30pm. Day light savings and light availability is obviously a factor for consideration and safety, especially given the Shire did not include overhead lighting in their revamp plans (why not do I hear anyone ask?? Let me get in early and suggest we include overhead light installation in next years budget please!). It is however generally still light till between 7 and 7.30pm even in Early April.

- Offering learn to swim sessions in 4th term and 1st term in addition to the standard 2 week long VicSwim summer holiday intensive: Residents commented that it would be nice to not have to travel 30km for swimming lessons for their children, and that they would love to be able to access an after school learn to swim program locally. With so many young families moving to this area, the need for this is only going to grow in future years.
- Offering Hydrotherapy and gentle water exercise classes for injury management, seniors exercise classes, the mobility impaired and anyone who loves water aerobics! There is so much scope for providing a water exercise class that is suitable for seniors, and those suffering from mobility impairment. Water aerobics and hydrotherapy is also a fun and fabulous activity for general fitness that can be accessed by all ages. For people suffering Osteoarthritis and Osteoporosis, gentle water exercise is often the best and safest option available due to the benefits that buoyancy and warm water provides. With an at capacity nursing / retirement home in town, and many elderly people living in the community a program like this an obvious no brainer.

I believe there is a solid argument for local council to consider extending the season length and hours of operation in future years. Four key reasons are:

- Population growth and rising demand justify extended pool hours, including early mornings, to accommodate work schedules, schools, carers, and fitness routines.
- 2. Health benefits for ageing or mobility-limited residents and those accessing hydrotherapy or gentle exercise programs should not depend on distant facilities.
- Equity and fairness: Torquay, because of its coastal appeal, garners outsized public investment. Winchelsea, though inland, is emerging as a significant centre and deserves proportional support.
- Alleviating pressure on overcrowded beaches: A local pool that's open longer reduces reliance on congested surf areas, improves water safety, and supports year-round physical activity.

While Torquay rightly receives investment for world-class aquatic facilities, Winchelsea's rapidly growing population, lack of local wellness infrastructure, and logistical challenges merit greater funding. Extending season length, providing early-morning lap lanes, and expanding swim and therapy options would significantly enhance access to health, wellbeing, and recreation. This fairly and sustainably addresses community needs.



Haidee Benning grew up in Winchelsea during the 70s and 80s riding horses, playing netball and swimming at the local pool. At 18 the pull of the sea called her to the coastal townships of Anglesea, Aireys Inlet and Torquay where she worked for the next 6 years not only in education and childcare but also in healthcare as a Remedial and Sports massage therapist.

As a long term Yoga and Qi Gung practitioner she has also recently included the healing art of Zen Thai Shiatsu Therapy to her practice. In 2024 Haidee had another opportunity to travel and she currently divides her time between Phnom Penh in Cambodia, and Winchelsea. When she is back in town, she still works at the local Osteopathic clinic and enjoys re-connecting with the local community, both in Winchelsea, along the Surfcoast and in Port Fairy.

The Surf Coast Shire has also recently published their own survey on the Winchelsea Pool which is open for community feedback until 25th August. This Survey is limited and does not provide much room or scope and breadth for commentary. It is mostly focused on getting feedback around cutting operational costs further through cost savings on staff wages by closing on poor weather days (temperature colder than 22 degrees) whilst making a loose suggestion these savings may enable opening after 6pm on hot days. Whilst I am not opposed to this cost saving idea, I would like to know how the Shire's management committee can assure the community that the suggested trade off of the pool being opened till 7pm – 7.30pm on hot days is in fact going to happen. Otherwise we will just see the pool closed even more, reliant entirely on the type of summer we get weather wise.

The Surfcoast Shire website states that "revamping the facility presents an opportunity to revitalise community use of this great space. The Winchelsea pool is a community facility and community space that needs ongoing community involvement. The future of the Winchelsea pool could involve pool parties or exercise programs; using the space as a venue for outdoor movies or community celebrations; or the formation of a volunteer group involved in operations or working bees. The sky is the limit!"

If you are a local resident and ratepayer of Winchelsea or its hinterland region, please reach out to the Surfcoast Shire and offer your feedback on this matter. Every voice counts. And if you don't speak up, and there is an apathetic response, it does nothing to encourage local council to go into bat for us to support initiatives such as those suggested above.

I hope some of the community spirit that has ignited action to succeed in projects like that of the Mud Hut's re-mudding, or the ongoing advocacy of the "Growing Winchelsea" organisation, the coming together of people in support of the Share Shed and gardening groups, produce swaps etc may extent an inspiration, vision and commitment to seeing this wonderful venue become all that it could be for the people who live here. If you want to be able to use the pool more than 14 weeks a year, outside the hours of 12pm – 6pm, now is the time to start speaking up. If you want increased access to swimming lessons for your children or exercise options at times that you can actually attend, please tell the Shire. If you don't have room on their limited response / feedback questionnaire, then send them an email as well!

The Saving Grace of Time Spent Together at Playgroup

Playgroup Victoria has done a write up about Winchelsea playgroup, which Winchelsea playgroup is sharing here split across several editions of the Star due to its length. Here is the link to the full article: playgroupblog.org/winchelsea-playgroup

The uncontrollable comes. Sometimes in small waves. sometimes the waves come crashing, as it was for Danni who had her child in a frenzy of unknowns, born at 29 weeks premature.

Aside from the physical toll that takes on both mother and child, the emotional strain is long lasting.

Danni's small community of Winchelsea rallied around her family when they were able to bring home their daughter, Evelyn, for the first time.

After five months in a neonatal intensive care unit (NICU) and the Ronald McDonald House, it was another big adjustment.

While others stared 'out of curiosity' at the oxygen tank and feeding tube Danni's precious baby had, her local community chose kind action. They held fundraisers and had a meal train going so that Danni and her family of four, who had been separated for a large chunk of time, tag teaming it to and from the hospital, could focus on being just thata family at home, resettling.

"I will never forget it," said Danni. "It has changed my life, for the good and also- it was a negative thing- but I have been able to empower so many people with information around the journey."

Danni, like her community, has gone on to rally around others. She rates community as the most important thing. It was one of the reasons her family chose to move to Winchelsea in the first place. Previously, in the bigger regional city of Geelong, they were in the rat race. They had no yard and lived right next to their neighbours but didn't know them.

In Geelong and Winchelsea, playgroup has had a significant role in creating a



sense of comfort, reassurance. distraction and fun for Danni and her family.

"I love it. I have met some really amazing people through playgroup, bringing people together."

"Charlie for example had just moved to Winch, I randomly saw her at the café and we had playgroup that day. Both of our daughters, my second born Evelyn, was a micro prem and so was Charlie's daughter Aria, so we connected over that but she didn't know anyone in town, they had been here for three weeks, so that is why I do it because I think it is really important to have connectionconnection to community, connection to other families and other children. I just have made some really great friends and connections through playgroup which I am very fortunate to have."

Charlie won't forget that small act of kindness when Danni invited her to come along to playgroup.

"Having this [playgroup] here has opened up so many doors and so many friendships for Aria which is huge. She is an only child, and she will only ever be an only child, so it is so important for us to make sure she has got a community of peers that she can grow up with.

"That is why we moved to Winchelsea because of the community and then this has just made everything a hundred times better."

Charlie and Danni both had similar rocky starts- their daughters born at 27-29 weeks.

"It's crazy," said Charlie.

"That was our first experience. That is our first child and that was our first experience of dealing with anything like that and being thrown into intensive care."

"We had a really rough start so anything for her to engage with people is huge for us because

we had three months of isolation with her, so we were always really worried about how she would interact with others and stuff like that. Having this playgroup is just amazing, so incredible for her and having that connection with Evy. They both weighed 602 grams when they were born, both of them. It just blows my mind that they were exactly the same."

One thing often overlooked is the ongoing challenges premature babies endure, alongside their families. Evelyn had grommet surgery and has others upcoming. Aria has regular appointments at the Royal Children's to get her heart checked.

"It was, for us, it was all about community then. It was the support that we had that made us rethink our whole lifestyle of where we were, where we didn't have a community connection and that is why we chose to move to Winchelsea for community. This really helped us and solidified we have done the right thing by coming here to engage with this community."

"They are all really supportive and I don't know- everyone is like family so it's great."

Soft plastics recycling is back!

Drop off clean, dry soft plastic packaging at no charge at the Anglesea Transfer Station.

Soft plastics can be scrunched in your hand – like chip packets, plastic bags, and cling film. They also include thicker plastics like pet food bags and squeeze pouches.

This service is open to households only - commercial quantities not accepted.

Householders can drop off 0.5m3 (equivalent of five large household garbage bags). Larger amounts will be charged at \$18/m3 to help cover recycling costs.

Soft plastics include items such as:

- ✓ Bread bags
- ✓ Bubble wrap (clear and coloured)
- ✓ Cereal bags (the bag that holds the cereal)
- ✓ Chocolate & other confectionary wrappers/bags
- ✓ Cling wrap/plastic film

- ✓ Coffee bean bags with zip lock (remove zip lock)
- ✓ Document sleeves
- ✓ Fresh fruit and veggie produce bags
- √ Frozen food bags
- ✓ Garden fertiliser bags (must be empty)
- Magazine and newspaper clear wrapping
- Mesh bags (the ones holding oranges, onions)
- ✓ Pet food bags



Quick Response Grants To Boost Projects

Mental health, community gardening, and emergency response projects are among community-led initiatives to receive boosts from Surf Coast Shire Council's 2025 Quick Response Grants program.

They are among 14 projects to receive funding allocations up to \$3,000 following a competitive submission process.

Cr Tony Phelps congratulated successful applicants.

"We hope these grants, with quick turnaround time, can make significant differences across a great range of projects," Cr Phelps said.

"The submissions received represented so much good work going on in our community."

Quick Response Grant Program recipients are:

- Aireys Inlet Community Garden, \$2,690, to replace unproductive garden beds with two wicking beds.
- All Aboard DisABILITY Services, \$1,476 for wearable microphones and chargers for theatre projects empowering adults with disability to express themselves through performance.
- Torquay Netball Club, \$2,560 for 9-and-under team equipment including bibs, balls, whistles and magnetic coaches' board.
- Deans Marsh Community Cottage, \$1,500 for community screening of the film Just A Farmer, to support mental health awareness and reduce stigma.
- Moriac Community Network, \$3,000 for creation of community garden spaces to bring people together and learn about growing food at Moriac and District Community Hub.
- Torquay Marine Rescue Service, \$3,000 for new emergency response equipment including

- primary response and oxygen therapy kits and a spine board.
- Ocean Mind, \$2980 for purchase of four surfboards to increase the capacity of the therapeutic program supporting young people facing mental health challenges.
- Torquay and District Landcare, \$2,000 for purchase of a defibrillator to be stored in the Landcare trailer for events and community access.
- Common Ground Project, \$2,562 for regenerative farming community equipment including accessible and inclusive equipment to build volunteering capacity.
- Torquay Fire Brigade, \$2,156 for a defibrillator to be mounted at the front of Torquay Fire Station.
- Art of the Minds, \$1,567 for purchase of a public address system for use during events including Mental Health Week, replacing need to hire.
- Anglesea Community House, \$840 for a project bringing together occasional care and men's shed



members creating a street library for Anglesea community.

- Torquay College, \$2,000 for transport and equipment for a bush blitz project taking students onto Country to learn about, track, study and manage local biodiversity.
- Surf Coast Secondary College, \$1,500 for R U OK? Day merchandise for a school event promoting connection and mental health awareness.

Unsuccessful Quick Response Grant applicants have received information on other ways they might be able to seek support for their projects, including Council's September grants round which is now open.

Community Feedback Helping Shape New Winchelsea Pool Season

Surf Coast Shire Council is reviewing operating hours for the new Winchelsea Pool in response to community sentiment.

Community members shared preferences for summer season operations through a recent Council survey, calling for consistent opening hours across school terms and holidays.

Respondents also called for introduction of a closure temperature threshold, with closures on colder days potentially allowing for longer opening on hotter days, weekends or public holidays.

Council's consultation was scoped on the approved 2025-26 pool operating budget which sets the total amount of time the pool can open for the season.

"We thank community members for having shared preferences and thoughts during our engagement, and we appreciate their wishes to make the most of this wonderful new community asset," Cr Tony Phelps said.

"Along with feedback relating to operating hours, people expressed strong interest in swimming lessons, school programs and introduction of lap lanes, improved accessibility features, and better communication of opening hours.

"Council is now considering a range of adjustments within the adopted 2025-26 pool operating budget as we prepare for opening of the new summer season in late November."

As a result of the feedback, Council will:

- Review opening times, with a focus on consistent hours across school terms and holidays, within budget limitations.
- Trial a weather temperature threshold for closure of the pool, potentially 18 to 20 degrees.
- Consider expanding programming of Vicswim and school-based programs.

- Investigate introduction of dedicated lap swimming lanes.
- Introduce a dedicated Winchelsea Pool social media page to share program information, opening hours and advance notice of temperature threshold closures.
- Continue working with Council's Youth Team to offer free lifequard training and look to recruit graduates from this program into lifeguard roles.

The new pool was opened in February 2025 following an \$8.9 million redevelopment. The new summer season is planned to run from late November 2026 to early March 2026 and opening times will be finalised and communicated by mid-October.

Opening hours for the 2024/2025 season were 10am to 5pm on weekends, and 3pm to 7pm Monday to Friday. The former pool was open noon to 6pm, seven days a week.



St Thomas Anglican Church Winchelsea has a new Vicar - The Reverend Chris Duff



The Stained Glass Windows at St Thomas **Dedicated to the Austin Children**

Previous weeks' articles have focused on the Austin Family who founded Barwon Park in Winchelsea.

Elizabeth Austin of Barwon park was a well known Philanthropist long after her husband, Thomas passed away. Elizabeth and Thomas' First son, also called Thomas, was sent to England in his early teens for Boarding school in the 1 850s.

At this time it would have taken him between 50 and 70 days on a sailing ship to get from Geelong to London. Sailing in those times was dangerous and many passengers died at sea from various ship-borne diseases, storms and shipwrecks.

During his time in England, Thomas James Austin became III and in 1 861 the Austin family and their servants and friends took a ship from Geelong to go visit him in England. On the way there, their young daughter Emily died on board the ship and was buried at sea. The Austins had already lost another daughter, Sophia Jane in infancy in 1 852.

When the Austins returned to Winchelsea in 1 964 after three years in England, the entire town and representatives of surrounding parishes such as Birregurra, Murdeduke, Mirnane, Tutugong, Carunge-Mirnong lake, Lake Wollard, and Modewarre. Banners and streamers were hung around town and weeks of preparation went into making costumes for children and decorations for the town.


When the Austins arrived in Winchelsea, they were greeted with signs saying "Welcome Home" and "God Bless our Friends". Bunches of flowers were left

as offerings to celebrate their return and a large arch was built between the shops and the bottom pub with decorations on it for the Austins.

From there a speech was delivered by Rev. Tanner, welcoming the Austins home, and the Austins were escorted back to Barwon Park by the marching band, a cavalcade of horses and a parade of horse drawn carriages. The effort seen to have been put into this ceremony would indicate that the Austin family were highly regarded and well liked by the people of Winchelsea.

To commemorate their three lost children, Thomas and Elizabeth Austin commissioned the three stained glass windows at St. Thomas Church in Winchelsea. Those beautiful works of art are still present in St. Thomas church and can be seen by the people of Winchelsea today from inside the church. In 1 864 the windows were officially unveiled with a large public procession through Winchelsea lead by the local brass band.

The Austins continued to support the local church and Elizabeth Austin continued to patronise the church and its contributions to the community long after her husband's death.
