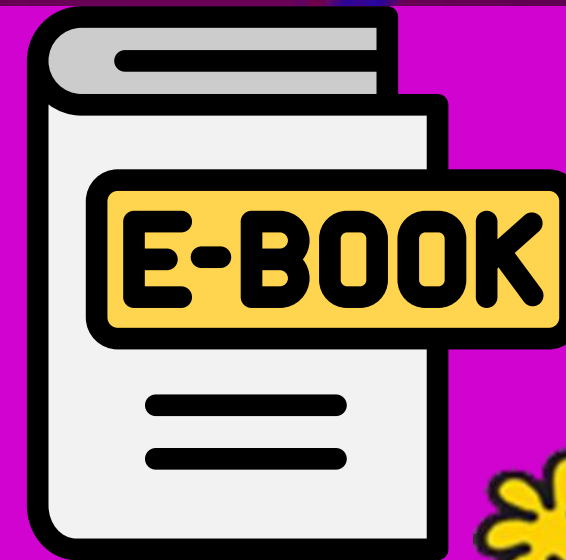


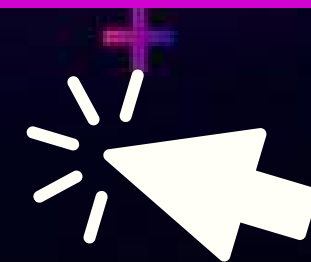

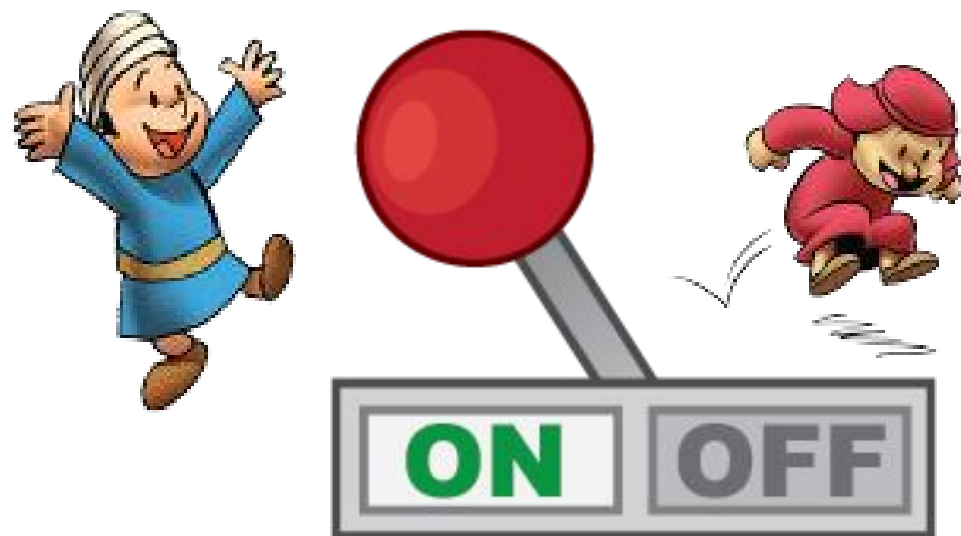

Mazal Tov! The Last Parsha!

We finally made it to Parshas V'Zos HaBrachah, the last of the 54 Parshiyos of the Torah.



You probably know that we read each Parsha in Shul on Shabbos. But this Parsha doesn't have its own Shabbos.

So, if we don't read it on **SHABBOS**, when DO we read it?

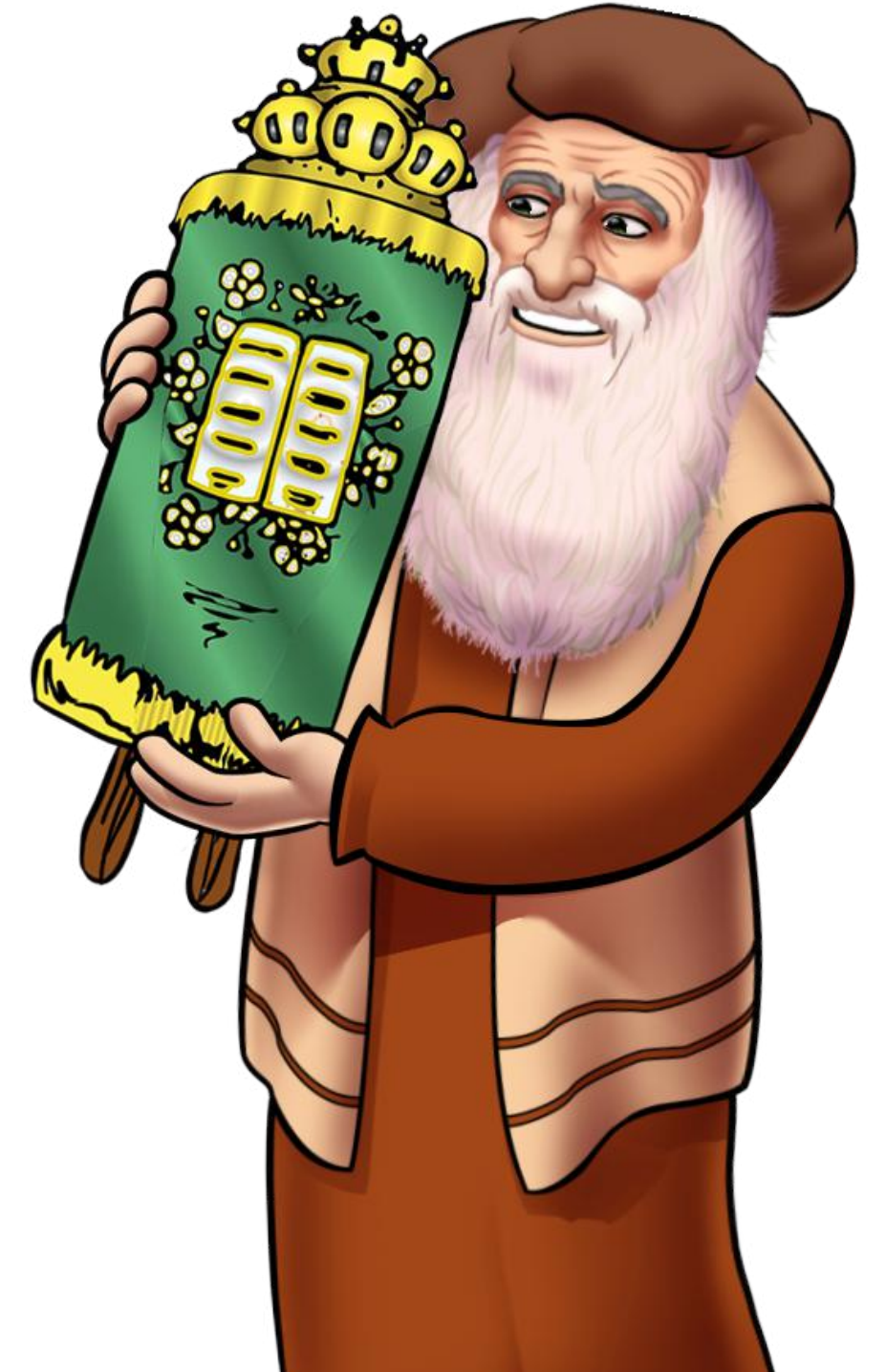

We read this Parsha on a special Yom Tov called **SIMCHAS TORAH**, which means “**HAPPINESS OF THE TORAH.**”

We are so incredibly happy because we've learned the entire Torah this past year, and now, we're super excited to start all over again.

Indeed, V'Zos HaBrachah is a short Parsha, but it's filled with **BRACHOS** - wonderful **BLESSINGS**, that Moshe gave to the 12 Shevatim (tribes) before the end of his very long life.

Moshe Rabbeinu: Servant of HaShem

And now, let's talk about someone else who was really special - Moshe Rabbeinu!

Unlike other great people mentioned in the Torah, Moshe was described in many amazing ways!

Here are some examples:



מֹשֶׁה רַבֵּינוּ

We call him **MOSHE RABBEINU**, which means “**MOSHE OUR TEACHER**,” because he taught Bnei Yisrael the entire Torah.

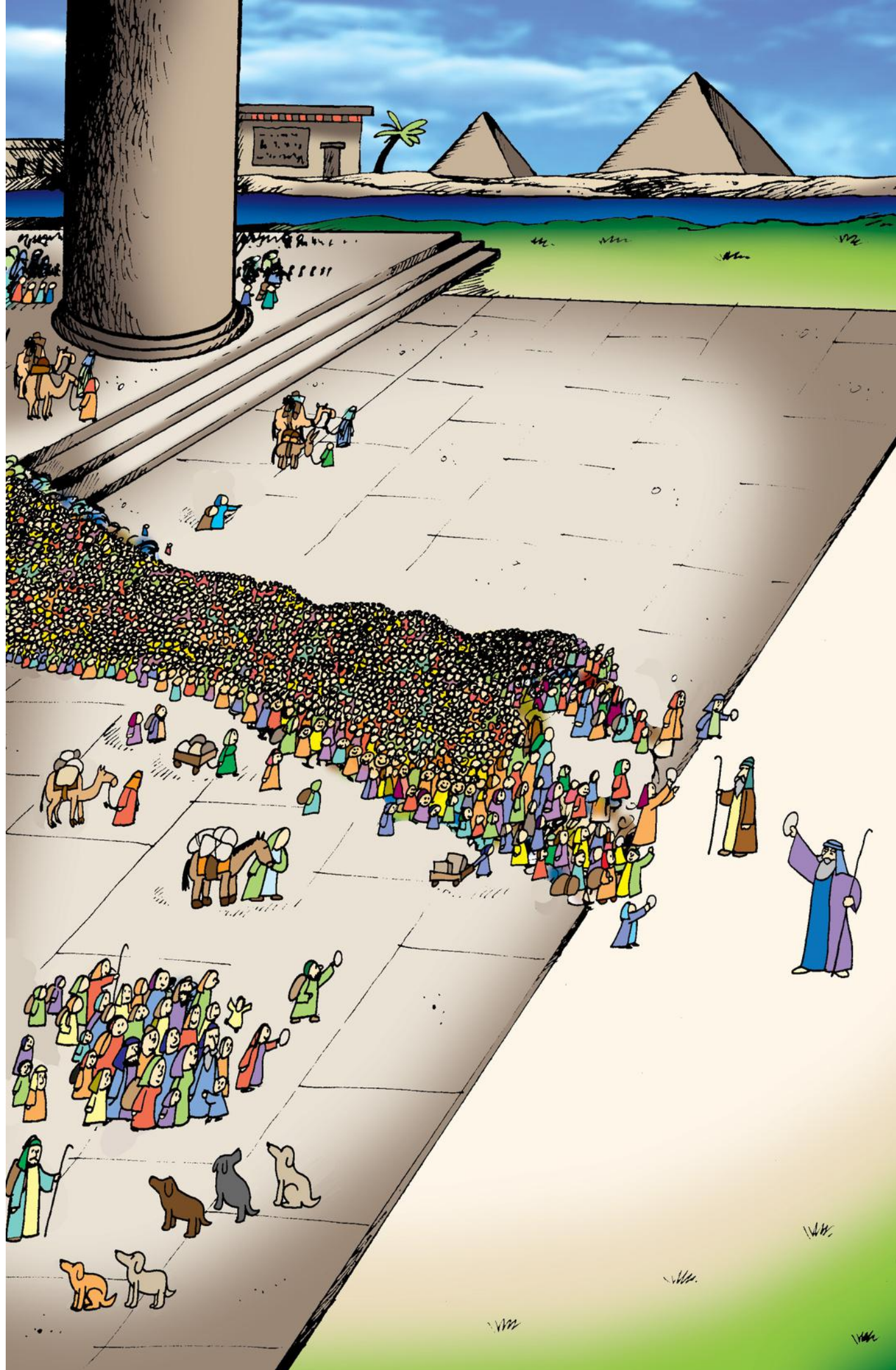
**Moshe was the only person ever
who spoke to HaShem
“face to face,”
just like we speak to our friends.**

**In this Parsha,
Parshas V’Zos HaBrachah,
he is called
“the man of HaShem.”**



**But, you know what's the
greatest thing about Moshe?**





Perhaps it's the last thing the Torah tells us about him, at the very end of the Torah:

Moshe is called **EVED HASHEM**,
“**THE SERVANT OF HASHEM.**”

Even though Moshe was incredibly special, he never thought he was better than anyone else. He saw himself as a simple servant, ready to do whatever HaShem wanted!

“Moshe taught us the Torah, which belongs to every single Jew.”**

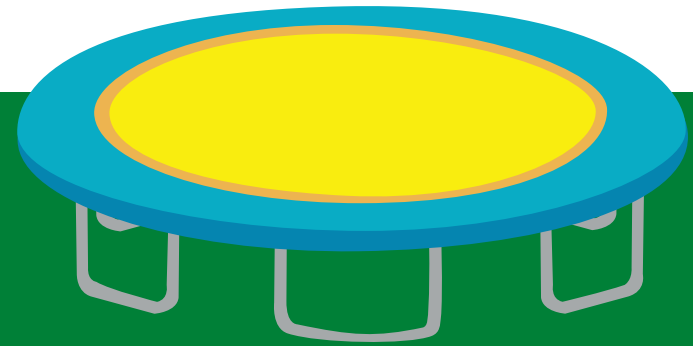


**Yes, it's true! The Torah is not only for big people like your parents.
It belongs to every Jew, you and me, and even little baby boys and girls. Isn't that amazing?**

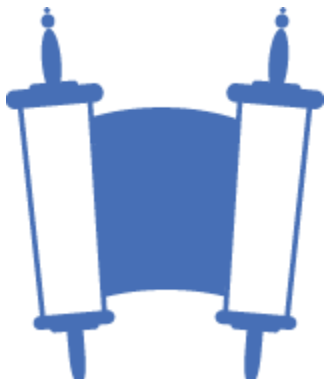

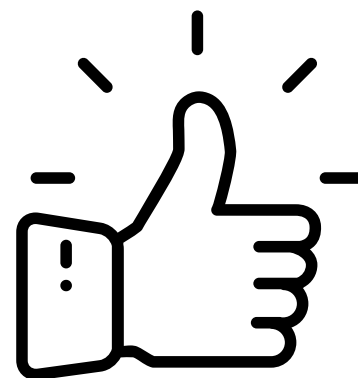

And he also saw the Tribe of Naftali bowing down to idols in the new land.

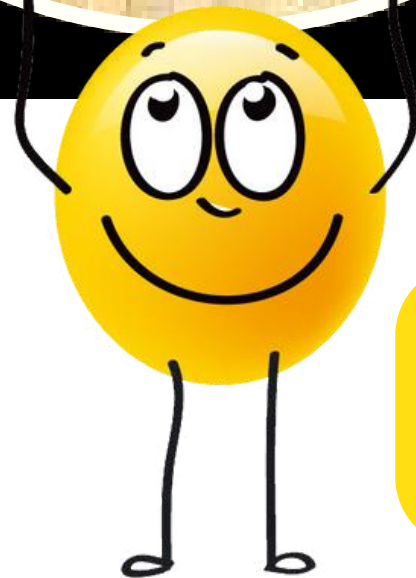

Moshe passed away in a **CAVE** on Mount Nevo, and nobody was there besides HaShem. Absolutely nobody, not even the greatest Tzadik, knows where the cave is!

Many years ago, the Romans sent soldiers on a mission to find the cave. As they climbed up the **MOUNTAIN**, they looked down and said excitedly to each other:

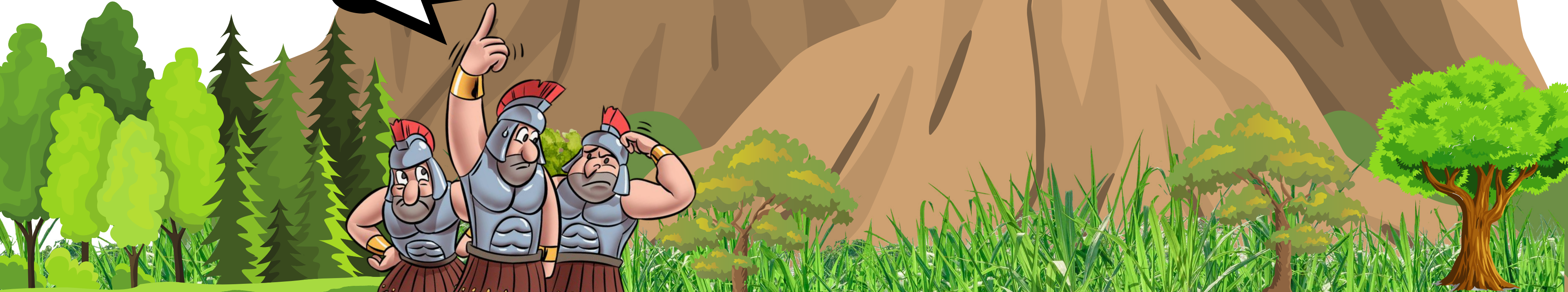


We climbed too high, it's down there. Let's go guys!

and pointed.**

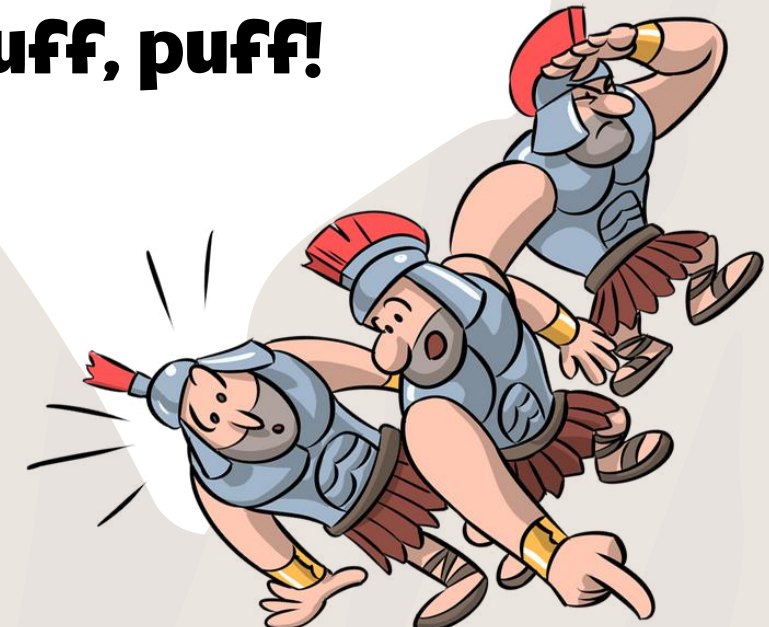


**Whoops! We went too

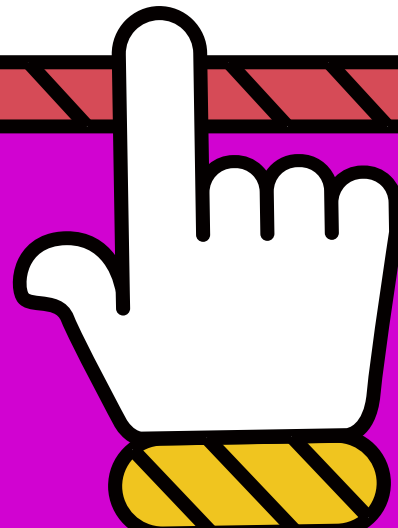
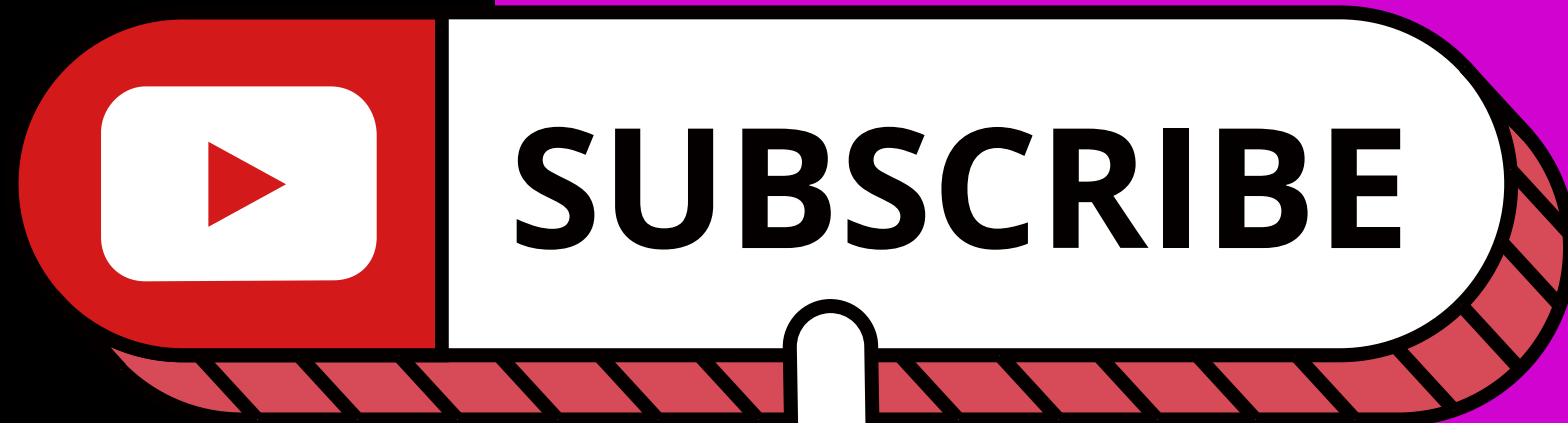
