This coverage will also provide liability protection at any Charlotte Squadron sanctioned activity, such as the upcoming Children's Outing at Red Fez Club. We have also agreed to purchase a yacht policy that will provide liability coverage to members and their guests again during sanctioned Squadron activities. This policy is being covered with donated monies.

Another change that I'm instituting is that our monthly squadron meetings will be social times to indulge in conversations and catching up with one another. There will be announcements provided to all in attendance in lieu of having various officer reports.

### Boat show means long hours, interesting stores for P/C Moore



Talk to him about the show and he's loaded with stories. This year Moore showed Piper Haycock how to use the boating trainer and there was no looking back.

Piper is the 14-year-old daughter of Shaun Haycock, America's Boating Club-Charlotte's new Executive Committee member. Moore says that he and Piper worked in tandem.

Now there are fewer families at the boat show and more individuals and pals looking at the latest equipment or thinking about buying a boat, Moore says. Those groups at the boat show may be good targets for ABC-Charlotte but families are right in our crosshairs for recruitment for classes and memberships, Moore says.

Moore will work it out, though. He's always at the booth during the show talking to potential members and solving problems.

### Row, Row, Row your Boat: A Saga about Boat Building

It has always been my dream to build a boat. But what kind?

A kit sounded feasible, so in August of 2015 I attended a boat building class at the WoodenBoat School in Brooklin, Maine, to learn the stitch-and-glue process from the owner of Chesapeake Light Craft. In September I bought two 26' rowboat kits from this company with no clear plan as to how it would work to build these boats in my garage.

I knew that I had the skills but how would I maneuver these boats without help? Fortunately, my friends and fellow boat lovers stepped up. First in line was David Osmolski who received my shipment at his company loading dock which saved me a bunch of money. The kits were then loaded into Ken Elkins's pick-up truck and away we went to unload them at my house piece by piece.

After building four sawhorses and moving machinery in my two-car garage, I was able to fit the first boat in my garage and start work. More friends from the Charlotte Power Squadron showed up to wire, glue, sand and paint the first boat. We had "flipping parties" when it was time to turn her over for the next phase of work. I especially want to thank the late David Osmolski, Ken Elkins, Marvin Chaney, Will Granger, Kathryn Granger, Bo Ibach, Brevard Myers, the late Bill Mencel, Pat Mencel and Dan Bartel for helping out.

The first boat, *Ida Sarafina* was christened by P/D/C Paula Stewart at our River Hills barbecue in the spring of 2022. By August of 2023 the second boat, *Hazel Marietta* was completed.

During all this time I was not sure how a Squadron rowing program would work, but I knew that I did want it to somehow help our Squadron, bring in new members and serve as a focus for fun and fellowship. I initially thought that we would row on Lake Wylie but it turned out that it is much easier to do so at Cane Creek Park in Union County. This lake is much calmer, and the boat ramp is easy to get in and out of with a lot less traffic.

For three years our crew has learned how to rig the boat, get it into the water, memorize rowing commands, get the boat out of the water and unrig her. After each row we have had a debriefing session to discover how things could be done better. So here I would like to thank Ken Elkins, Marvin Chaney, Will Granger, the late Bill Mencel, Dan Bartel, Brevard Myers, Mary Myers, Dave Johnson and Warren Francois for being our crew members during these years. Their suggestions have been essential to making a better program. We have also received excellent input from members of the Belmont Rowing Center: Tom Bryant and Cindy White.

Beginning this year we have now moved into a new phase where we are inviting new rowers to join our Squadron. I have been able to recruit 4 or 5 ladies to join a group that they are calling the "Rock-on Rowers." They are a sub-group to what we are calling the "Wylie Gator Rowing Club." As you know "Wylie Gator" is our Charlotte Power Squadron mascot designed by the late Carl Foesch.

I have explained to these ladies that they need to be part of our Squadron because our Squadron members have built and will maintain these boats and that we will help train them in boating safety. Personally I have an umbrella liability policy but it is also wise for our rowing events to be covered by our Squadron liability policy as well. In return, our Squadron will receive the membership income from these rowers. As we look forward to the future we hope to attract more rowers/members to our program by expanding our advertising and spreading the word. If you are a current member and would like to try rowing (male or female) please give me a call or send me a text.



## **Educational Officer's Annual Report: Brevard Myers**

Thank you for the opportunity to serve as the Squadron Educational Officer (SEO) of America's Boating Club-Charlotte for this past year.

This year the Education Department:

- Scheduled and conducted three America's Boating Course sessions. One class was conducted at Victory Lanes Karting in north Charlotte to access students in northern Mecklenburg County previously served by Lake Norman Sail and Power Squadron. The other two classes were conducted at MarineMax Hall Marine Lake Wylie.
- A total of 48 students successfully completed our ABC courses. That is a 50% increase over 2023. Students that successfully completed the course by South Carolina protocol have their names entered into the SC Department of Natural Resources database and receive a SC DNR issued Boating Education Card.

As SEO I performed the following duties:

- Attended and gave reports at most Squadron General Membership meetings and monthly Executive Committee meetings
- Processed orders for educational materials for the planned ABC classes
- Performed clerical duties and taught at our ABC classes
