Kartini Series 3: Gender Training




The complexity of gender-related issues around us is increasingly impacting the importance of strengthening gender awareness in society. The involvement of various stakeholders in promoting the strengthening of gender awareness aspects is certainly crucial. For this reason, the Jakarta Centre for Law Enforcement Cooperation (JCLEC) remains committed to promoting gender equality and women empowerment as part of the effort to strengthen gender awareness. This commitment realized through the organization of various programs related to strengthening gender awareness.

Program Implementation

From December 2 - 6, 2024, JCLEC's commitment to promote gender awareness, especially for law enforcement officers, manifested through the implementation of the Kartini Series 3: Gender Training activity. This activity attended by 18 participants from national and international law enforcement agencies, organized with the goal of implementing JCLEC's commitment to gender awareness, women empowerment, and capacity building for gender-based activities.





To achieve these goals, the design of this program ensures that participants not only receive materials on gender awareness but also have the opportunity to share their experiences and insights. 

Dr. Haezreena Begum is well known as a criminologist and the Deputy Dean of the Faculty of Law at the University of Malaya, Malaysia. As a woman who advocates for women empowerment, Dr. Haezreena Begum has been involved in several women empowerment programs, including her participation in the International Women in CT Forum held at JCLEC from October 8-10, 2024. Additionally, she has also participated as a Subject Matter Expert (SME) in the Strengthening Women Leadership in Police Service Delivery Batch 4 program from January 20-24, 2025.



Women Empowerment

The increasing number of patriarchy cases shows that women have limited space to express themselves. This is also supported by the fact that women are often placed in supportive roles, which can significantly restrict their movement. Not only that, but even women in important positions still experience limitations in their ability to move. Often, in important decision-making processes, women holding significant positions still have limited space to participate in these decisions.

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Always remember that women have agency. Even if you're not holding any significant position, you always have your own agency. You have autonomy and right of choice.


What we need to always remember is that women always have the capacity. No matter where we are positioned as women, not just those in significant positions, we always have capacity. When we all realize that we have capacity within ourselves, it will encourage us to express ourselves to the fullest. This is also an indication of the strengthening of gender equality.

When we talk about gender equality, what often comes to mind is the similarity between what women and men do. However, we need to recognize that there are several aspects that indicate women and men have natural differences within themselves, which can potentially affect work patterns. Therefore, gender equality is not just about doing the exact same thing, but more about a situation where we have equal positions and opportunities in fulfilling rights and responsibilities.
