

### NACCC Communication: Rev. Dr. Barry W. Szymanksi

How do we deal with change? Church membership is slipping. Some churches are closing. How did Jesus' ministry grow? For one, he built the foundation of his new Kingdom on this earth through forming relationships. At first, he did so with twelve apostles, then 72 more, then with ever growing crowds. While most church models are centered around worship, many church consultants think that an alternative model of a growing church is based on relationships: loving, grace-filled covenants to be exact. Churches in this model strive to provide all types of services to promote and build relationships: through day-care, food and meal programs, card game nights, movie nights, fireside chats, educational opportunities, clothing drives, rummage, car shows, trivia nights, concert venues, shared use by other religious groups, local organization meeting sites, recreation centers, food pantries, social and service outreach, and so much more. Perhaps this is what the earliest small village synagogues, temples, mosques, and churches were all about: forming relationships. People in close relationships live in love, grace, and a spirit of gratitude for their blessings. All while staying free of judging others. Perhaps we need to bless each other more to live grace-fully with each other. When a person near us sneezes loudly most of us turn to them and in grace for them we say, 'Bless you'. Might it be time to confidently say (or perhaps just even think) the words of blessing to our spouses, our children, all our fellow congregants, in fact,

to everyone we encounter.

# Community Congregational Church Ihlenfeldt Scholarship

#### Each year the Ihlenfeldt Scholarship Fund awards \$1,000 in total to one or more deserving students!

### To qualify for this award, the student...

- 1- should be attending or have confirmed plans to enroll in post-high school studies at a college or vocational school of their choice.
- 2- should be a member of the Community Congregational Church or is a child, grandchild, great grandchild, niece, nephew, brother or sister of a Community Congregational Church member or be connected to CCC in some tangible way.
- 3- will need to write an essay on "Why I should be considered for this award".

#### Please note:

- There are no age limitations for this award so students of any age who may choose to enroll in post-high school education are eligible for this award.
- If more than one <u>equally deserving</u> student applies for this award, the scholarship funds for that year can be split.
- Students may apply for an award for each year they are in school.
- Candidates for this award should contact Lisa at the Church office for an application form. **Or on our church website:ccchurch502.com**
- The Community Congregational Church Trustees will be responsible for reading, evaluating and selecting the winning application (s).
- Applications may be submitted at any time; however the total amount of the awards will be \$1,000.00 in any one calendar year. To ensure consideration for any specific school year, applications should be submitted on or before March 1st of the year prior to the beginning of the student's post-high school education. (For 2025, the deadline will be May 2nd).
