
# Hope Valley College **Prospectus**

### Ofsted: a good school

Hope Valley College is a secondary school that offers a positively different approach.

With fewer than 600 students, we have an ambition for each and every one of our young people to be the best they can be. We achieve this through high expectations within a supportive environment. Our uniform is straightforward, practical and affordable, leaving students free to focus on their learning.

Hope Valley College was judged by Ofsted to be 'Good' in all categories in its most recent inspection, in October 2023. Our teachers, who are fair and consistent, deliver an ambitious curriculum during lessons that are calm and orderly. All students, including those with special educational needs and disabilities, feel supported.

A wide range of personal development opportunities complement our curriculum, meaning that Hope Valley students are well prepared for the next stage of their education. Outdoor activities including orienteering, weaselling and mountain biking are provided in addition to plentiful opportunities to develop leadership and teamworking skills through involvement in the student council, sports leaders, student ambassadors and many more.

Hope Valley College has been a part of Chorus Education Trust since 2019. During that time, our students have benefitted from the extra resources and expertise offered by the trust as well as teacher training and development through the South Yorkshire Teaching Hub.



### A broad and balanced curriculum

We are proud to offer a broad and balanced curriculum, which combines academic, creative and vocational subjects. Our curriculum aims to provide every student with the opportunity to succeed academically and to continue to be inquisitive, lifelong learners.

Students in key stage 3 (Years 7-9) study a broad range of subjects: English, maths, science (including biology, chemistry and physics), PE, art, design and technology (including resistant materials, systems and control, textiles design, and food), ICT and computer science, drama, music, languages, history, geography, world view (including RE and philosophy) and personal, social, health and economic education (PSHE).

Key stage 4 students are supported in making their choice of subjects to study for GCSE and vocational exams. In addition to the subjects with which they are familiar from their earlier years, they can also choose from subjects such as engineering and hospitality and catering.

#### Preparing for the next step

At Hope Valley, we help our students to acquire the skills and knowledge to progress to a wide range of destinations.

The vast majority of our students go on to further their education. 50% of our students typically do this at sixth form and move on to renowned sixth forms in the surrounding area including Silverdale School in Sheffield, Lady Manners School in Bakewell and Aquinas College in Stockport.

Around 40% of Hope Valley students usually gain places at colleges where they study A-level and vocational courses at level 3. Destinations have in the past included Cheadle and Marple Sixth Form College in Cheadle Hulme, Buxton and Leek College and Sheffield College. In addition, a number of our students also progress to agricultural colleges such as Reaseheath in Nantwich and Askham Bryan College in York.

Every year we also support students who go on to gain apprenticeships in a host of different careers.

We have the highest ambitions for our young people whatever their chosen path and we support these through high standards in their learning and teaching aspiration and ambition.



## School life that goes beyond the classroom

Our staff are passionate about providing our students with unique experiences that broaden their horizons. We want our young people to 'be the best you can be' through taking advantage of opportunities outside the classroom.

Some of our enrichment activities are core to our curriculum, such as our outdoor education programme. But our school life extends well beyond the classroom, incorporating a wide range of clubs and lots of trips and visits.

Around 40% of our students have an individual music lesson with a peripatetic teacher that takes place in school time. Students can also enjoy a wide range of traditional and contemporary sporting activities. Our location lends itself to opportunities for climbing, bouldering and cross country, and all students have access to the school's own bike pump track.

We are embedded in the local community, working in partnership on events such as heart screenings. Our whole school community comes together at the end of the school year to take part in a sponsored walk around the valley which raises money for the heart screenings and other local charities. Our students are proud to keep local traditions alive when they design and create the school well dressing that is displayed as part of Hope Wakes Week.

We run a wide range of trips, carefully designed for each key stage, to ensure that all students have opportunities to take part in experiences out of school. These include trips to the theatre, sporting events and fixtures, science, technology, engineering and maths (STEM) activities and our ever popular Duke of Edinburgh's Award scheme.

Nothing is too much trouble. The school makes sure that the children don't miss out on anything. Anything they can possibly help with, they will. Fabulous school!


