A Clash Deferred No Longer: Barnstaple and Chester Finally Meet

This afternoon's fixture with Chester is a historic first meeting on Barnstaple soil. While the Chiefs are familiar foes for many in National 2 West, today's opponents, Chester RUFC, are breaking new ground, marking their inaugural visit to North Devon.

This encounter is one that was narrowly missed in the recent past. Chester competed in National 2 West during the 2022-23 season, a campaign which unfortunately coincided with Barnstaple's absence from the division, denying fans what would have been a fascinating first clash.

The club from the historic Roman settlement was founded officially in 1925, Chester RUFC's roots are believed to trace back even further, with records hinting at organised rugby in the area as early as the 19th century. They are a classic example of a community club with a long and proud tradition.

Their modern league history has been one of both stability and, recently, frustrating disruption. Following their promotion in 2013, Chester established themselves as a consistent force in National 2 North, registering several top-six finishes and becoming a staple of that competition. However, the RFU's league reorganisation has left them in a state of flux. After nearly a decade in the North, they were shifted to National 2 West two seasons ago, only to return to the North last season, and now find themselves back in the West once more. This constant upheaval is undeniably challenging for any club, disrupting local rivalries and travel logistics.

Yet, despite this instability, Chester has arrived in Devon demonstrating solid form, currently sitting in a mid-table position with three wins from their opening seven fixtures. Their campaign has already been marked by moments of explosive attacking prowess. A staggering 71-19 victory over Exeter University showcased their try-scoring potential, a statement quickly followed by a significant 38-33 scalp against Taunton. A win against Syston rounds out their victories, painting a picture of a side that is dangerous and capable of hurting any opponent on its day.

However, a clear narrative emerges when comparing their home and away records. While a fortress at home, their travels have proven difficult. They have suffered heavy defeats on the road against Old Redcliffians (52-21) and Hornets (48-17), and a narrow 27-24 loss to familiar foes Lymm.

This away-day struggle is compounded by a significant geographical disadvantage. As one of the northernmost clubs in a predominantly southern league, Chester faces some of the longest journeys in the entire competition. With travels stretching to 150 miles or more for most of their away games including mammoth trips to Cornish outfits like Camborne and Redruth—the physical and mental toll is a factor that cannot be ignored.

For the Barnstaple Chiefs, today's clash is about more than just securing another five league points; it is a mission to protect a prized and hard-earned asset: their 100% home record. Pottington Road has become a fortress this season, a ground where visiting teams have found victory elusive.

Maintaining this impregnable form is a powerful source of confidence and a key objective for any side with ambitions at the top of the table.

However, the sheen on that perfect record was nearly tarnished in their last outing. The narrow victory over Cinderford served as a stark wake-up call—a game that was far too close for comfort and highlighted that no opponent in this league can be taken lightly.

That previous scare makes the task for today crystal clear: the Chiefs cannot afford anything less than their absolute best. Complacency, they now know, is their greatest enemy. To extend their winning streak at home, they must deliver a performance marked by heightened intensity, tactical discipline, and a relentless eighty-minute focus.

This sets the stage for what promises to be a cracking contest. Chester, despite their travel woes, arrive with a potent attack and a point to prove on the road. For the Chiefs it is a fixture that will test their resolve, their skill, and their mettle.

One thing is certain: Barnstaple will need to be at their very best to win. This is a challenge that will separate the good from the great, and the Chiefs have everything to play for in front of a home crowd expecting another display of defiant, winning rugby.

For us supporters it's time to get those vocal chords lubricated and at the ready for the biggest Barum Roar ever and be the 16th man.

Girls Rugby Takes Centre Stage at Pottington Road

**Sunday October 12th,
Barnstaple RFC hosted over 100 girls in a celebration of sport, teamwork, and the future of women's rugby.**



A fortnight ago marked a landmark moment for girls' rugby in North Devon, as more than 100 young players took to the pitches at Pottington Road for an afternoon of exhilarating rugby action. Clubs from across the region—including Crediton, South Molton, Okehampton, Bideford, and Cullompton—joined Barnstaple RFC in an afternoon of rugby that showcased not only skill and athleticism, but also the spirit and camaraderie that make rugby so special.

For many of the girls, this was their first season playing the sport, but you wouldn't have known it from the level of talent on display. The atmosphere was electric, with tries flying in across all age groups and players cheering each other on with infectious enthusiasm. It was a powerful reminder of what rugby is all about: teamwork, resilience, and celebrating each other's successes—on and off the pitch.

Just over a year ago, Barnstaple RFC had no dedicated provision for girls over the age of 11, and only a handful of girls playing mixed rugby. Fast forward to today, and the

transformation is nothing short of remarkable.

By the end of last season, Barnstaple boasted the largest U12s girls team in the UK, with over 35 players signed up. This season, the club has expanded to include both U12s and U14s teams, with more than 40 girls now pulling on the red and white jersey. Due to growing demand, a new U10s girls-only team has recently launched and is already gaining momentum. Plans are also underway to establish an U16s team, ensuring a clear pathway for girls to continue their rugby journey.

The club's ambition is bold and inspiring: to build a full girls' junior section from ages 7 to 18, and ultimately to see a women's team once again take to the first team pitch at Pottington Road.

Barnstaple Chiefs Fall Short in Second-Half Surge by Luctonians

It was a weekend to forget for the Barnstaple Rugby Club faithful, as all three senior sides suffered defeats. While the Athletic and Buccaneers also fell at Pottington Road (details of which can be found later in the programme), the Chiefs faced a particularly daunting task away from home against a formidable Luctonians side.

Travelling to face Luctonians on their own turf was always earmarked as a significant challenge in the National 2 calendar. The home side is widely known for their experienced, physical, and "tasty" brand of rugby, making them a tough prospect for any visiting team. The Chiefs' ambition was measured; a win would be a dream result, but the primary objective was a competitive performance that could yield a valuable league point or two.

For the first forty minutes, that strategic hope looked entirely achievable. In a tightly contested and gritty first half, Barnstaple demonstrated immense character. Midway through the period, the Chiefs were ignited by two well-taken tries from Brandon Moore and Viliame Kotobalavu, seizing a slender but morale-boosting lead.

The home side, however, demonstrated their quality by hitting back with a try right on the stroke of halftime. Despite this setback, the Chiefs headed into the break with a strong

platform for an upset, trailing by a mere four points at 14-10 and with all still to play for.

The second half, however, told a different story. Luctonians emerged from the break with a renewed intensity and effectively shut Barnstaple out of the game for the final 40 minutes. The contest remained an even arm-wrestle for the first 20 minutes after the restart, with both defences holding firm.


The deadlock was brutally broken by an eight-minute spell of dominance from the home side. They crossed the line twice in quick succession, capitalising on momentum and ultimately pulling away to a 28-10 victory.

Despite the score line, the Barnstaple Chiefs departed with their heads held high. They ventured into a difficult arena and for long periods traded blows with one of the league's more experienced outfits. The final result may not reflect it, but the team's spirit and resolve in a well-fought contest provide a solid foundation to build upon as the season progresses.

Athletic Rue Costly Errors as Redruth Snatch Victory in Dying Minutes



In a match defined by squandered opportunities and ill-timed penalties, Barnstaple Athletic were left to ponder what might have been, as a resilient Redruth side snatched a 28-31 victory in the final moments at Pottington Road. This was a game that slipped through the home side's fingers, a frustrating tale of two halves where early dominance was ultimately undone by a litany of errors.

The match began in dream fashion for the Tics, marking the 50th-appearance celebrations of Harvey Rostock and captain Scott Incedon with a blistering start. From the kick-off, Rostock exploded down the left wing, and when he was finally halted, Harry Greenslade finished the move, converting his own try to give Athletic a 7-0 lead within the first minute.

What followed was a period of utter dominance. For the next 25 minutes, Athletic camped in the visitors' half, applying relentless pressure. Yet, a combination of a well-drilled Redruth defence and a growing tally of unforced errors and penalties from the home side prevented them from extending their lead. This profligacy proved costly.

Against the run of play, Redruth intercepted a flat pass and raced the length of the field for a converted try. The momentum shifted instantly. A penalty soon after gave the visitors a 7-10 lead, stunning the home crowd. Just before the break, Josh Davie's quick-thinking—tapping and going from a penalty—restored Athletic's lead at 14-10. However, the first-half narrative was

cemented in the final minute, as Redruth marched straight back downfield to score and take a 14-17 lead into halftime.

The second half opened at a frantic pace, with both teams trading tries within five minutes. Jamie Townsend scored from a maul, and later, Max Moore's try, converted by the ever-accurate Greenslade, seemed to give Athletic the edge midway through the half 28-24.

The final quarter, however, descended into a familiar frustration for the home supporters. Despite having chances to put the game to bed, Athletic's attack was repeatedly blunted by their own indiscipline and handling errors. The penalty count mounted relentlessly against them, stifling their rhythm and handing initiative back to a Redruth side growing in confidence.

The decisive blow came when Barnstaple was reduced to 14 men due to a technical yellow card for persistent team infringements. Seizing their chance with just five minutes left on the clock, the visitors powered over for the match-winning score.

While two league points salvaged from a losing bonus is not to be dismissed, it will feel like scant consolation for an Athletic side that controlled the game's opening act. The inability to convert total dominance into a commanding scoreline, coupled with a discipline that frayed at the most critical moments, will be the primary focus in the post-match review. This was a game that was there for the taking, and the players will know it was one that got away.

Athletic have a weekend off this week to reflect on the game, strengthen their resolve and come out stronger when they return next weekend

Buccaneers' Heartbreak as Elusive First Win Slips Through Their Fingers

The Pottington Road faithful were buzzing with anticipation on Saturday as the Buccaneers marched out, determined to translate their progress into a first victory. The stage was set for a thrilling encounter against a familiar foe, Torrington, in what promised to be a true test of the squad's development.

They did not disappoint. From the first whistle, the match exploded into a fabulously entertaining, end-to-end battle. The air was thick with tension and excitement, punctuated by roaring cheers from the side-lines.
