

Golf Connect Update

I am pleased to confirm that MiClub, our software provider, has advised that the initial two-week period of social play announced by Golf Australia will be much shorter. The latest date for the return to competition play has been brought forward.

Golf Australia originally announced two weeks of social play to cover a range of software providers with varying integration timeframes. We are fortunate that our site upgrade will be completed earlier, allowing us to resume competition golf sooner.

Here is a summary of the changes:

- Competitions will return from Monday, the 6th October
- Social play <u>only</u> from Monday, the 29th September to Sunday, the 5th October inclusive.
- During this social play period, play will be from one tee only, and there will be no rockups
- If we are ready before the 6th October, an optional medley competition will be added to the timesheets, allowing handicapping to resume.

Keith Beats His Age Again




It's not the first time he's managed it, and it's a testament to his skill, consistency, and love of the game. Well played, Keith!

COURSE UPDATE

Course News

With winter now behind us, our focus shifts to preparing the course for the warmer months ahead. Rainfall over winter totalled 154mm (June-August), which is around Melbourne's average. However, the lead-up to winter was unusually dry, with only 46mm recorded across April and May, compared to much higher totals in recent years. This had a noticeable impact on how the course played and held up through the colder months. The course, having held up extremely well through winter, is ready to take advantage of the ideal growing weather to come.



Greens

The greens are in good shape with strong coverage, despite challenges from shade and traffic. We have been able to conduct a consistent dusting program over the last few months, which is starting to show the benefits with surfaces feeling a little firmer and rolling well.

Renovations will commence on September 22nd, involving hollow coring, deep verti-draining, and air injection to improve water infiltration and relieve compaction. Around 120 tonnes of sand will be brushed into the greens as part of this program. These works will set the foundations for excellent putting surfaces heading into spring and summer.



Tees & Fairways

Couch surfaces are starting their transition out of winter dormancy as we apply herbicide applications to remove Poa, along with granular fertiliser to encourage new growth. Fairway colour has held up very well despite a record number of frosts, supported by our turf pigment program, which will continue going forward.



Rough

Rough is currently maintained at 38mm across the course, with an intensive herbicide program supporting density and presentation. As growth improves, the first cut of rough will remain at 38mm with the rest set at 51mm to create clear definition between fairway and rough.

COURSE UPDATE

Bunkers

Our bunker improvement program, led by Assistant Superintendent Scott, has made excellent progress. Sand has been redistributed on faces and bases to improve playability, and steps have been installed in difficult access points.

Member feedback has been very positive. A reminder to all players to rake carefully and avoid dragging sand towards exits to maintain consistency for others.






Trees & Landscape

Our horticulturalist Peter Brown's work in the garden beds is really taking shape, with new plantings adding colour and structure.

Tree works by staff and contractors are improving both playability and presentation, with priority given to overhanging branches as part of our encroachment program.




Fore Play


