SCI Ribbon Cutting Begins 54th Convention In Style

Safari Club International officially opened its 54th annual Convention on Wednesday with a ribbon cutting that included Tennessee Governor Bill Lee, SCI President Jeff Meyerl and SCI CEO W. Laird Hamberlin.

President Meyerl noted that Gov. Lee cut the first ribbon four years ago to mark the start of the SCI — Nashville era.

“We’ve had three of the best conventions in SCI history,” said Meyerl. “This is the fourth year in Nashville, and it is looking like it is going to break

every record we’ve had in the past 53 years.”

This 54th Convention started with festivities and meetings on Tuesday, capped by the Safari Club International Foundation Conservation Leadership Award Gala Sponsored by Beretta, where Lee Anderson won the prestigious Conservation Leadership Award. (See full story and photos, page B1.)

Elected in 2018 as Georgia's 83rd governor and now serving his second term, Gov. Kemp has built a record of advancing science-based conservation policy and strengthening outdoor recreation opportunities across the state.

His administration has prioritized funding and support for the Georgia Department of Natural Resources, in-

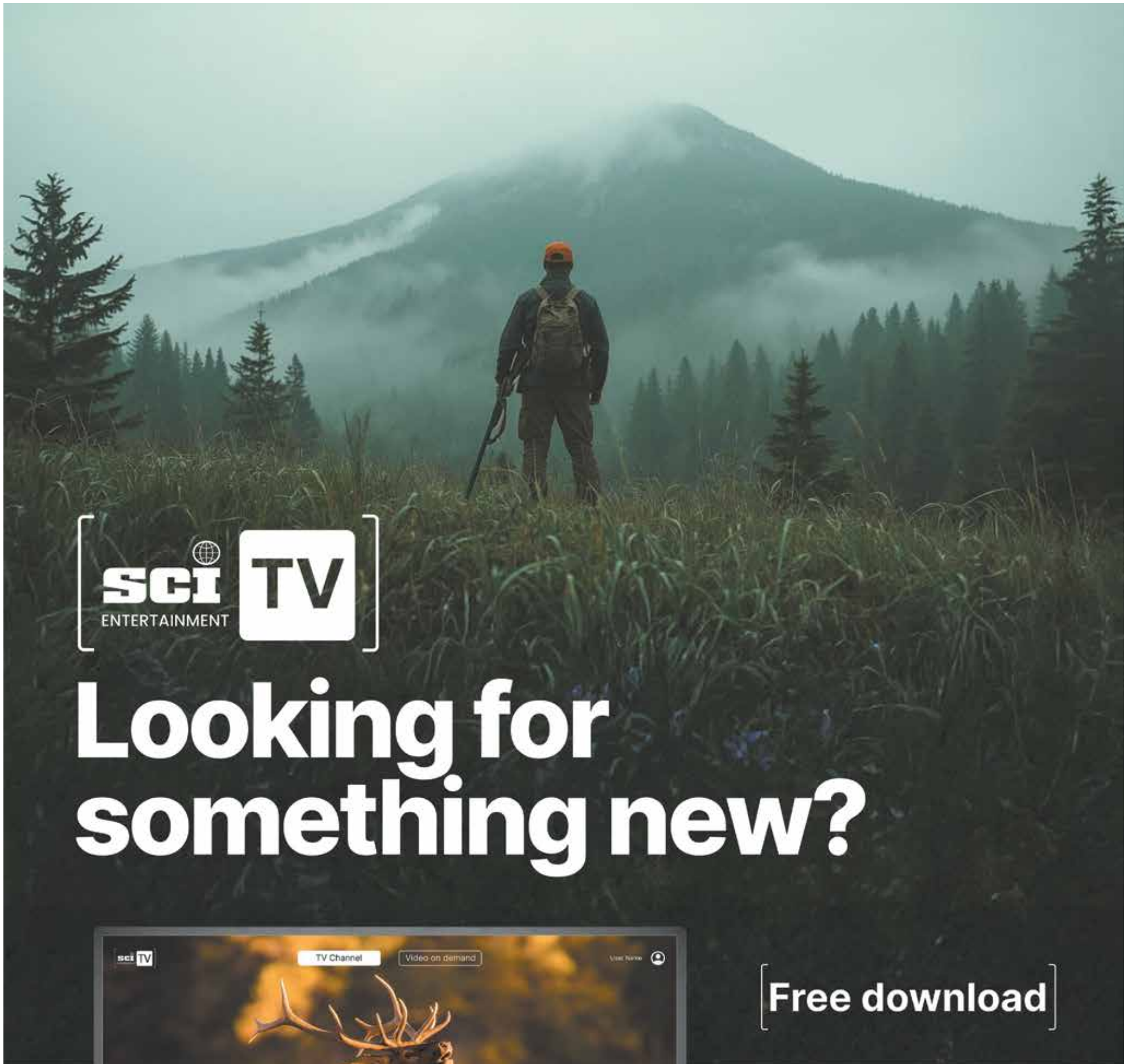

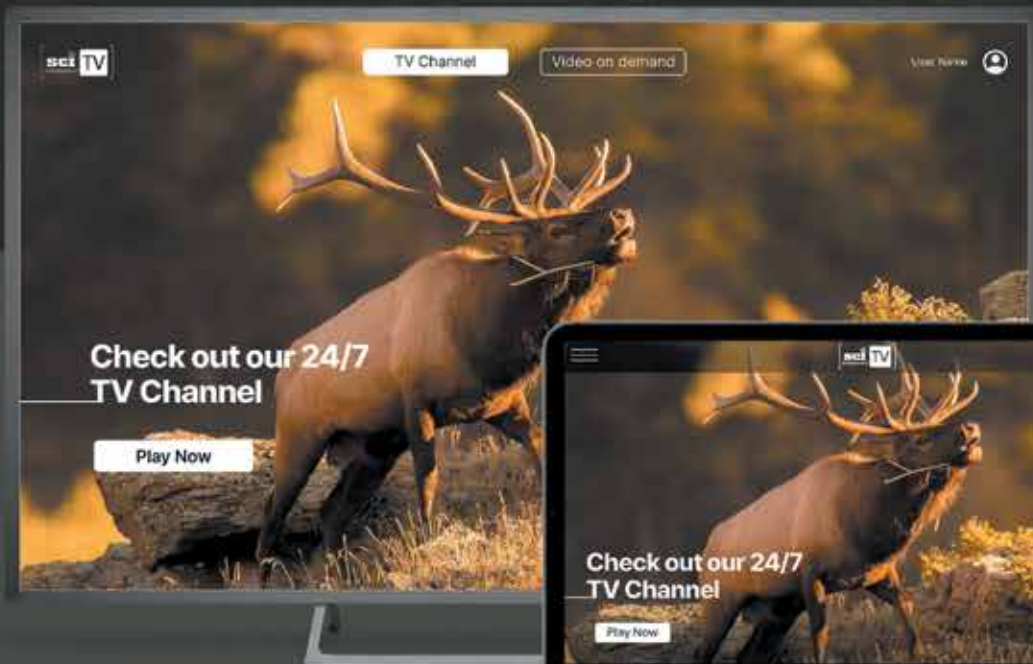

Low Down On New Green Dot Turkey Sight

Vortex introduced the Vortex Viper Shotgun Enclosed Micro Red Dot last year, and this year is offering a green-dot option.

Green is easier for the eye to pick up in the brighter light of daytime, especially in woodland settings. That makes it better for quick-acquisition shooting. The downside is that the green emitter takes more battery life (but the CR2032 battery will last about 10,000 hours).

Also, red is known to be better in low-light conditions.

In the end, it's a personal preference between green and red.

One thing both sights have going for them is that they both mount directly to the shotgun receiver. That way, the sight's profile is as low as it can possibly be. It makes sure the recoil goes directly back and into your shoulder where it should. And by having it lower on the receiver, there's a much better chance you get a good cheek weld. That improves repeatability and accuracy.

We tried it out during the 2025 turkey season. It was good to shoot with such a low sight, and the cheek weld was solid. It's hard to judge and measure felt recoil accurately, but we were shooting

the gun just to shoot it for fun, which is rare with a turkey gun. Most people shoot it once to make sure it's sighted in and once at a turkey.

The first thing a hunter might ask is, if you take your Weaver rail or Picatinny rail off your gun to mount this scope, how do I know it will fit my gun?

Most guns have their own pattern and number of drilled and tapped screw holes on the receiver. And there are about five common screw depths among popular shotgun models.

But Vortex created the sight so that the mount is adjustable. They also include five different packets of mounting screws, so it's highly likely you can mount this sight on your gun.

All these makes, and most of their models, will accept this sight: Benelli, Beretta, Browning, Franchi, Ithaca, Mossberg, Remington, Retay, Savage, Stevens, Stoeger, Weatherby and Winchester, accounting for more than 50 models in all. You can go to vortexoptics.com to make sure your gun will.

The battery is easy to access on the side of the sight. The sight weighs 2.14 ounces and is 4.86 inches long, including the mounting base.

Like the original red dot model, the Viper Shotgun Enclosed Micro Green Dot is available in two configurations: 3 MOA Green Dot and a Multi-Reticle Green. MSRPs are \$429 and \$499.

Seminar Empowers Young Hunters

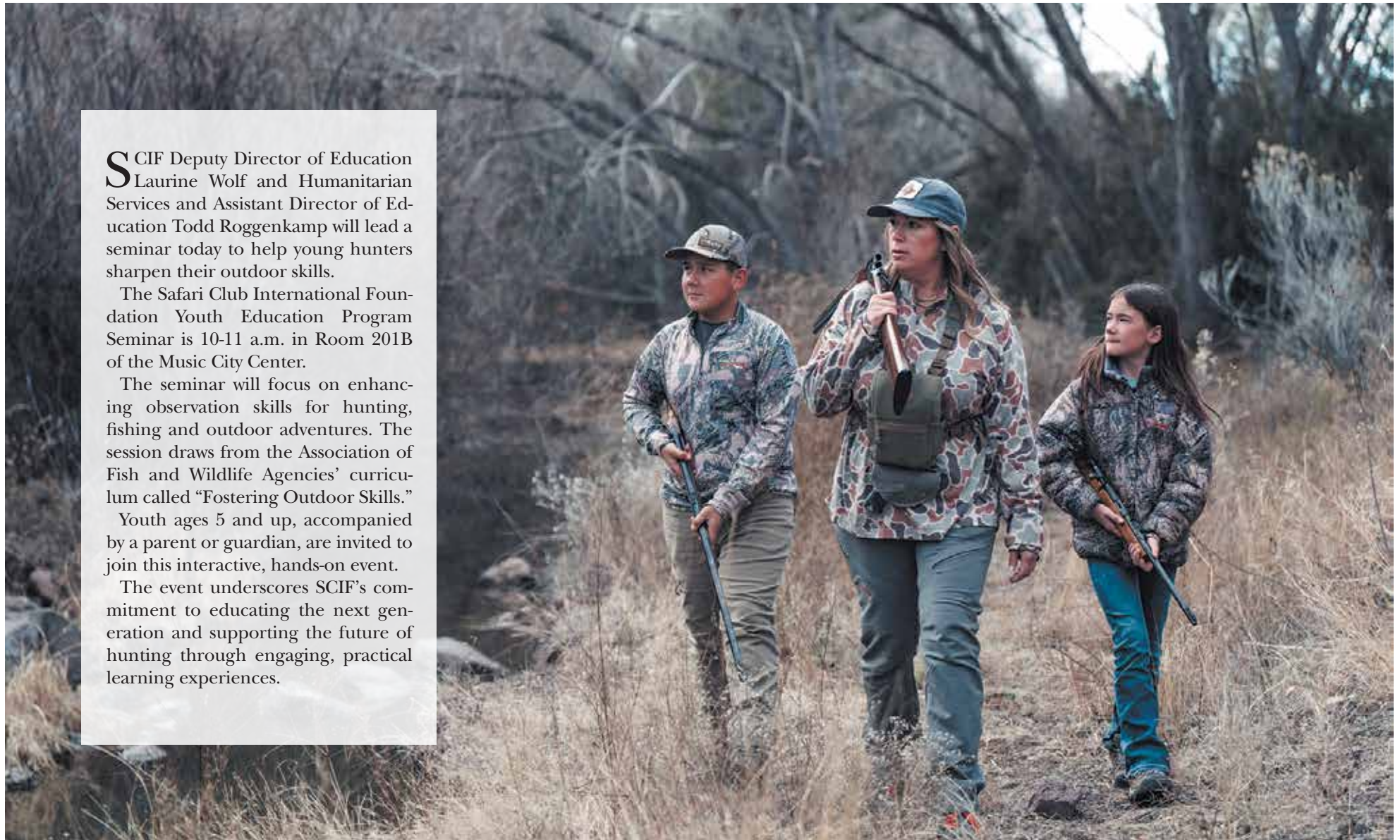

Bespoke Fausti Side-By-Side To Be Auctioned

Fausti has donated a gorgeous side-by-side round-body 20-gauge shotgun to be auctioned off during tonight's SCI event at the Ryman Auditorium.

This one of a kind is a remarkable example of Italian craftsmanship.

The gun is 100% hand-made, engraved and signed by the engraver. It is built on a 20-gauge round frame and comes with a traditional straight English stock, an oval medallion with SCI initials and a splinter forend.

It is valued at \$25,000.

This shotgun features automatic ejectors, single trigger and 28-inch barrel with fixed chokes (improved cylinder and modified). A beautiful leather case is also included.

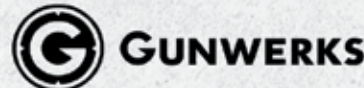
