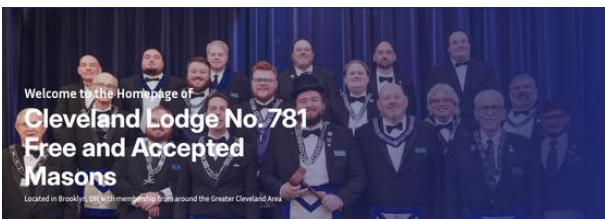

THOUGHTS FOR YOUR CONSIDERATION

Removing the Superfluities

The rough ashlar sits on its pedestal. We assume it needs to become something. That the work ahead will transform it into what it currently isn't. We're looking at it wrong.

The perfect stone already exists inside. Every chip removed doesn't add perfection. It uncovers it. The master mason doesn't build the ashlar's beauty from scratch. He removes everything hiding it. The work isn't creation. It's revelation.

This changes everything about how you understand the degrees. The common gavel is the Entered Apprentice's first tool for this reason. Not a trowel for adding material. An instrument of removal. Of correction. Of revelation through subtraction. The first lesson Masonry teaches isn't how to build. It's how to uncover.

The alchemists understood this principle deeply. Their real work wasn't transforming base metal into gold. It was recognizing that gold was already present, buried beneath impurities. Remove the dross and gold remains. Not because you created it. Because you stopped obscuring it.

The Gnostic tradition arrives at the same truth from a different direction. The divine spark doesn't need to be earned or acquired. It needs to be uncovered. Liberation isn't addition. It's subtraction.

So, the degrees don't install virtue and wisdom into you like software onto a blank machine. They strip away accumulated layers that have covered what was always there. You don't enter Masonry incomplete and leave completed. You enter obscured and leave progressively uncovered.

Most men spend their lives adding. More credentials. More identities. More protective layers. More carefully constructed versions of themselves. The Masonic path runs exactly opposite. The brother who grasps this works differently than the one still trying to accumulate his way to worthiness.

You are not becoming worthy through the degrees. You are uncovering the worthiness placed in you before you understood what it was. This is simultaneously humbling and liberating. Humbling because the work is never finished. New layers reveal themselves at every level. There's always more gavel work ahead. Liberating because you're not starting from nothing. You're returning to what you already are beneath the accumulated weight of everything you've pretended to be.

The perfect ashlar isn't the destination. It's the origin. Your work isn't construction. It's excavation. Not adding light to darkness. Removing the darkness covering your light. Not becoming divine through advancement. Uncovering the divinity that was never absent.

Chip away. Remove. Reveal.

The work was never about becoming. It was always about returning

Grand Master's Award 2025-26

The Grand Master's Award Program is designed to build and strengthen Lodges across this jurisdiction. The form is divided into 6 sections, each area focusing on key measurables to promote positive growth, member engagement and personal improvement.

Section 1 includes specific tasks created by the Grand Master. Sections 2 through 6 will remain the same each year providing continuity for lodge leadership planning year over year.

To be eligible, a lodge selects from a list of challenges from each section to complete the required number for that section.

The period from consideration is the Grand Lodge fiscal year which begins August 1 and ends on July 31 each year. Submit completed forms to the Junior Grand Warden at JGW@Freemason.com. (Copy your DDGM as well)

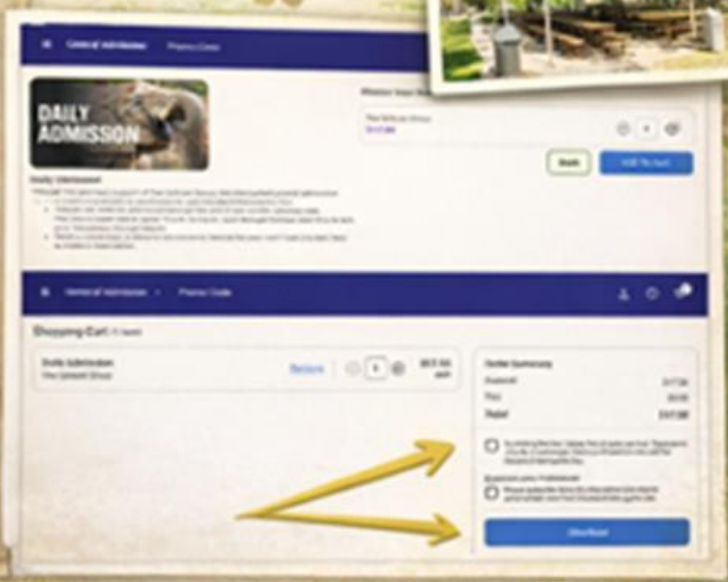
