Center for Public Mental Health



CPMH focuses on research, education, training, and advocacies on public mental health. We cover various mental-health-related areas such as family well-being, school-based mental health, workplace mental health & well-being, community mental health, and post-disaster psychosocial recovery. We also research human rights issues in mental health and mental health system development. As a center that have been established since 2010, the Center has specific skills in mental health promotion, community engagement, and translating research into policy and practice.

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Center for Indigenous and Cultural Psychology



At CICP we focus our research on a range of psychological topics which are relevant to the Indonesian people. Some of the research include national identity, social responses toward the pandemic, intergroup relations, and historical representations of past political events. Our research uses a variety of methods, including case studies, surveys and analysis of social media, and our team of researchers disseminate their work through seminars and both national and international journals.

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Center for Life-Span Development



CLSD is one of the research centers at the Faculty of Psychology, Universitas Gadjah Mada (UGM) aimed to facilitate research, community services, and publication activities within the field of human development across the life-span. CLSD was developed as an extension from the former Early Childhood Development Laboratory (Lab. PAUD 2013 - 2018), which activities were focused on early childhood development and education.



Research

We conduct research related to the aspects of human development from infancy to late adulthood, including the physical, cognitive, and socio-emotional aspects. Our ongoing research:

- Self-esteem, loneliness, and psychological distress among celebrity worshippers
- Moral development in Indonesia
- Memory and executive function in infants
- Assessment of socio-emotional conditions of preschool and primary school students:
 Preparation for school transition from online to offline learning

Community Services

We conduct workshops, training, seminars, and courses with various themes related to human development. In 2022, we developed a module for community service in life-span development, consisting of various themes. We have been implementing the socioemotional development module in training for the cadres of early childhood services in villages.

We provide internship opportunities to undergraduate and graduate students. Interns are involved in the Center's activities, including research and publications, as well as community services. 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Unit for Psychodiagnostic Tools Development



The psychodiagnostic tool development unit is a unit under the Faculty of Psychology Universitas Gadjah Mada whose activities center on the development and evaluation of measures in psychology. This activity includes the development of new tests and the adaptation of tests from abroad. The activities carried out in test evaluation activities are item analysis and tests, studies on the validity of tests and studies on issues outside of tests, for example, policies, or issues of equality in measurement in the field of psychology.

This division develops tests that are used in the selection process for prospective students or employees. Some of the available tests:

■ Measurement tools development

This division is engaged in the development and evaluation of measurement instruments, including validity studies and psychometric tests.

AJT Cognitive Test

This division is engaged in the management and delivery of services related to AJT COGTEST. AJT COGTEST is a cognitive test developed collaboratively between the Faculty of Psychology UGM and the Darma Bermakna Foundation. This test is the most comprehensive test that measures cognitive abilities in Indonesia and even in the world as this uses the CHC Cognitive Theory to measure a wide range of individual cognitive abilities.
