Did You Know?

Pacific University is among the best values in Oregon, according to U.S. News & World Report. The 2022 report ranked Pacific the best value among National Universities in Oregon.

BOXER ONLINE ACCOUNT

When you are first admitted to Pacific, you will receive an email ("Your Pacific University Oregon Account") instructing you to log in with a special one-time-use link to establish your Pacific account, also known as a PUNet ID. If you received such an email, click on the link to start the process of establishing your Pacific account.

If you have not received the above mentioned email or if you are having issues establishing your account, please contact Pacific's technology helpdesk at **503.352.1500**.

Once you log in to the myAccount system for the first time, you will be asked to:

- Agree to the latest version of our Appropriate Use Policy for Information Technology
- •Establish a non-default password
- •(Optional) Create an email alias that we refer to as a Preferred Email address. (This is an alternate address you can receive mail through. Creating an alias does not change your login username.)
- •Register a third-party email address and answer security questions. (This helps you with self-service password resets and allows for phone verification of your identity by helpdesk staff.)
- •Review the personal information the university has about you. (You can correct this from the myAccount main menu.)
- •Sign up for Boxer Alerts to receive emergency announcements and info about unplanned campus closures on your mobile phone



FINANCIAL AID

Starting in spring, Pacific University begins distributing Financial Aid packages to admitted students. Your eligibility for financial aid will be calculated based on Pacific's **Estimated Cost of Attendance**. Finalized **Direct Costs** for tuition, fees, and on-campus housing and food costs will be available later this spring and you will be notified of any changes to these estimated direct costs. We also include estimates for your **Indirect Costs**, such as transportation, books, supplies, and personal expenses.

Scholarships and Grants do not have to be repaid. To remain eligible for scholarships and grants, you must remain a full-time student (minimum 12 credits each semester) and maintain a 2.0 GPA.

Your **Estimated Net Cost** is the Estimated Cost of Attendance, less any scholarships and grants.

Additional Resources are available to help you meet educational expenses. You may accept all or a portion of the fund offered to you or you may decline these resources if you do not need the funds. To accept or decline the funds offered to you, log onto BoxerOnline.pacificu.edu to access BoxerOnline Financial Aid Self-Service. This portal will also provide descriptions of the terms of these awards and outline any additional steps needed to finalize your eligibility for these funds. The Additional Resources listed may be used to help you pay for the estimated cost.

Estimated Cost is the Estimated Cost of Attendance, less all financial aid offered to you. Remember, your Estimated Cost of Attendance includes both direct costs (what you will pay to Pacific) and indirect costs (what you will pay to get to campus, purchase your books, and cover your personal living expenses). Your billing statement from the Pacific Business Office will reflect only direct costs, as well as your scholarships, grants, and net loan amounts.

Parent PLUS Loans and Private Loans are available to help finance the Estimated Cost. Information and application instructions are available at <u>StudentAid.gov</u> for the Parent PLUS Loan.

Comparing financial aid packages from different universities can be difficult because there is no standard formatting for colleges on how they are presented. Please reach out to your admission counselor if you have any questions about your Pacific package or if you wish to compare the true cost of one university to the cost of Pacific University Oregon.

DEPOSIT TO BECOME A BOXER

Here are the ways to become a Boxer! If you have any questions about the deposit process, please contact your Admissions Counselor.

Deposit over the phone: Call our Admissions Department at **503.352.2218** to deposit over the phone during normal business hours.

<u>Deposit online:</u> Below are instructions on how to complete the online deposit process:

- •Sign-in using your PUNet ID and Password.
- •Select the "Tuition Deposits" tab.
- •Choose the appropriate term (i.e. Fall 2023).
- •Choose the Undergraduate Deposit account and hit continue.
- •Choose your preferred payment method from the dropdown menu and press select.
 - a. If you are choosing a **checking or saving account**, complete the account information fields and press continue.
 - i. Read the terms and conditions, select agree and submit your payment.
 - b. If you are using a **credit card via PayPath**, choose continue to PayPath.
 - i. Enter your date of birth and the Student ID number if requested and press continue.
 - ii. Press continue on the Payment Amount Information screen.
 - iii. Enter your card payment information and press continue.
 - iv. Read the terms and conditions, select agree and submit your payment.

Deposit in person: Stop by our Admissions Department in Knight Hall on campus during normal business hours to submit your deposit, ring the bell and sign our Boxer mascot!



HOUSING

Welcome to campus living at Pacific University!

Living in campus housing offers an unparalleled experience to be part of a vibrant and diverse community, where every day brings new opportunities to connect, grow, and have fun. By living in campus housing, you'll be right in the middle of the action—just steps away from campus dining and coffee, the library, campus events, and your professors' offices.

Deposited undergraduate students can begin applying for housing for the 2024-2025 academic year in March.We'll reach out to you to let you know the steps you'll need to take to select roommates (if you'd like) and to secure your spot.We'll be in touch through your Pacific University email, so be sure to set up your PUNet ID and password and start checking your inbox.

The Office of Accessibility & Accommodations (OAA) Services provides reasonable accommodations in campus housing to students with disabilities. Students seeking accommodations in housing should can register with OAA and submit disability documentation by following the process online online. More than 80% of residential students at Pacific agree that living on campus is an important part of the college experience, and studies back that up—students who live in campus housing typically experience more interactions with staff and faculty, more involvement with activities, and even better grades. HOUSING REQUIREMENT

Living on campus is an essential part of the Boxer experience. By living on campus, students learn and reinforce skills to successfully manage personal responsibilities and to be great community members.

Pacific University requires all Forest Grove undergraduate students under 20 years of age by the first day of fall term to live and board on-campus to live on campus and have a full meal plan for 4 full semesters. We recognize that in some instances a student may need to petition for a qualifying exemption from this requirement. CAMPUS LIVING LOGISTICS

Dining Services

The "board" portion of "room and board," commonly referred to as the meal plan, is required of almost every residential student. All students who have not fulfilled the residency requirement are required to have a full meal plan, no matter where they live on campus. Additionally, students who have fulfilled the residency requirement and live in rooms/units without full kitchens must have a full meal plan.

The Pacific Café, located in the University Center, offers breakfast, lunch, and dinner on weekdays and continental breakfast, brunch and dinner on weekends. Students with a full meal plan start on the Boxer 21 plan, which provides each student with enough meal swipes to eat during all of those meals, should they choose to do so. Students may choose to switch to a different full meal plan during the first two weeks of the semester.

Grab-and-go meals, snacks, coffee and tea are also available for purchase in the University Center.

Parking is available for students with valid parking passes in designated lots on campus. To get a permit, complete an online Parking Permit Application before you arrive for Orientation. and we'll have your permit ready for you! Permits are valid for one academic year (July to June) and cost an annual fee, which is charged directly to your student account. Permits must be renewed each year.

MAIL ROOM

All students will be assigned a mailbox, also known as a UC box, whether you live on or off campus. You will receive your mailbox key once you arrive on campus. You will keep the same UC box and the key while you are enrolled at Pacific. REGISTER FOR CLASSES

Deposited students will receive an email in mid-May with details and instructions to sign up for an Advising & Registration Day in July and August 2024. Advising & Registration will be a half-day experience and includes an academic advising presentation and individual meetings with advisors who will help students to choose classes and register. Speaking one-on-one with an advisor allows students to discuss interests, possible majors, graduate schools, and career goals to help them to make an informed decision on their first semester classes. This is a great place to get answers to questions about what to expect with class scheduling. We have virtual events available so traveling to Forest Grove for registration day is not necessary.

Below are the steps necessary to follow in order to sign up for the half-day Advising & Registration experience. Completing the first step, the Academic Interest Survey, triggers the rest of the process so please complete it as soon as possible after receiving it. Information will be sent to your Pacific University email so keep checking it frequently!

Step I) Complete the Academic Interest Survey – details emailed to deposited students beginning in mid-May

Step 2) Submit final official high school and official college transcripts, including AP/IB test scores (if applicable)

Step 3) Complete the online math placement test and language assessment (if applicable) - details emailed after steps 1 and 2 are complete Step 4) Complete the First Year Communities (FYC) survey - details emailed after steps 1, 2, and 3 are complete

Step 5) Sign up to attend an Advising & Registration Day – details emailed after completing the FYS survey

After step 4, students will have access to our pre-advising online Moodle course to learn more about advising and registration.

Keep an eye on the Pacific University email account! This is where students will be able to access all of the above mentioned items. All Advising & Registration Day slots are filled on a first-come first-served basis. After signing up for a day, students will receive an Advising & Registration Day schedule.

Guaranteed Graduate School Admission


The Pacific University Guaranteed Graduate School Admission Program provides a clear path for Pacific students to move seamlessly and efficiently from undergraduate to graduate school.
