

To our members,



Highlights of the Labor Force February 2025



THE BORDERPLEX REGION


- THE LABOR FORCE INCREASED BY 1,408 FROM THE PREVIOUS MONTH
- THE NUMBER OF EMPLOYED INDIVIDUALS INCREASED BY 636 FROM THE PREVIOUS MONTH
- THE NUMBER OF UNEMPLOYED INDIVIDUALS INCREASED BY 772 FROM THE PREVIOUS MONTH

EL PASO, TX MSA

- EL PASO, TX MSA UNEMPLOYMENT WAS AT 4.4%, WITH A TOTAL OF 18,531 UNEMPLOYED INDIVIDUALS
- EL PASO, TX MSA ADDED 6,100 NONFARM JOBS SINCE FEBRUARY 2024
- EL PASO, TX MSA ADDED 800 NONFARM JOBS FROM THE PREVIOUS MONTH

- THE LABOR FORCE INCREASED BY 174 FROM THE PREVIOUS MONTH

The three Super Sectors with the **GREATEST** employment for the El Paso MSA in February 2025 were:


- Trade, Transportation, and Utilities

- 3. Information


These three Super Sectors represented 9% of the total nonfarm employment.

EMPLOYMENT in February 2025









Top 5 Unemployment Claimants Occupations






