Trevor Crippen is a two-time Distinguished Toastmaster and a Past District Director for District 31 Toastmasters. He first visited a Toastmasters meeting at his employer in 2014 because he heard there was free pizza in the boardroom, and has since learned this organization can offer so much more than an occasional free lunch. In his time as a Toastmaster, he's given over a hundred speeches, served in dozens of leadership roles and the club and district levels, and he keeps coming back for more. In his day job, he works in corporate rights analysis and intellectual property in the education industry. He lives in a suburb south of Boston with his wife, daughter, and chocolate labrador dog.



In the Toastmasters Pathways learning program, Levels 1 and 2 are foundational, playing a crucial role in establishing a member's confidence and skill set. Here's a breakdown of their importance:

Level 1: Mastering Fundamentals

- Introduction to Core Skills:
- This level focuses on the essential building blocks of public speaking and evaluation.
- Members learn to organize their thoughts, structure speeches, and provide constructive feedback.
- Building Confidence:
- Level 1 is designed to ease new members into public speaking, creating a supportive environment for them to overcome their initial anxieties.
- Successful completion of these projects builds confidence and encourages continued participation.
- Establishing a Foundation:
- The skills learned in Level 1 are crucial for all future projects in Pathways. It provides the base upon which all other skills are built.

Level 2: Learning Your Style

- Developing Personal Style:
- This level encourages members to explore and refine their unique communication and leadership styles.
- It goes beyond the basics, helping members to understand their strengths and areas for improvement.
- Introduction to Mentoring:
- Level 2 often includes projects that introduce the concept of mentoring, which is a key component of the Toastmasters experience.
- This helps members to understand the importance of passing on their knowledge to other members.
- Expanding Skill Set:
- Members begin to expand their skill set by tackling more complex projects that require them to adapt their communication and leadership approaches.

In essence, Levels 1 and 2 are vital for establishing a strong foundation in communication and leadership, setting the stage for continued growth and success in Toastmasters.

- 1. Run an open house
- 2. Save receipts and label refreshments, or media purchased specifically for the open house
- 3. Save an agenda from the event
- 4. Submit the receipts and agenda to the Fab Four fabfour@district31.org
- 5. The Fab Four will issue a Concur account to apply for reimbursement
- 6. District 31 will reimburse the club up to \$50

District Open Houses FAQs

1. Will the district cover event expenses?

Yes, the district will cover all expenses for the event, including refreshments, supplies, decorations, etc. We just ask club members to help run the event.

2. When similar events have occurred in the past, what were the outcomes?

A couple of District open houses were run last year. The format differed, though. The district ran the event and requested volunteers from in the local area to participate in roles. There was no promotion of specific clubs. If members showed up from other clubs they had the opportunity to network with guests. There were no followup surveys with guests, so we do not have statistics on guests.

3. How many guests do you expect at the event? How many clubs generally participate?

We don't know, since this is the first time the district is using this format. Guests participation will depend on how well we advertise, the theme/speakers connecting with guests. Clubs will organize these aspects of the meeting, and the district will work with the clubs to facilitate implementation. Club participation will depend on how many clubs would like to help organize and run the event.

4. If this event is to attract more guests to multiple clubs, which clubs typically retain these guests as potential members? We are concerned about all clubs mutually benefiting from the collaboration.

That is a legitimate concern if there are multiple clubs trying to attract guests. Clubs will have an opportunity to provide guests with a mission statement or synopsis about the club. How that is built into the events will be up to the organizing clubs. Guests will be encouraged to visit multiple clubs to determine which one is the best fit for them. An analogous event was the district 100 Year event held at the end of October, where Advanced clubs collaborated in the morning to put on workshops. All clubs promoted themselves, and encouraged guests to visit each of their clubs.


