FWC2026 MOBILE TICKETS APP

All ticket buyers receive their purchased tickets through the **FWC 2026 Mobile Tickets App**.

To receive your tickets, you'll need to download the FWC 2026 Mobile Tickets App. Log in using the **email address** you used to buy the tickets.

Please note! Your tickets will not be sent by email and cannot be downloaded. Screenshots or photos of your tickets are invalid and will not be accepted. If you run into any problems, a help desk is available at every stadium (on match day only).

On match day, a QR code will appear on your mobile ticket in the app one hour before the gates open. Make sure your phone is charged when you arrive at the stadium (a power bank comes in handy). You won't need Wi-Fi or Bluetooth.

From downtown Seattle, the [Waterfront Shuttle](#) or the [Matchday Shuttle](#) is the most efficient option. Get off at the stop at 1st Ave S and Charles.



From outside downtown Seattle, Rail is the most efficient and recommended option. The 'Stadium Station' stop is closest to the House of the Devils.

GETTING AROUND

Seattle has an extensive public transport network, making it easy for supporters to get around the city and reach the House of the Devils and the stadium.

The [host city website](#) has all the practical transport information you need, including details on arriving in Seattle, getting around locally, the stadium, and the city's attractions.



Getting to the stadium by car

We strongly advise against driving to the stadium. Parking in the area is limited, and rates are very high on match days. On top of that, expect significant traffic congestion around the stadium.



Getting to the stadium by public transport

The stadium is easy to reach by public transport. Sound Transit recommends that supporters use the following stations: Pioneer Square Station, International District/Chinatown Station and Stadium Station. Always follow the marked walking routes and on-site signage.

ACCESSIBILITY

Supporters with reduced mobility traveling on the Link Light Rail (1 Line or 2 Line) are advised to get off at International District/Chinatown Station. The Weller Street Bridge provides direct access to the area around the stadium, including elevator facilities.

Supporters traveling on the Sounder Train (N Line or S Line) arrive at King Street Station and can reach the stadium via South Jackson Street or the Weller Street Bridge.

GETTING AROUND DOWNTOWN SEATTLE

Within downtown Seattle, a special Matchday Shuttle runs between Seattle Stadium and Seattle Center. King County Metro's regular bus lines remain available as well.



STADIUM RULES

All FIFA stadiums enforce a clear bag policy to ensure a safe and smooth entry process. Only transparent bags made of plastic, vinyl or PVC are allowed, with maximum dimensions of 30 x 15 x 30 cm. Small wallets, clutches or handbags up to 11.5 x 16.5 cm are an exception and do not need to be transparent.

All bags are checked at the entrance.

See the full list of prohibited items [here](#). Below is a summary of the prohibited items:

- Weapons and sharp or dangerous objects
- Explosives and flammable materials
- Glass, bottles and hard packaging that could cause injury
- Illegal substances and drugs
- Flares, fireworks and smoke bombs
- Large or hard objects that could compromise safety or block the view
- Professional camera or recording equipment without authorisation
- Political, discriminatory or offensive materials or banners
- Objects that could obstruct passage, sightlines or evacuation

FIFA FAN MATERIALS

There are clear guidelines and rules for using fan materials inside the stadium. Below is an overview of what's allowed without prior approval, what requires permission, and which rules of use apply inside the stadium. Each request must be submitted individually.

ALLOWED WITHOUT PRIOR APPROVAL

Supporters may bring the following materials without a prior request:

- Flags and banners smaller than 2 m x 1.5 m.
- Flexible plastic flagpoles up to 1 m long and 1 cm in diameter.
- **Note:** metal poles are strictly prohibited.
- Replica trophies, provided they pose no safety risk.

MATERIALS THAT REQUIRE PRIOR APPROVAL

For certain larger or specific fan materials, prior permission must be requested through the FIFA Fan Materials Entry Portal.

- Flags and banners larger than 2 m x 1.5 m but smaller than 4 m x 2 m.
- Tifos (maximum 10 m x 10 m)
- Musical instruments

RULES OF USE INSIDE THE STADIUM

When using fan materials inside the stadium, the following rules must always be observed:

- Blocking other supporters' sightlines is prohibited.
- Safety signs, sponsor boards, LED screens and television cameras must not be obstructed.
- Hanging or installing materials in the stadium in advance is not permitted. Supporters bringing materials must arrive at least 2 hours before kick-off for inspection.
- The approval certificate must be presented at the entrance whenever prior permission was required.



SAFETY

Vigilance & emergencies

While traveling and on match days, it's important to stay alert at all times, especially in busy tourist areas where pickpockets may be active. Keep a close eye on your personal belongings and carry valuables securely and close to your body.

Climate

Weather conditions can vary widely from city to city:

Seattle and Vancouver: more changeable weather with a chance of rain. Always pack suitable clothing; use sunscreen, wear a cap or poncho, and drink plenty of water to stay hydrated.

Los Angeles: often high temperatures, exceeding 30°C

Teamspirit

Being a supporter is something you do together. Look out for one another on the way and in and around the stadium, and make sure everyone can enjoy the experience safely and comfortably.

Agree on a clear meeting point outside the stadium with your group in advance. That way you can easily find each other again, even when it's crowded or your phone signal is poor.

ASSISTANCE AND SUPPORT

Consular assistance

In the event of a critical situation (loss of identity documents, a serious accident or an arrest), you should contact the Belgian consular services. For Seattle and Los Angeles, this falls under the responsibility of the Consulate General in Los Angeles (...). These phone numbers may only be used in the event of a specific emergency, between June 25 at 11:00 and June 28 at 09:00 (local time).

What the embassy/consulate can do:

- Issue a temporary travel document
- Provide contact details for a local lawyer or doctor
- Quickly inform family and/or friends in an emergency
- Liaise with local authorities to locate missing persons
- If you are arrested, it is essential to ask to use consular assistance

Opening hours and appointments:

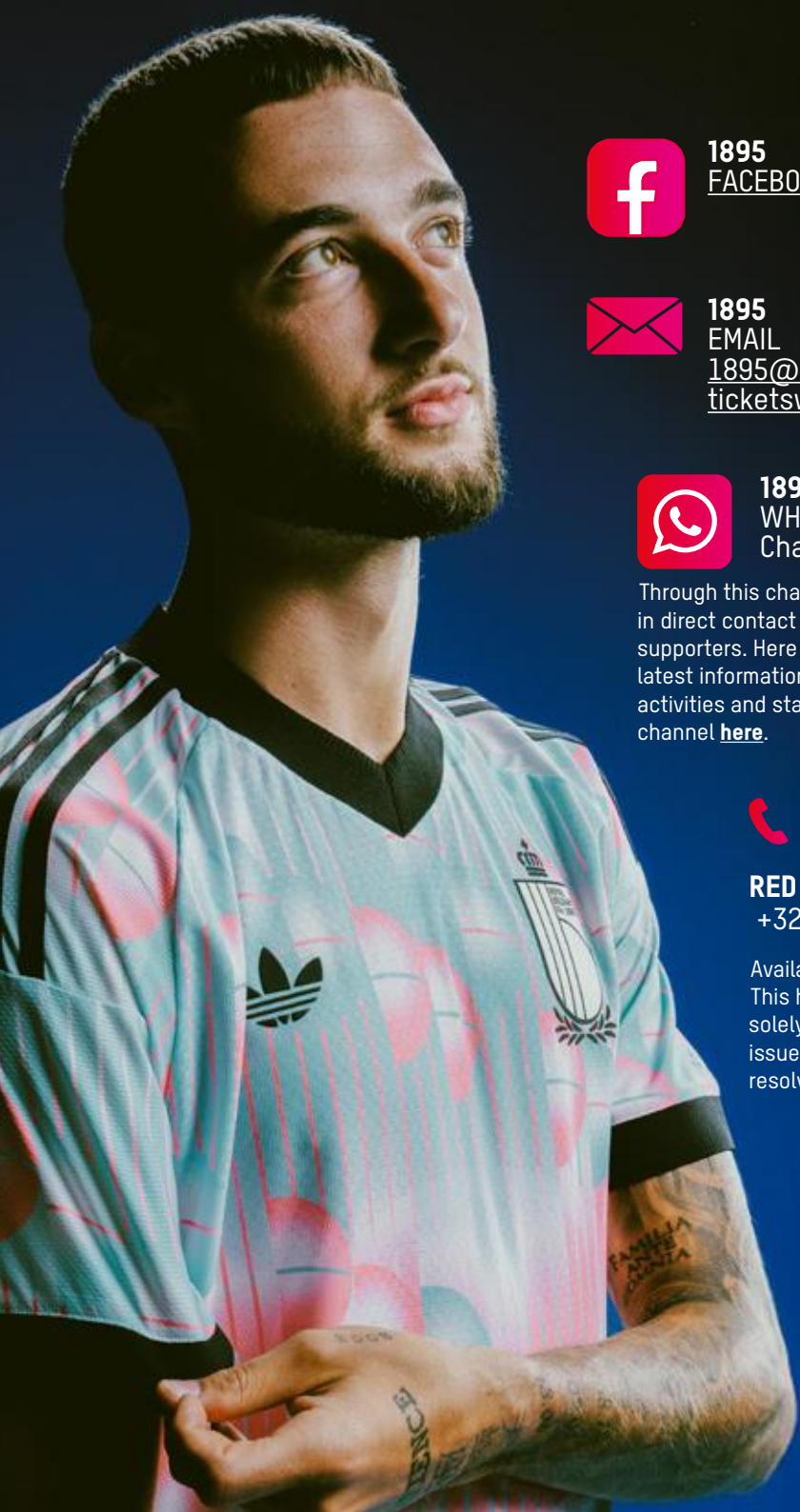
The consulates are open Monday to Friday, from 08:00 to 13:00, and operate by appointment only.

Emergencies outside opening hours

If a life-threatening emergency arises at night or over the weekend, call the main number of the relevant consulate and listen to the recorded message in full; it provides the on-call number for extreme cases.

Precautions

It is strongly recommended that you register your stay on the Travellers Online platform so that the authorities can locate you in the event of a major crisis. You are also advised to keep a digital copy of your passport and your visa (ESTA or eTA) in a secure place (for example, a secure mailbox) to make any replacement procedures easier.

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TIPS & TRICKS

Local life



TIPPING CULTURE

Tipping is the norm, because service staff often earn a low base wage; in restaurants and bars you usually add 15–20% on top of the bill. Tips are also expected for taxis, hairdressers and deliveries, whereas in Belgium this is fairly exceptional and voluntary. Watch out: sometimes a tip is already added to the bill automatically as a 'gratuity.' In that case, you're not obliged to leave anything extra on top.

Alcohol



- In the US, the legal drinking age is 21. In Canada, it's 19.
- Drinking alcohol in public is prohibited in both the US and Canada.
- A photo ID is required as proof, and your passport will also be requested at the stadiums.

Police

Police in the US have a low tolerance for 'jokes,' so don't play the comedian during checks at airports or on the street...

Visa-free travel (for Belgians): what do you need to arrange?

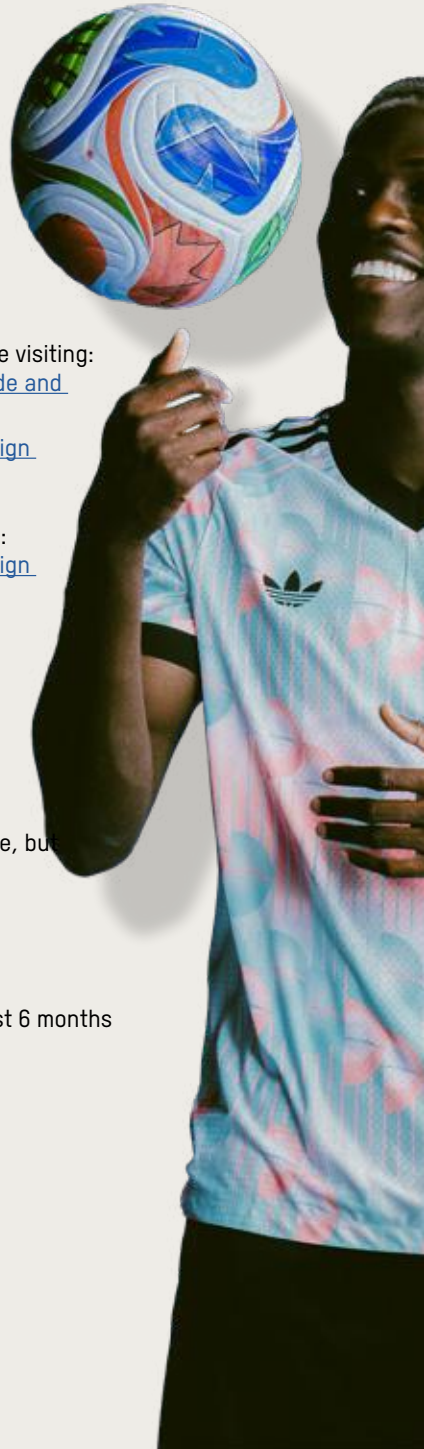
For the 2026 World Cup you can travel visa-free, but a few mandatory documents remain essential:

UNITED STATES

- International passport required
- ESTA required before departure
- Recommended: passport valid for at least 6 months after your return
- Apply only via the [official website](#)

CANADA

- International passport required"
- eTA required before departure"
- Recommended: passport valid for at **least 6 months** after your return
- Apply only via the [official website](#):
- Apply for all documents **well in advance**

Border control

Entry to the United States and Canada is always assessed **individually** and remains a decision of the border authorities. Even with an approved **ESTA** or **eTA**, entry can still be refused.

Be ready to answer questions about:

- The purpose of your trip (World Cup / tourism)
- The length of your stay + **return flight (required)**
- Your accommodation address(es)

Make sure you have the following documents **on hand (digital or printed)**:

- ESTA / eTA
- Return ticket (required)
- Hotel or accommodation bookings

Insurance & emergencies: travel and assistance insurance

Medical costs in the United States and Canada are **extremely high**. Comprehensive insurance is therefore **strongly recommended.**"

We recommend arranging at least the following coverage:

- Medical expenses (with high coverage)
- Hospitalization and repatriation
- Cancellation and trip interruption
- Personal liability

SEATTLE TOURISM

Space Needle

Seattle's signature landmark. The tower dates back to 1962, when the city hosted the World's Fair, and it has been a fixture of the skyline ever since. From the observation deck at 184 meters, you get a 360° view over the city, Puget Sound and — if the weather plays along — Mount Rainier in the distance. The glass floor panels aren't for anyone afraid of heights, but they're well worth it.





Pike Place Market

One of the oldest covered markets in the US, and still very much alive. Here the fishmongers toss salmon through the air, the florists pile their stalls high, and in the narrow aisles you'll find everything from fresh coffee to local cheese. Come early in the morning, before the tourists and while the market is still running for real shoppers. And no, you don't have to step into the very first Starbucks — the line is long and the coffee is exactly the same.

Chihuly Garden and Glass



Right next to the Space Needle and easy to combine with it. The museum showcases the glasswork of Dale Chihuly, a Washington artist who made it his life's work. The installations are large, colorful and a little overwhelming – even if you're not usually into art. The outdoor garden is especially beautiful on a sunny day.

Pioneer Square

Seattle's oldest neighborhood, and easily its most surprising. Beneath the streets runs a network of late-19th-century tunnels, remnants of a time when the city was literally raised a full story after a major fire. An underground tour is one of the most fun things to do here. Above ground, you'll find brick buildings, galleries and a few good bars. Within walking distance of the stadium.



SEATTLE TOURISM

Seattle Waterfront

The waterfront along Elliott Bay has been thoroughly redeveloped in recent years, and it shows. You can stroll from pier to pier, with views over Puget Sound and the islands in the distance. Boat trips depart from Piers 55 and 57, and if you're lucky you can spot orcas even from a distance. Whether for a simple walk or lunch on a terrace, this is the best spot in the city.



Capitol Hill



For anyone wanting something a little less touristy. Capitol Hill is the neighborhood where Seattle is most itself: coffee shops open before 7 a.m., record stores, good restaurants and a lively nightlife scene. Broadway is the main thoroughfare. No absolute must-sees, but if you want to get a feel for how the city really works, this is the place. Streetcar from downtown, or a fifteen-minute walk.
