### Dear Editor

I was interested to read Tony Phelps' article in the Star last week regarding dissatisfaction with unsealed roads in the Surfcoast Shire.

I've been living on a gravel road for over 20 years and have noticed a definite decline in the condition of our local roads during that time.

Periodically the roads are graded, which means a grader moves the dirt around until it's flat and the potholes are filled in.

The problem is that, over time, the road has ended up in places lower than the surrounding roadside.

When we had heavy rains a few years back, of course the lowest point was the road and we effectively had a creek running along the road as it washed away the gravel for several metres. It has also happened that the grader fills in the potholes, but they are back within a few weeks, or even days, after rain.

Even where the roadway is higher than the drain, years of grader work has created a damming effect which prevents water from running off the road to the drain. The Shire's solution has been to cut a breach in this wall at intervals to let the water out. Passing vehicles are then

subject to suspension-busting, shire-created "potholes".

I would suggest a more permanent solution. That the Shire budgets for a progression of actually repairing the roads. When the road is built up higher than the surrounding area, water runs off and the condition of the road is maintained. Surely, this would be the most economical remedy in the long run.

### **Enrol now for Local Government Elections in October**



Electoral Commissioner, Sven Bluemmel, has issued a call to state- and council-enrolled voters to be ready to cast their vote in the upcoming local council election for Surf Coast and Colac Otway Shire Councils.

The Surf Coast Shire Council election will be conducted by post – a safe and completely secret method of voting.

Electoral Commissioner Sven Bluemmel issued a call to Surf Coast Shire residents and ratepayers to have their say.

'Make sure you're enrolled correctly by the close of roll, which is 4 pm on Wednesday 7 August. As this is a postal election, it's

important to check your address details are correct – this includes any alternative postal address,' Mr Bluemmel said.

'If you're an Australian citizen and recently turned 18, or moved and haven't updated your address, or if you've just closed your post office box with Australia Post, you can enrol or update your details online at vec.vic.gov.au/enrolment'

People living outside Surf Coast Shire who pay rates for a property they own in

Surf Coast Shire, non-Australian citizens who occupy and pay rates on a property in Surf Coast Shire, or a representative of a company or business operating in Surf Coast Shire can apply to the council to enrol by calling 5261 0600.

Mr Bluemmel also reminded voters that the rules for council enrolments have recently changed.

'Voting in local council elections is now compulsory for all state- and councilenrolled voters. In previous elections it was not compulsory for councilenrolled voters to vote – now everyone must vote if they are on the voters' roll.'

Voters who will be away during the election period can have their ballot pack redirected to an address of their choice by completing a redirection form online at vec.vic.gov.au by Monday 9 September.

More information is available by calling 131 832 or at vec.vic.gov.au, where state-enrolled voters can also sign up to the free VoterAlert service to receive important election reminders by SMS and email.

  will discuss the role of Council in the community including functions and priorities,
  and challenges facing Council during the next four years and beyond.
- Council officers will provide an overview of a councillor's conduct, integrity, and
  governance obligations, and information on recent legislative changes. Candidates
  will also be given information about the support that is available to councillors, an
  outline of the councillor induction process and time commitments.

4 pm Wed 7 Aug – Close of roll Voters must be on the voters' roll by this date to vote at the election.

9 am Mon 9 Sept – Nominations open Candidates can nominate with the election manager from this date.

12 noon Tues 17 Sept – Nominations close. Candidates must nominate by 12 noon.

12 noon Tues 17 Sept – Deadline to submit candidate statement, questionnaire and photo. Closes at 12 noon.

10 am Wed 18 Sept - Ballot draw

Commencing Mon 7 Oct – Mail out ballot packs. Ballot packs randomly distributed to every person on the voters' roll.

6 pm Fri 25 Oct – Close of voting Ballot papers must be in the mail or handed to the election office by 6 pm.

Sat 26 Oct – Election day
The day prescribed as election day.

12 noon Fri 1 Nov—Final day for receipt of mailed postal votes. Postal votes must be received by 12 noon to be considered. The election manager will include ballot material if satisfied it was posted before 6 pm on Fri 25 October (close of voting).

Friday 15 Nov – Latest date all results will be declared. The VEC publishes the election results on the VEC website by this date.

Got to photocopy important documents or completed forms? Scan copies direct to your own email address. Got a newsletter you'd like to print and send to your members/customers? Make as many editions as you need - and even pre-fold them to hand out.

Winchelsea Community House has upgraded its photocopier/ printer with the help of the Winchelsea Star, offering a significantly improved facility to the community.

We are now able to provide full colour, double-sided, folded and even stapled documents from a copy or a printed file.

Pricing is set by whether you want black & white or colour, the paper size (A5, A4 or A3 available), and whether you print on one side or both sides.

Winch House is not providing a full commercial printing service - it's essentially a self-serve facility. We have a fabulous resource but do not have experts on hand to create and format documents.

You'll need to put together your source documents yourself and either email or bring them to Reception as PDF. If you only need copying, have them printed ready to be photocopied.



Make an appointment at Winch House so we can help choose the right printer options and get the process started. You'll need to be in attendance for the duration of your printing, and you'll need to be there to collect all the outputs if it's a large job.

This is a great asset available to the community, and we'd like to thank the Winchelsea Star for its support in getting this upgrade facility.

# Australia's own renewable fuels industry forging ahead

### **Australian Government**

The Australian Government has welcomed the announcement of a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between Ampol, GrainCorp and IFM to explore establishing Australia's own integrated renewable fuels industry.

A feasibility assessment of a renewable fuels facility in Brisbane, including a supply of local homegrown feedstocks, will be an initial priority under the MOU.

An Australian renewable fuels industry, which would include both sustainable aviation fuel and renewable diesel, will significantly reduce our emissions and ultimately provide cheaper, cleaner and more secure fuel to the transport sector.

This industry announcement follows the Government's Budget commitments last May for a number of measures to support a domestic renewable fuels industry.

This includes investing \$1.7 billion over the next decade in the Future Made in Australia Innovation Fund, to support net zero innovations including low-carbon liquid fuels.

The Government also committed \$18.5 million to develop a certification scheme for these fuels and \$1.5 million for an impact analysis in relation to demand-side measures.

These views will ensure Australia has the best policy settings to encourage the growth and use of both sustainable aviation fuel and renewable diesel, forging new jobs in a new industry while making our transport sector more sustainable.

# The climate is changing so fast that we haven't seen how bad extreme weather could get

Extreme weather is by definition rare on our planet. Ferocious storms, searing heatwaves and biting cold snaps illustrate what the climate is capable of at its worst. However, since Earth's climate is rapidly warming, predominantly due to fossil fuel burning, the range of possible weather conditions, including extremes, is changing.

Extreme weather events require what meteorologists might call a "perfect storm". For example, extreme heat in the UK typically requires the northward movement of an air mass from Africa combined with clear skies, dry soils and a stable atmosphere to prevent thunderstorms forming which tend to dissipate heat.

Such "perfect" conditions are intrinsically unlikely, and many years can pass without them occurring – all while the climate continues to change in the background. Based on an understanding of observations alone, this can leave us woefully underprepared for what the climate can now do, should the right weather conditions all come together at once.

Even now, decades after we first began trying to avert the worst of global warming, more than 80% of the world's total energy comes from fossil fuels.

The goal here is to make renewable energy and electrified transport steadily more affordable and competitive – just as fossil fuel subsidies did for oil, gas and coal.

### Fossil fuel subsidies in Australia

The Australia Institute

Australia's subsidies to fossil fuel producers and major users from all governments totaled

\$14.5 billion in 2023–24, increase of 31% on the \$11.1 billion recorded in 2022–23.

\$14.5 billion equates to \$27,581 for every minute of every day, or \$540 for every person in Australia.

But it makes absolutely no economic sense to provide subsidies to things that a government is, or should be, trying to discourage – ie: fossil fuels.

# Estimated subsidies for renewable energy through federal government schemes (2014-2023)

The Centre for Independent Studies

### Winchelsea Pool to make a splash

Winchelsea's new pool is on schedule to make a splash next summer, with redevelopment of the much-loved community asset well underway.

New 25-metre and leisure pools have taken shape on the Barwon Terrace site and construction is continuing. A summer opening date is still to be determined.

The redevelopment includes addition of a zero-depth splash park which will provide plenty of fun for youngsters, and building of a pavilion and entry point at the south-east end of the site providing better connection with adjoining recreation spaces and facilities.

The former pool was decommissioned in March having reached the end of its serviceable life after 60 years, and responses from almost 300 people have shaped redevelopment designs.

Contractors salvaged almost 96 per cent of materials from demolition of the previous pools, surroundings and buildings – totalling more than 817 tonnes – for recycled use offsite.

### Improve your eco footprint

Surf Coast Energy Group (SCEG) has launched an updated online Surf Coast Eco Footprint Planner - an important tool to help you tackle climate action. The update to the planner was made possible through a Council Community Initiative grant.

First released in late 2022, the planner highlights the sources of greenhouse gas emissions in daily life including the amount of energy you use, how you travel and what you eat. You're then provided with your total amount of emissions you emit each year and pathways for actions to reduce them.

The updated planner includes biodiversity, carbon capture, water use and circular economy actions, as well as recognising the impact of volunteering or financially contributing to local sustainability initiatives.

Residents looking to retrofit their home to improve their eco footprint can use the planner to identify areas for improvement. The planner also provides links and information on local providers who can help.

SCEG President Graeme Stockton said while we have significant global problems, the best way for us to address them is through local action. One of SCEG's icon initiatives is to build a biolink – which features landscape connections – from Torquay and the Spring Creek valley to the eastern Otways. "The Eco Footprint Planner encourages Surf Coast residents to think about these types of projects to improve local biodiversity, to capture more carbon, to provide more recreation opportunities and to help landowners with new economic opportunities," Graeme said.

The Eco Footprint Planner only takes 10 minutes to complete with suggestions at the end to show how you can reduce your eco footprint. Try the planner at sceg.org.au.

# Council boosts commitment to stronger environmentally sustainable ESD

Surf Coast Shire Council has adopted an updated policy to drive environmentally sustainable design (ESD) in its assets and infrastructure, aimed at reducing greenhouse gas emissions, building in climate adaptation considerations, and improving social sustainability.

The Sustainable Design Policy supports the delivery of the Climate Emergency Response Plan 2021-2031. It ensures that the Council's buildings and infrastructure meet ESD standards.

The revised policy broadens the scope of the initial policy to include civil works and open space projects and has an increased focus on climate resilience. The policy also aligns with targets and actions in the newly adopted Circular Economy Action Plan.

The policy sets minimum ESD standards for buildings owned, leased, or managed by Council as well as civil works programs and open space projects.

Objectives for the revised Sustainable Design Policy:

- Demonstrate environmental leadership and climate action
- Ensure new Council facilities, upgrades, and renewals generate positive environmental outcomes
- Ensure all new major Council facilities are carbon neutral over their lifecycle
- Promote the efficient use of resources and transition away from fossil fuels
- Reduce ongoing management costs and improve facility user comfort, health, and productivity
- Promote renewable energy generation and best practice stormwater quality outcomes
- Ensure waste avoidance, reuse, and recycling during construction and operations
- Promote innovation in the delivery of Council facilities, civil works, and open space projects.

Cr Mike Bodsworth said, "Council is proud to adopt this revised Sustainable Design Policy as we are keen to increase our environmental leadership."

"This updated policy shows our commitment to environmental sustainability and climate resilience and ensures all Council buildings and infrastructure projects meet higher environmental standards, contributing to a more sustainable and climate resilient future."

This revised policy looks at changing how expenditure and effort have been worked in the past and recognises the significant greenhouse gas emissions related to the construction and operation of buildings.

"This updated policy is designed to ensure Council facilities and infrastructure are designed to meet the challenges of the future, while promoting a healthier, more sustainable environment for our community," said Cr Bodsworth.

My Father, Alan James Hartley was presented with this plaque from the Australian Olympic Games Committee for his contribution to the organising, sponsorship and packing of every member's clothing for the Australian Olympic Games teams from 1940-1980.





The Melbourne Sports Depot was the ONLY sporting goods store in Melbourne up to 1980 where Dad was one of the Directors of the business.

It was through his long time friend Julius (Judy) Patching that Alan was asked by the Olympic Committee that the MSD provided sponsorship, together with all the clothing required -shirts, blouses caps, ties, jackets, jumpers together with towels, shorts, bathers, socks and other items required for all the Australian Olympic Games teams and individuals (except the Equestrian team) for some 40 years



### **OPINION: The development of Winchelsea**

Could the Winchelsea Star please publish this note I wrote to Hannah McLay, Project Support Officer, at Surfcoast Shire?

Thank you for the demonstration last week at Winchelsea. The focus for growth development is wonderful.

### 1. Opportunities to add power to Winchelsea's position.

- a. Private Water from pipes (Barwon Water may be One party per Pipe or a party line with any number of people).
  - a. Some 8,000 to 10,000 k' S of pipes exist (So I have been told). Should the Otway's grow many more K's are possible
  - Barwon Water is not able (or permitted) to release the names of Participants on each pipe line. I understand this, while it is not helpful.
  - c. There have been two breaches of pipe lines by Powercor or their subcontractors in past three years (Breaking the pipe 0n the Inverleigh Winchelsea road) the owners have had to pay for finding and repairing. There was also a break south of Winchelsea which impacted multiple private pipelines including, Inverleigh Winchelsea rd. -
    - The subcontractors have maps to the "Feed Pipe" but no further.
    - ii. There is a new, private electric wire being placed on that road (Inverleigh / Winchelsea rd) in the next few weeks (August 2024). This is a feed from batteries into the grid.
    - iii. Many more "private electric" power lines maybe be introduced over the next 10 years.
- b. Block sizes may need to be more varied to permit increased residents to move to the area.
  - a. When looking at similar towns to ours we can increase block sizes,

- b. We can increase entertainment areas to ensure public participation.
- c. Shopping capability is an opportunity for all.
  - a. As it now stands all those working outside Winchelsea are able / wishing to purchase outside Winchelsea.
    - i. This means the IGA is less likely to have the variety available.
    - ii. The variety of shops in Winchelsea is diminished given the lack of perceived demand.
  - b. The lack of employment in Winchelsea must be addressed.
- d. Rail Systems need to be addressed
  - a. Colac provides some 3.5 to 4 billion dollars of exports for within and outside Australia.
  - b. If we increase employment the number of exports will grow.
  - c. If the train track was expanded (to at least Colac) to a twin track (for freight) the roads would be improved.
  - d. Empty trucks have a huge impact on the roads and ageing of trucks. (I have been studying the roads) empty trucks are numerous in both directions with similar designed trucks in both directions.

### 2. Power to improve the situation.

- a. Think about setting up a Water, Road, Powercor, and Employment group to make the Otway's a valuable are for Growth.
- b. Think about each "private water Owner" to be able to produce a map of their pipes"
- c. Add this area to the growth of Geelong and there will be a great win.
