


Paradise Island

DAY 1

Nassau – Paradise island - 18km







WELCOME TO PARADISE

Fly into Nassau airport where your driver will be waiting to take you to your charter yacht on Paradise Island. After settling in on board head to Atlantis where the kids can expend some energy after the flight in Aquaventure, the largest waterpark in the Caribbean.

Return to your yacht for your welcome cocktail party and decide which restaurant you wish to try out for dinner. Alternatively, the yacht can head for a quiet nearby cove where the crew will serve you a relaxing gourmet dinner under the stars.





Atlantis, Paradise island – Shroud cay - 42NM

MANGROVES AND MARINE LIFE

Set off early for your morning cruise to your first port of call at Shroud Cay. Relax into your surroundings over a long lazy breakfast. Practise some yoga out on deck with the wonderful backdrop of clear turquoise water and let that city stress flow out. Arrive at Shroud Cay and go snorkelling for a first taster of the underwater life while your crew set up your BBQ lunch on the beach.

After lunch, spend a peaceful afternoon exploring the creeks and waterways through the mangroves by kayak - or to simply enjoy the beach.

Stay at Norman's Cay for a relaxed dinner. Put on your favourite playlist as background music to complete the scene.











Shroud cay – Compass cay - 23nm

SWIMMING WITH SHARKS

Your morning cruise will bring you to Compass Cay Marina, a naturally protected harbour and the focal point of this Cay. Explore the trail system all around the island to discover the thirteen different beaches on offer. One of Compass Bay's main claims to fame are the friendly Nurse Sharks who have chosen to inhabit this spot.

At cocktail hour, take a short tender ride for a wonderful dining experience.











Compass quay – Staniel cay - 23nm

TAKE THE PLUNGE WITH THE SWIMMING PIGS

Have a refreshing morning swim before you move on to the next stop – Big Major Cay. Here, at the famous Pig Beach, you will be greeted by the wild pigs who inhabit this otherwise deserted island. No-one really knows how these pigs got here – whether they swam ashore from a shipwreck or whether someone put them there deliberately – but they are very friendly.

The yacht will moor at Staniel Cay Yacht Club where you can choose your afternoon's activities; fisherman may like to try their hand at bonefishing or you could simply admire the fish from afar in your mask and snorkel.

Gather together in the Yacht Club bar for martini cocktails.









Staniel cay – Great guana cay and Little farmers cay - 15nm





WATERSPORTS INDULGENCE

Continuing in a southerly direction, the yacht will make a very short cruise to a stop at Bitter Guana Cay where you can meet the Bahamian Rock Iguanas. They are listed as a highly endangered species and are protected under the Wild Animals Protection Act.

The afternoon take the kayaks to explore the shoreline; take the jetskis for a spin or test your waterskiing skills. Take the children paddleboarding or simply laze in the shallows at the edge of the beach.

At the end of the afternoon have a snooze while the crew stow all the watersports gear before the yacht cruises to Little Farmers Cay Marina. Head ashore to enjoy cocktails whilst watching the sun go down.





DAY 6

Little farmers cay – Wardrick wells & The exumas land & Sea park visitors centre - 30nm

WHALE TRAIL

An early start will see the yacht heading north for a morning cruise to the Exumas Land and Sea Park at Wardrick Wells. See the skeleton of a 53ft whale on one of the many beaches.


Have a late picnic lunch on the beach. After lunch, explore at will; choose to snorkel or dive in the pristine waters and admire the healthy marine life.

DISEMBARK

An early morning cruise will bring you back full circle to the Marina at Atlantis, Paradise Island. Do some last minute souvenir shopping here or take a look around Nassau – maybe do your shopping in Bay Street before heading to the airport for your flight home.
