Abdoul: from fleeing to graduation, the story of a political refugee.

Abdoul is a political refugee who left Ivory Coast in search of a better life. After crossing the desert and Libya, he found himself on a 13-meter-wide and 2-meter-long rubber dinghy with 200 other people, which was about to sink in the Mediterranean Sea in the summer of 2014. After receiving the "Young America Award for University Talent," Abdoul was among the 500 most deserving students in Italian universities in the academic year 2021-2022. He graduated on March 25, 2022, with honors and was about to start a free one-year master's degree in international relations. Abdoul is grateful to the Combonian Association for Migrants and Refugees Services (ACSE), which instilled in him the courage to pursue his dreams until today, thanks to the schoolarship granted to him.
