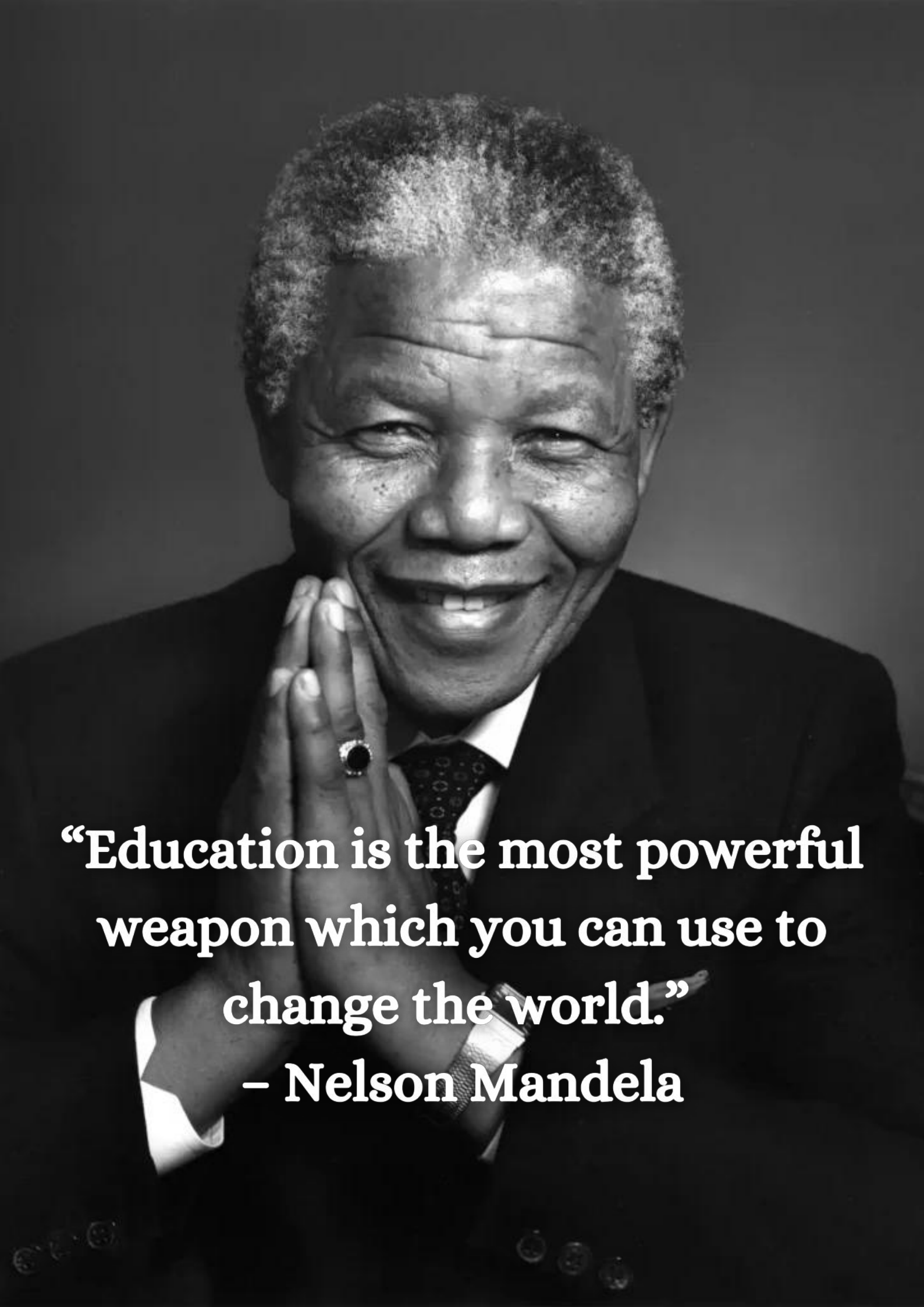

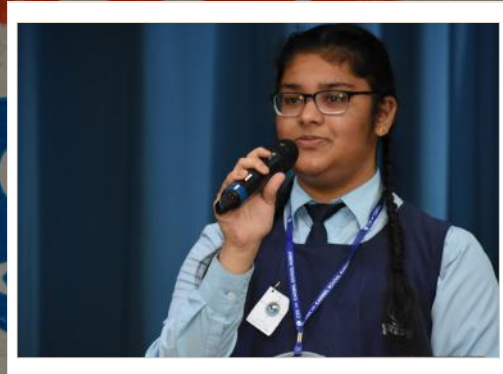

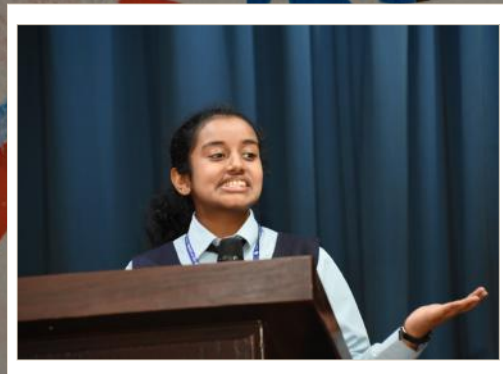

International Labour Day

In our 365-day calendar, there is a special day dedicated to all the hard-working people and their achievements. It falls on the 1st of May every year. The United Nations declared this day as Labour Day to commemorate the historical riot of Haymarket which happened in the U.S.

Back in years, labourers were mistreated and abused by their lords. Wages were not paid fairly or were not paid at all. There were no holidays and no proper duty schedules were formulated. Due to this, such an incident arose where the lords refused to allow the labourers to have an 8-hour schedule. The labourers revolted against them, marching up and down the streets, all the while demanding their rights. However, the scene got bloody and the labourers were flogged cruelly. But this didn't do any good; it just made the situation go from bad to worse. This incident happened in 1886, and the riot started on the 6th of May in Chicago, Illinois. It was later called the Haymarket affair. A few years later, the UN realized the importance of labourers and their rights and established the International Labour Organisation.

Hopefully, the current situation for labourers is far better than it was back then. Now, almost all the countries of the world celebrate Labour Day, apart from a few of them in the Middle East and Africa. Most countries have adopted the rules and regulations that the UN formulated for labourers across the globe. In some countries like the Philippines, people still parade up and down the streets, just as the people of Chicago had done 100 years ago.

In a nutshell, Labour Day is not only a celebration, it's also a day when people are being educated about labour rights and respect them. Ever since May 1st was declared as International Labour Day, it stands out in human history with dignity for human labourers.
