


Princess Elizabeth's unlikely assassin finds himself on the hook for two murders in this light-hearted Tudor mystery.


A Chicago PD analyst finds herself drawn into the dangerous underground world in the search for her missing brother in this clever thriller.




In a world full of darkness, can love prevail? An emotionally gripping and heartbreaking WWI novel.
